	• To refer the decisions back to the Cabinet for reconsideration and to halt the procurement, and, to ask that Cabinet instructs the acting Chief Executive to investigate fully, as a matter of urgency, all reasonable methods of delivering the Council services covered by the proposals for the NSCSO, which addresses the need to make efficiency savings and to generate income which may include in-house options.
	• To make a reference to full Council in January that, if, after re-consideration by Cabinet the NSCSO contract proceeds, that a full standing scrutiny panel should be established by Council with immediate effect to monitor and scrutinise the transition to, establishment of and regular performance monitoring of the NSCSO contract.
