- 2.4 The London Borough of Barnet will achieve this by ensuring Children and Adults Safeguarding remains high priority and underpins the work in Social Care and Health.
- 2.5 Three Performance Targets have been set to meet this strategic aim:
  - 100% of Adult Protection Plans to be developed for those who need them with people identified responsible for delivery. Estimated baseline of 81.5% (up to February 2011)
  - 100% of Adult Protection Plans reviewed by Team Manager within the timescales set at the case conference. Estimated baseline of 54.9% (Up to February 2011)
  - To increase % of Children's social care assessments carried out within 35 working days from 69% (Jan 2011) to 80%.
