General points

The following procedure is based on Regulations made by the Secretary of State under the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Hearings Regulations") which may be viewed or downloaded from the website of the Department for Culture, Media and Sport by following links from www.culture.gov.uk

The procedure is intended as a general framework to ensure natural justice and a fair hearing. The conduct of individual hearings may vary slightly according to circumstances and the discretion of the Chairman. In all cases, however, this general framework will be followed.

The procedure allows each party a maximum period of 5 minutes in which to present their case (Regulations 16 & 24). At the end of the time allowed, the Chairman will terminate the presentation and the hearing will proceed in the form of a discussion led by the authority to explore points of dispute. The discussion will not be timed.

The procedure is subject to periodic review and amendment to reflect best practice and relevant legislative changes. An updated version of this procedure is published as soon as possible following any such amendments.

Chairman

- Introduces him/herself and Members of the Committee, and outlines their roles.
- Introduces Licensing, Legal and Governance Officer.
- Explains that Legal and Governance Officers will be present during the Committee's deliberations to advise only, and that the Licensing Officer will be excluded from deliberations.
- Asks parties present to introduce themselves.
- Outlines procedure to be followed (Regulation 22).
- Asks all parties to confirm their understanding of the procedure.
- Clarifies any aspect(s) of the procedure where any parties are uncertain or asks Legal or Governance Officer as appropriate to clarify.

Governance Officer

- Informs Committee of absent parties.
- Details persons whom a party is seeking permission to represent them at hearing.
- Panel confer regarding permission.
- Chairman announces decision regarding permission.

Licensing Officer presents the report to the Committee

- Is a statement of the facts including details of the application and operating schedule, relevant policy details, detail representations made, a chronology of events and highlights the points on which the Authority requires clarification.

Applicant

- Presents opening submissions and clarifies points raised by Authority in notice of hearing. Time allowed 5 mins.

Other parties

- Presents opening submissions either in person or by spokes person
Time allowed 5 mins per interested party.

Note regarding use of video evidence

Video evidence must be in DVD format and will form part of the relevant party's five minutes opening submission. Any party wishing to use video evidence must submit a copy to the Authority along with sufficient, identical extra copies to serve on all the opposing parties – i.e. if the applicant is submitting it, there must be enough copies for all parties making representations and if a party making representations is submitting it there must be a copy for the applicant. The recording must be edited down to the highlights, containing only relevant matter which relates to the written representation previously submitted. In addition, a description of how, when and where the video was recorded and what it contains must be submitted. These must be supplied to the Authority at least five working days before the hearing.

Members question Licensing Officer on Policy

Discussion

Chairman leads a discussion concentrating on points of dispute:

Chairman asks Applicant what he disputes in other parties' submissions, and asks other parties to comment.

Chairman proceeds through all objectors dealing with all matters of contention.

When Chairman feels all matters have been thoroughly discussed and all parties have been given a fair and equal opportunity to comment and make representations, she/he closes discussion.

Determination

There are two procedures depending on whether or not determination is to be made at the end of the Hearing or within five working days of the Hearing. This later announcement of determination is permitted in terms of the Legislation for certain types of applications.

Chairman informs all present that the Committee will deliberate, that Legal and Governance Officer will remain to advise but will not be part of decision-making process, and that all others must leave (under Regulation 14).

- Parties, apart from Legal and Governance Officer, leave the room.
- The Committee deliberates, with advice as required from Legal and Governance Officer, and reaches a conclusion. The Legal officer may assist, as required, in formulating the wording of the determination.

- Parties return.
- Chairman reads out determination, and advises it will be sent in writing to all parties.
- Opportunity for determination to be clarified by any interested party who is unclear.
- Chairman gives advice about appealing against the determination.
- Chairman thanks all for attending and closes the meeting.

...Within five working days of the hearing

- Chairman explains requirement to determine the Hearing within five working days, and advises that the Committee will proceed to deliberate and announce the determination within that time.
- During deliberations, Legal and Governance Officers remain to advise on law and procedure as required. The Legal Officer may assist, as required, in formulating the wording of the determination. The Licensing Officer plays no part in the determination and withdraws for this part of the proceedings.
- Chairman advises all parties that they will receive written notification of the determination within five working days of the Hearing date, together with general information on how to appeal against the determination.
- Chairman thanks all parties for attending and invites the applicant, objector(s), other party(ies) and the Licensing Officer to leave.

Information on Appealing against the decision

You may at any time before the expiration of a period of 21 days from notification appeal to Willesden Magistrates' Court, 448 High Road London England NW10 2DZ (Telephone 020 8955 0555, DX 110850 Willesden 2) by way of Complaint for an Order. The Court may either dismiss the appeal, substitute for the decision appealed against any other decision which could have been made by the Licensing Authority or remit the case to the Licensing Authority to dispose of it in accordance with the directions of the court, and can make such order as to costs as it thinks fit.

Summary

1. The Applicants

The application was submitted by Mr Sotiris Kalogirou, 40 Betstyle Road, Arnos Grove, London, N11 1JB

2. Application

- To allow the supply of alcohol on the premises only from 12:00hrs until 23:00hrs Monday to Saturday and 12:00hrs until 22:00hrs Sunday.
- To allow the premises to remain open to the public from 12:00hrs until 23:00hrs Monday to Saturday and 12:00hrs until 22:00hrs Sunday.

A full copy of the application can be seen in **Annex 1** attached to this application.

3. Representations

Responsible Authorities

One representation has been received from Sgt Mark Altman on behalf Metropolitan Police.

The representation refers primarily to Crime and Disorder, although it is believed that the other 3 licensing objectives are likely to be affected.

Other representations

No representations have been received from other parties.

The representation letters can be seen in full in **Annex 2** attached to this report.

4. Officer Comments

Included in this report are the letters that were sent to the applicant and objectors informing them that the application process had been reset and that all objections would need to be resubmitted. Also included in this report is a photo of the notice displayed on the premises and the ad placed in the newspaper both showing correct activity times and representation end date. All these can be seen in full attached to this report in **Annex 4**.

The licensing Act 2003 does not allow issues relating to an area being saturated with one type of premises to be considered when determining a licence application.

5. Attaching conditions

The operating schedule, which is part of the application, includes certain additional steps that the applicant will take to protect the licensing objectives. These will become enforceable conditions, should the licence be granted. Additional conditions may be attached to the licence if the committee thinks it appropriate.

The Committee must have regard to all of the representations made and the evidence it hears, and is asked to note that it may not attach conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be necessary in order to promote the licensing objectives.

In relation to conditions, the statutory guidance at chapter 10.8 states that “The licensing authority may not impose any conditions unless its discretion has been engaged following receipt of relevant representations and it is satisfied as a result of a hearing (unless all parties agree a hearing is not necessary) that it is appropriate to impose conditions to promote one or more of the four licensing objectives.

Full Copies of the Councils Statement of Licensing Policy, the Statutory Guidance to the Act and the Council's Guide to Good Practice at Licensed Premises will be available at the Licensing Sub Committee hearing or in advance if required.

A map centrally locating the premises and a plan shall be made available at the hearing.

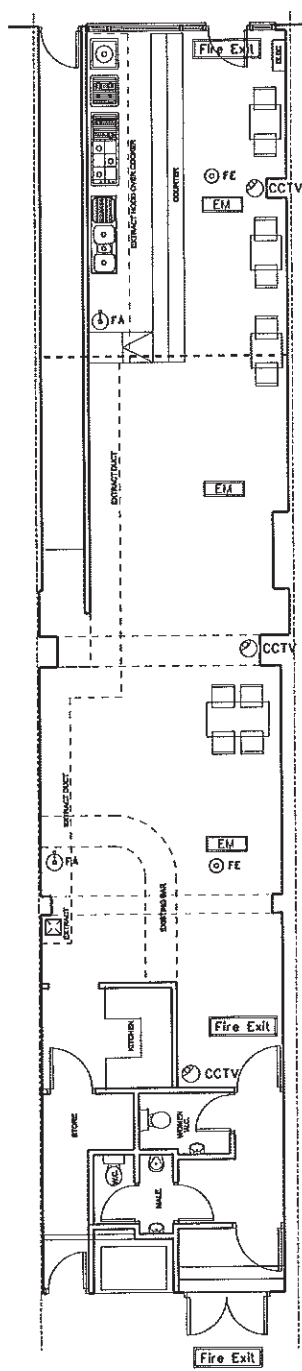

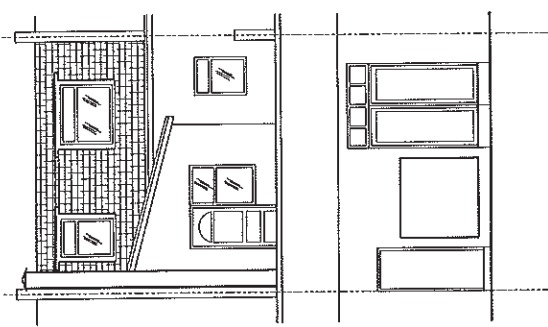

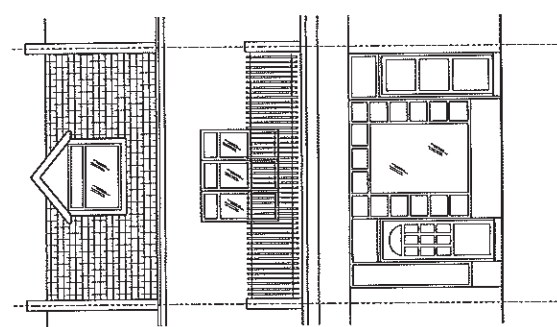

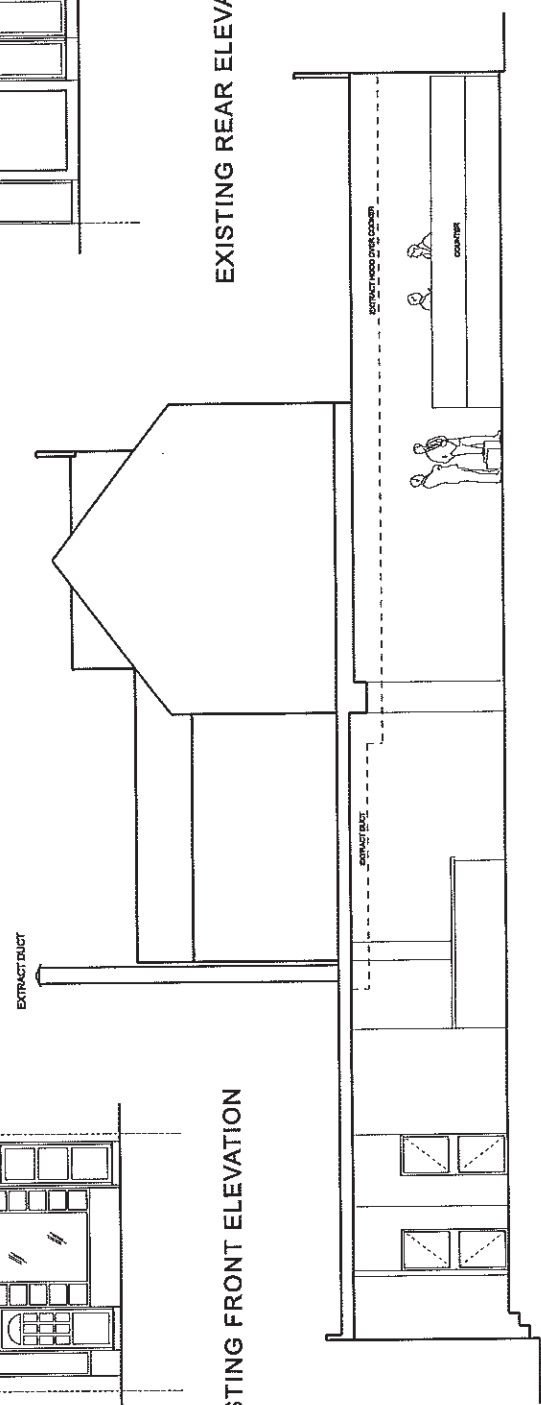
PROPOSED GROUND FLOOR PLAN

Intel of the entire family at 40 Betstyle Road, involvement in dealing drugs. Cannabis smoked there every day.

Report stating the 109 Club, Friern Barnet Road N11 is busy with drug supply. It is closed in the day and open in the evenings.

Intel that drugs were being grown at the address of 40 Betstyle Road N11. The occupants also have a firearm. Barry and his mother are selling to youngsters at 109 Friern Barnet Road.

Report stating that drugs are being sold from the 109 Club, Friern Barnet Road, N11.

Ref SXRT00383046 15th April 2011

Report stating the club had a lot of activity over the last few days. They keep the barrier ¾ the way down. Two days prior there had been some suspicious activity seen by police and a car drove off on seeing that officer.

Anthony Kalogirou stopped in a vehicle by an unmarked police unit. A full set of hydroponics growing equipment was found in the rear of the car he was driving.

A male at 40 Betstyle Road N11 has purchased equipment known to be used in the process of dealing drugs.

Ref SXRT00385955 5th July 2011

Report stating the 109 Club is back open for business. Barry Kalogirou back dealing cannabis. People getting in via the rear alley. Barry has been involved in the supply of drugs from a very young age. The family are well aware of police tactics and know not to keep large volumes of product at addresses likely to be raided by police.

Drugs warrant executed at 40 Betstyle Road N11. Elenie and Barry Kalogirou both arrested. Elenie had told police that she had grown the cannabis for her husband whom she claimed needed it for medical reasons.

Cannabis warning issued to Leon Kalogirou as the result of a warrant being executed at the 109 Club, Friern Barnet Road, N11.

Crime Report - 2413281/11 31st May 2011

Barnet police have entered the premises of 109 Club, Friern Barnet Road N11 due to strong smell of cannabis emanating from it. Three males were detained inside one of which was Anthony Kalogirou. A large quantity of cannabis was found inside along with a number of items that led officers to believe that dealing was taking place such as scales, small self seal bags, a book of names and numbers, several mobile phones, cling film and cash.

Warrant executed at 40 Betstyle Road N11 where Anthony Kalogirou was issued a cannabis warning having been found with cannabis on him.

Warrant executed at 109 Berkshire Gardens, N13, an address known to be linked to the Kalogirou family. Barry Kalogirou was issued with a cannabis penalty fine having had a small amount on him.

Barry Kalogirou was arrested having been stopped by police in a vehicle that smelt of cannabis. Cannabis was surrendered by him and scales were found nearby.

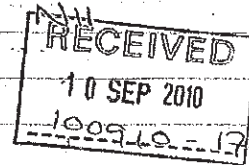
