As part of the implementation of the Libraries Strategy work will be taking place at Chipping Barnet Library which will prevent it being used as a meeting venue. The work is expected to start in October.

5.	East Barnet Library Submitted by John Dix Ward: East Barnet "Today (26 October) there was a briefing regarding the future of East Barnet library. However as this took place during the day, many people who work will not have been able to attend. Please can you provide an update as to what is happening to East Barnet Library, especially in light of the planning application for the new swimming pool which indicates a library will be located at the new pool site."	From April 2017 East Barnet Library will become a Partnership library with services delivered by a community organisation. The selection process for the successful community organisation is currently on-going. Today (26 October) there was a public engagement session to introduce the proposed changes to the current East Barnet Library site. An exhibition will remain in the library for several weeks following this event, supplemented by a series of drop-in sessions (see table below). I have had this pass at least 10 years. I recently filled out a consultation document regarding this pass. Is the Council going to revoke it again or are people who already have	In 2010 when responsibility for the administration of Freedom Pass renewals passed to the Council 4,768 Disabled Person's Freedom Passes were issued to Barnet residents by the Authority, which were due to be renewed in 2015. When these 2010 passes came up for renewal, in order to guard against passes expiring without a renewals process being in place, an agreement was reached between the Authority and London Councils that passes due for renewal in 2015 would be automatically renewed and a retrospective check of eligibility would be performed. This work involved retrospectively checking eligibility for the 4,768 customers whose passes were automatically renewed.

The Council recognises that the retrospective checking process resulted in 230 Disabled Person's Freedom Passes being withdrawn from residents in Barnet without appropriate guidance being provided. This situation understandably caused distress to a number of Freedom pass holders. As an immediate measure, deactivated passes were reactivated and temporarily returned to

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		194 residents whilst a full review was instigated to examine the Barnet's Disabled Person's Freedom Pass process and eligibility criteria. Once this review is complete the 194 residents who have had their passes temporarily reinstated will have their eligibility assessed again under the new criteria to accertain if they are still eligible for their Disabled Person's Freedom Pass. We would anticipate that this reassessment will take place in early 2017.

11	Prevalence of litter throughout the area Submitted by Nathan Weinstein	All town centres within the area have a daily town keeper presence throughout the day that follows an initial morning visit. Residential roads receive a fortnightly litter pick and flytip clearance. A deep cleanse of all residential roads is undertaken to maintain cleanliness levels at approximately every 8 weeks.

	Ward: Various Instruct refuse collectors to pick up whatever they drop while emptying bins. Increase the number of litter bins throughout area especially parks and empty them regularly. Fine litterers and fly tippers.	We are currently replacing 250 litterbins across the borough. Parks are also cleansed at a frequency relative to need and seasonality. Ranging from daily through to a minimum of once per week. Play areas and very busy sites such as Oak Hill Park are cleansed daily, whilst quieter sites such as Stanhope Road are cleansed once per week in the winter, and these frequencies are increased during the summer months. The bin men are instructed to collect any litter dropped whilst emptying bins, this is also monitored by the service supervisors. The Council launched Keep Barnet Clean Campaign at the beginning of July which included active enforcement from the end of the month for littering and fly-tipping offences.
