General points

The following procedure is based on Regulations made by the Secretary of State under the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Hearings Regulations") which may be viewed or downloaded from the website of the Department for Culture, Media and Sport by following links from <u>www.culture.gov.uk</u>

The procedure is intended as a general framework to ensure natural justice and a fair hearing. The conduct of individual hearings may vary slightly according to circumstances and the discretion of the Chairman. In all cases, however, this general framework will be followed.

The procedure allows each party a maximum period of 5 minutes in which to present their case (Regulations 16 & 24). At the end of the time allowed, the Chairman will terminate the presentation and the hearing will proceed in the form of a discussion led by the authority to explore points of dispute. The discussion will not be timed.

The procedure is subject to periodic review and amendment to reflect best practice and relevant legislative changes. An updated version of this procedure is published as soon as possible following any such amendments.

Chairman	 Introduces him/herself and Members of the Committee, and outlines their roles. Introduces Licensing, Legal and Governance Officer. Explains that Legal and Governance Officers will be present during the Committee's deliberations to advise only, and that the Licensing Officer will be excluded from deliberations.
-	 Asks parties present to introduce themselves. Outlines procedure to be followed (Regulation 22). Asks all parties to confirm their understanding of the procedure. Clarifies any aspect(s) of the procedure where any parties are uncertain or asks Legal or Governance Officer as appropriate to clarify.
Governance Officer	 Informs Committee of absent parties. Details persons whom a party is seeking permission to represent them at hearing. Panel confer regarding permission. Chairman announces decision regarding permission.

Licensing Officer presents the report to the Committee

- Is a statement of the facts including details of the application and operating schedule, relevant policy details, detail representations made, a chronology of events and highlights the points on which the Authority requires clarification.
- Applicant
 Presents opening submissions and clarifies points raised by Authority in notice of hearing. Time allowed 5 mins.
- Presents opening submissions either in person or by spokes person Time allowed 5 mins per interested party.

Note regarding use of video evidence

Video evidence must be in DVD format and will form part of the relevant party's five minutes opening submission. Any party wishing to use video evidence must submit a copy to the Authority along with sufficient, identical extra copies to serve on all the opposing parties – i.e. if the applicant is submitting it, there must be enough copies for all parties making representations and if a party making representations is submitting it there must be a copy for the applicant. The recording must be edited down to the highlights, containing only relevant matter which relates to the written representation previously submitted. In addition, a description of how, when and where the video was recorded and what it contains must be submitted. These must be supplied to the Authority at least five working days before the hearing.

Members question Licensing Officer on Policy

Discussion

Chairman leads a discussion concentrating on points of dispute:

Chairman asks Applicant what he disputes in other parties' submissions, and asks other parties to comment.

Chairman proceeds through all objectors dealing with all matters of contention.

When Chairman feels all matters have been thoroughly discussed and all parties have been given a fair and equal opportunity to comment and make representations, she/he closes discussion.

Determination

There are two procedures depending on whether or not determination is to be made at the end of the Hearing or within five working days of the Hearing. This later announcement of determination is permitted in terms of the Legislation for certain types of applications.

<u>Chairman</u> informs all present that the Committee will deliberate, that Legal and Governance Officer will remain to advise but will not be part of decision-making process, and that all others must leave (under Regulation 14).

- Parties, apart from Legal and Governance Officer, leave the room.
- The Committee deliberates, with advice as required from Legal and Governance Officer, and reaches a conclusion. The Legal officer may assist, as required, in formulating the wording of the determination.

- Parties return.
- Chairman reads out determination, and advises it will be sent in writing to all parties.
- Opportunity for determination to be clarified by any interested party who is unclear.
- Chairman gives advice about appealing against the determination.
- Chairman thanks all for attending and closes the meeting.

...Within five working days of the hearing

- Chairman explains requirement to determine the Hearing within five workings days, and advises that the Committee will proceed to deliberate and announce the determination within that time.
- During deliberations, Legal and Governance Officers remain to advise on law and procedure as required. The Legal Officer may assist, as required, in formulating the wording of the determination. The Licensing Officer plays no part in the determination and withdraws for this part of the proceedings.
- Chairman advises all parties that they will receive written notification of the determination within five working days of the Hearing date, together with general information on how to appeal against the determination.
- Chairman thanks all parties for attending and invites the applicant, objector(s), other party(ies) and the Licensing Officer to leave.

Information on Appealing against the decision

You may at any time before the expiration of a period of 21 days from notification appeal to Willesden Magistrates' Court, 448 High Road London England NW10 2DZ (Telephone 020 8955 0555, DX 110850 Willesden 2) by way of Complaint for an Order. The Court may either dismiss the appeal, substitute for the decision appealed against any other decision which could have been made by the Licensing Authority or remit the case to the Licensing Authority to dispose of it in accordance with the directions of the court, and can make such order as to costs as it thinks fit.

Euro Food Market, 1 High Street Barnet,

1. The Applicants

The application was submitted by Arulshalini Sureshan, 7 White Gates, 100 Station Road, New Barnet, EN5 1QB.

2. Application

- To allow the supply of alcohol off the premises only from 07:00hrs until 01:00hrs the following morning Monday to Sunday.
- To allow the premises to remain open to the public from 07:00hrs until 01:00hrs the following morning Monday to Sunday.

A full copy of the application can be seen in **Annex 1** attached to this application.

3. Application process

The applicant has been in discussions with Sgt Mark Altman on behalf of Metropolitan Police to the inclusion of various conditions in their application. I can confirm that the applicants agreed to amend their application in order to show the following conditions:

- a) Digital recording colour CCTV comprising a multi camera system.
- b) The head unit (recorder) for storing the images will store such data on a hard drive or a similar quality medium.
- c) A CD or DVD burner will also form part of the system to facilitate making copies of the images.
- d) If the head unit (recorder) is kept on the premises it must be located in a secure cabinet or other secure area, preferably out of the sight and reach of the public. The unit must be further secured by physical means to prevent anyone from merely picking up and removing the unit, e.g. a secure metal boot, or metal case strap, bolted to an immovable object like a wall or floor.
- e) The quality of the images must be of a sufficiently high standard to allow identification of the subject matter.
- f) Cameras will cover key areas identified by the operator and Police. These will include external cameras covering any outside area used by patrons of the premises, the external entrance and exit doors, clear headshots of persons entering the premises, approach route to the toilets, the bar and till areas and other areas not in full view from the bar.
- g) Images must be retained for a period of 31 days before overwriting.
- h) The images will be made available in reasonable time on demand by the Police and authorised officers of the London Borough of Barnet.

- At all times when the premises are open there shall be at least one person who is capable of operating the CCTV system if required to do so by the Police or authorised officers of the London Borough of Barnet.
- j) This system will be fully maintained at all times to ensure correct operation.

A full copy of this agreement can be seen in Annex 2 attached to this report.

4. Representations

Responsible Authorities

No representations have been submitted by any responsible authorities.

Other representations

The licensing department have received 17 representations submitted by members of the public, one of which has a petition with 136 signatures.

The objections refer to issues of crime and disorder and public nuisance if this premise is permitted to supply alcohol.

There are also other issues not relating to the licensing objectives such as too many of a single type of premises in one area.

The representation letters can be seen in full in **Annex 3** attached to this report.

5. Officer Comments

Included in this report are the letters that were sent to the applicant and objectors informing them that the application process had been reset and that all objections would need to be resubmitted. Also included in this report is a photo of the notice displayed on the premises and the ad placed in the newspaper both showing correct activity times and representation end date. All these can be seen in full attached to this report in **Annex 4**.

The licensing Act 2003 does not allow issues relating to an area being saturated with one type of premises to be considered when determining a licence application.

6. Attaching conditions

The operating schedule, which is part of the application, includes certain additional steps that the applicant will take to protect the licensing objectives. These will become enforceable conditions, should the licence be granted. Additional conditions may be attached to the licence if the committee thinks it appropriate.

The Committee must have regard to all of the representations made and the evidence it hears, and is asked to note that it may not attach conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be necessary in order to promote the licensing objectives.

In relation to conditions, the statutory guidance at chapter 10.8 states that "The licensing authority may not impose any conditions unless its discretion has been engaged following receipt of relevant representations and it is satisfied as a result of a hearing (unless all parties agree a hearing is not necessary) that it is appropriate to impose conditions to promote one or more of the four licensing objectives.

Full Copies of the Councils Statement of Licensing Policy, the Statutory Guidance to the Act and the Council's Guide to Good Practice at Licensed Premises will be available at the Licensing Sub Committee hearing or in advance if required.

A map centrally locating the premises and a plan shall be made available at the hearing.



We are writing to again express our concern regarding the application for a licence to sell alcohol at the premises on Barnet High Street at the corner of Bedford Avenue and the High Street.

As long term residents of Bedford Avenue we are very concerned about this proposed development. We feel it is quite unnecessary given that both Hillside News next door and Euro Food and Wine already hold licenses which have already had a negative impact on the local area.. Creating such an 'alcohol hot spot' at the beginning of a residential street is wholly inappropriate and will only encourage further unwanted on street drinking in the immediate area around the junction. This corner, including the dentist car park, already attracts very unwelcome drinking activity and there is a serious and growing associated litter problem both at the corner and along the street. We are regularly required to pick up empty beer cans and bottles along the length of the road. The close proximity to the local girls comprehensive school would also suggest such a development would be wholly inappropriate.

We therefore feel that this application raises issues under several of the criteria mentioned on your web site. It is potentially harmful to children given the proximity to the school; it increases the risk of disorderly behaviour in a residential area; it increases the risk of a public nuisance through the generation of increased litter and unsociable activity.

We note that the proposed opening hours are now longer than in the original application. This only adds to our concerns of unruly behaviour as people collect alcohol at unsociable hours and create noise and disruption to local residents in the small hours of the morning. We can see no justification for a further licence to be granted which we are certain would prove wholly detrimental to the character of the local community.

Euro Stores already has a Licensed Premises at number 5 High Street Barnet and also Hillside News at number 3 has a license so it seems to me yet another premises will just add to the misery caused by the noise of drunken people and the odd occasion that extra noise from breaking bottles and other anti-social behaviour, such as using our garden as a toilet, brings to the disturbance of our sleep!! I have to also mention the stream of cars and the noises they bring as well!

Also I notice that the application is until 1am which is especially worrying to me! - 1. Bedford Avenue and the roads above and below it are residential streets at the southern end of the high street and should be treated as such. Selling liquor at the end of a residential street is asking for trouble. This corner already attracts unwelcome drinking activity and this will make it worse.
- We already see discarded cans and broken bottles littering the street, opening another liquor store will only add to this.
- A plan to keep a liquor store open beyond 10:30 or 11:00 pm is antisocial and encouraging rowdy behaviour in a residential area and is not acceptable.

Today it was brought to our attention that the notices on display at the premises and in the newspaper were displaying incorrect times for the licensable activities. The applicant applied for 07:00 hrs -01:00 hrs Monday to Sunday for alcohol sales off the premises, however on the notice placed both on the premises and in the local newspaper the applicant noted the times as 07:00 hrs -23:00 hrs Monday to Sunday for alcohol sales off the premises.

I have consulted with legal services on this matter and after consideration it has been deemed the decision to grant the licence is null and void due to a proper consultation not being carried out. Legal stated:

"The Panel had no authority to hear it in view of the procedural irregularity. The Licensing Act does not include specific provision about the Notices although it does say that the application must be correct before the Licensing Authority accepts it, and the clock starts running for the consultation period. The application, on the basis that it includes the Notice, was not correct. Similarly the consultation did not start as the Notice was wrong. There was no valid consultation. The High Court considered such irregularities in the "Funky Mojo" case. The notice of review did not contain a full summary of grounds and three sentences were in a smaller print than required. It was accepted by the Court that the level of irregularity had to be considered before it made any decision null and void. In this instance both errors were found to be minor and as such did not invalidate the decision. In this instance however I think that the insertion of an earlier (by 2 hours) time to stop selling alcohol would not be described as minor and therefore the error must be fatal to the application"

Therefore it is deemed that the consultation did not correctly take place meaning the application was not valid and the licence is deemed not granted. Therefore the applicant has to begin the consultation again. The new consultation will begin with an agreed start date between the applicant and the licensing team and will run for 28 days as stated in the licensing act 2003. The applicant will need to place a new notice in both the local newspaper and on the premises and it must contain the correct times, activities and representation end date.
