| | "Council condemns the scrapping of the pest control service in 2004. Council regrets the subsequent increase in rat and other pest populations, and the impact of the loss of the service on residents unable to afford huge bills from private contractors. Council believes that the pest control service is vital to ensure that all residents, and particularly those on low incomes" Councillor McGuirk has requested under the Council's Constitution, Part 4, Section 1, 31.5 that if the item is not dealt with by the end of the meeting it be voted upon at the council meeting. | | |

| | "Council welcomes the number of police officers in Barnet rising to 544. Council supports Barnet Police, and notes that the borough remains one of the safest in which to live and work in London. In contrast, Council recalls that the administration axed Barnet's Neighbourhood Warden service and has inflicted massive cuts to the Street Enforcement Service. | | |

| | Council condemns the £300,000 of cuts to the youth service, which reduce the budget by one-third, especially when Barnet's investment in young people is already among the lowest in London. Council believes that diverting young people away from becoming involved in crime and antisocial behaviour, and from becoming the victims of crime, should be a key priority for the Council. Council regrets that any boom-and-bust Tory government would freeze investment in public services, and thereby cut police numbers in Barnet and jeopardise the remaining youth service budget." | | |
