Council notes the parking charge increases that were introduced in April 2011 that were necessary to bring the Special Parking Account in line with the budgeted surplus.

Council notes there are no proposals to increase on street parking charges in the current consultation.

Council further notes the introduction of Cashless parking to which 163,000 people have now signed up and that over 35,000 transactions are being undertaken each week. Additionally Council welcomes the introduction of Pay points and Scratch cards .Council recognises the fact that On street parking revenue is significantly above budget and that this will enable the Special Parking Account to meet its budgeted surplus by April 2012 and that therefore much needed maintenance work on roads and pavements as well as School safety measures and requests to review some controlled parking zones can proceed.
