The council are aware of this concern in many parts of the borough where it has been asserted that the charges and times of operation of the pay and display should be reviewed to assist traders especially in the current economic climate. The council does take this concern seriously and it is anticipated that investigation will be undertaken as part of a boroughwide strategy to ensure that the charges and times that are applied to pay and display facilities are both conducive to trading opportunities and still help to manage parking on the highway effectively At this time there are no plans to make changes in the Mowbray Parade area but the concerns raised here will form an intregal part of the review boroughwide.
