## A&E Emergency Fund

## Add additional paragraph

Council recognises that some residents are turning up at A and E when they should really be visiting their GP or indeed a pharmacist, and calls on the Health Scrutiny Overview and Scrutiny Committee to investigate how an effective advertising campaign can be undertaken across the Borough to avoid unnecessary A and E visits.

## Substantive Non Executive Business Item to read:

Council notes the Prime Minister's announcement over the summer of a £500 million emergency fund to help A&E's in crisis to cope with the increase in demand during winter.

Council notes that the Department for Health is deciding how to allocate the funds based on plans from the Urgent Care Boards around the country.

Council asks Cabinet to write to the Secretary of State in support of Barnet's local hospitals receiving some of these funds - Barnet Hospital A&E, Chase Farm A&E and Royal Free A&E -which have all had serious issues dealing with A&E wait times and have ongoing financial challenges.
