|      | Investigatory Powers<br>Council is concerned by the extension in<br>2003 of Regulations Investigation Powers<br>Act 2003 (RIPA), which gives 792<br>organisations including access to<br>information on communications data, as<br>opposed to 8 previously.<br>While Council believes that Public Bodies<br>should have the ability to investigate those<br>suspected of fraud or malpractice, Council is<br>most concerned that surveillance is being<br>used in some other areas to investigate and<br>pursue trivial matters, such as infringements<br>of by-laws.<br>In contrast, Council applauds LBB for its<br>approach in using these and other powers<br>Sparingly, and restricting its use of |                 |                             |

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|      | Additionally, Council therefore welcomes the<br>letter by former LGA Chairman, Sir Simon<br>Milton, condemning the practice of invoking<br>RIPA for minor matters and advising<br>Councils not to use such powers in these<br>cases. |                 |           |
