| | A Fair Trade Borough Council welcomes London's achievement of Fairtrade City status, congratulates the 20 London boroughs that have achieved Fairtrade Borough status and recognises the work of many individuals and organisations in achieving this. Council notes that Barnet is one of the 13 boroughs in London that have not yet achieved Fair Trade status. Council urges Cabinet to support the Fairtrade campaign and work with residents, visitors, businesses, and the public and voluntary sectors to increase availability and take up of Fairtrade marked products in order to achieve Fairtrade status. | | |

| | Council notes with alarm that more people were killed on Barnet roads last year than anywhere in London and that the total number of people killed, seriously injured or harmed was the second-highest in London. | | |
| | Council also notes with regret the fourth serious accident in Partingdale Lane since the lane was opened to through-vehicular traffic. | | |
| | Council requests that in the light of these statistics, and in the face of the evidence that the so-called traffic calming measures installed in Partingdale Lane are not working, that the Cabinet Member CONSIDERS ordering the following action: | | |
| | A reversal of the decision to re-open Partingdale Lane to through-vehicular traffic; An indefinite moratorium on all future road re-openings in the Borough with a view to establishing a policy that no roads currently closed should be reopened; A reversal of the Administration's decision to not re-install road humps in those roads where a majority of the respondents to the council's consultation wished them to be reinstated. | | |

| | Council notes the guidance issued by CIPFA - Local Authority Accounting Panel 78 - relating to the loss of financial investments (impairment) by local authorities. Council also notes the relevance of this guidance to Barnet in light of the insolvency of those Icelandic banks where the Council had investments of £27.4m | | |

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| | Council requests the cabinet to commission a report from the Acting Director of Resources outlining, at the earliest available opportunity, how this authority will by complying with CIPFA's guidance." | | |

| | Terrorist Outrage in Mumbai | | |
| | Council is appalled at the terrorist attacks in Mumbai, where at least 200 people were killed and 300 injured, including men, women and children. | | |
| | Council notes that this series of brutal attacks included assaults on a railway station, two hotels, a restaurant, a cinema, a Police Station and a Jewish community centre. Council believes there can be no justification whatsoever for this outrage, which Council regards as an attack not only on India's people, but also on its free and democratic way of life. | | |
| | Therefore, Council calls on the international organisations to ensure those responsible are brought swiftly to justice for their murderous actions. | | |
| | Council further asks the Chief Executive to write to the Indian High Commissioner in London expressing this Council's condolences for those killed and injured in the atrocities in Mumbai. | | |

| | Council welcomes the success of the care leavers' apprenticeship scheme where seven young people were offered apprenticeships across different council departments along with support to undertake vocational training to achieve NOV A levels 2 and 3 | | |

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| | In addition, Council also welcomes the support from a range of service areas to the scheme and notes that apprentices were able to take up places in Parks and open spaces; customer services; children's centres; strategic development; communications and pest control. Council believes that this shows a real commitment to corporate parenting. Council congratulates the apprentices who have successfully completed their apprenticeships and wishes them well in their search for permanent positions. | | |
| | Further, Council requests Cabinet to continue to support and develop this policy so that new apprenticeship places can be created for 2009. | | |

| | Council also notes that Ken Livingstone's approach saw 1 and 2 flats built in the Barnet, when the demand in the Borough is for 3 and 4 bedroom houses. | | |
| | In contract, Council believes that Boris Johnson's policy will support and extend home ownership, provide incentives for new development, and lead to the creating of sustainable, attractive communities, particularly important in these difficult times in the housing market. | | |
