1.	Item 11 – Colindeep Lane- Pedestrian Improvements (Initial Assessment)	Mr Gerrard Roots	One of the main contributors to excessive driving speeds at this end of Colindeep Lane is the short stretch of dual carriageway it contains. Going east, this may have some purpose (traffic needs to divide onto the slip-roads that join the Watford Way traveling north or south), but going west, the dual carriageway is needless. Its presence merely encourages impatient drivers to overtake (at great speed) cars travelling within the speed-limit of 30mph, and to then cut up those law-abiding drivers as soon as the road reverts to a single carriageway. These antisocial drivers continue at illegal speeds along the remainder of Colindeep Lane, including the entrance to North London Grammar School. Why cannot one of the west-bound lanes of this dual carriageway simply be blocked off?	The report recommends further investigations into traffic Calming measures on Colindeep Lane and the feasibility of removing one of the west-bounds lanes will be investigated as part of this further study.
