4.	Sponsored Member's Statement	I would like to formally support the application for funding of a community festival at Bishop Douglass School. A number of these events have already taken place over the last few years, and the team behind the application have developed significant skills and expertise at running them efficiently and on budget.	
		East Finchley has a strong history of community festivals, from the previous Grange Big Local festivals referred to above, to the main community festival in cherry tree Wood. These festivals help keep an extremely diverse community closely knit and help foster a strong sense of community identity in East Finchley.	
		This festival is also well targeted at the parts of East Finchley with the lowest incomes and most deprivation, around the North Circular. The festival provides opportunities for activities for children who may not otherwise be able to afford such activities, and lack opportunities within the community. They bring together children from different backgrounds and socio-economic groups successfully, improving integration.	
		It is also a welcome boost to local musicians and mobile businesses such as a burger stall, and most welcome of an ice cream van. Also features are artists and various community groups.	
		Funding this application has additional benefits for the council, as Barnet Homes are frequent stall holders, providing an	

opportunity to engage residents and provide a public outlet to their works, in a time when Barnet Homes have not been able to provide their own similar "fun days" which operate along very similar lines. In addition, the local Safer Neighbourhood Team are extremely supportive of this scheme, as they are usually a strong presence at them, and provide a welcome opportunity for public interface, much along the lines of Barnet Homes above. Although the applicants have run several such festivals successfully, the request for funding of this festival is, as is required by the area committee grants programme, a one-off request for funding. There are no further costs or liabilities for the Council, and Council funding is not requested for a continuation of this festival in future years. Therefore I strongly support this application, and hope Councillors will be minded to approve the request. 5. 6. What is the project? Please provide a brief overview of the project and what the funding will be used for.

The funding is for a community festival, to take place in early Oct 2017 at Bishop Douglass School, East Finchley, providing free activities for people of all ages to enjoy. We may run the festival as a Fun Palace.

We have run four annual community festivals, and therefore have built up both the connections and the organisational knowledge to run them successfully and on budget. Last year our budget was £2,500, but on a full cost recovery basis (if we had been charged for all the work done by local businesses) it would have cost us £5,068. In addition, we secured £200 in sponsorship from two local estate agents.

The purpose of the festivals have been:

- 1. To allow people in the local community to connect and get together;
- 2. To showcase the work being done by local voluntary sector and statutory organisations and give them outreach opportunities last year 14 local charities and organisations took part, including Barnet Homes, Barnet Giving, East Finchley Safer Neighbourhood Team, Finchley Fire Station, Barnet Citizens Advice, Monday Club Youth Group, EFAB, Bishop Douglass and Oak Lodge Schools, Heartreach (a group for creative people with mental health problems) and Rolling Base, including raising £276 for local causes;
- 3. To showcase local businesses last year 14 took part, including Chandos Lawn Tennis Club, Airborne Circus, East Finchley Combat Academy, Singing in London, the Record Shop, Pure Gym, and North London Ukelele Club;
- To allow local children the opportunity to take part in sporting activities for free, including, last year, tennis, table tennis, Thai Kick boxing, circus skills, stationary rowing machines and football, to improve health and wellbeing;
- 5. To allow local people to take part in creative activities, including arts and crafts, and music; and
- 6. For Grange Big Local to talk to local residents about what improvements and work is needed to benefit the local area, and how we should spend the £1 million awarded to the area by the Big Lottery Fund.

This year we are considering running the festival as a Fun Palace. This is an ongoing national campaign supporting culture at the heart of every community with an annual weekend of arts and science action, created by, for and with local people. Their strapline is Everyone an Artist, Everyone a Scientist. You can see more about them here:

The addition of science activities will be new for us, hence the increased budget on last year, but we are confident that we can provide some exciting and interesting activities, given the expertise amongst our volunteers, and our links with Middlesex University.

We hope that this will inspire local people, including children, in both science and arts.

All Grange Big Local projects are developed in collaboration with local people. The feedback we have received at previous festivals, both formally through consultation, and informally, is that local people see a benefit to the festival and want it to continue.

Here is some of the feedback we received last year:

We believe that having a free festival is important given the socio-economic profile of the area. It brings people together on an equal platform.

13. Please demonstrate below how local people have been involved in developing this proposal

Grange Big Local is a resident-led community association, which has been granted £1 million of lottery funding. In order to secure this money we (and Barnet Council) had to demonstrate that this was both an area of need and that the community supported the plans and strategic priorities developed locally. This included specific support for an annual festival.

Local residents volunteer their time to organise and put on the festival; they come up with the ideas and the contacts, and they make them happen. None of them had any experience of putting on an event like this before, but they have all learned through the process.

14. How will the project or initiative be promoted to local residents?

- 1. Word of mouth.
- 2. Leafletting the local area by volunteers and (hopefully) Good Gym Barnet. Last year we leafletted every household in the area, as well as East Finchley Library, Finchley Foodbank, Green Man Centre and local shops.

- 6. Grange Big Local website, Facebook and Twitter accounts.

February – register as a Fun Palace if approved by the board (we have already been in contact with them, and they are happy with our proposal).

February – September – arrange activities and food provision, contact organisations who may want to be involved, complete risk assessment, arrange insurance, organise and diarise publicity deadlines, recruit volunteers, seek further funding.

September – confirm attendance, allocate tasks on the day, finalise budget.

October - Fun Palace. Collate feedback and organisational learning.
