## **REPORT FOR PUBLIC HEARING**

### Review of the premises licence:

# Buy 2 Save, 24 Golders Green Road, Golders Green, NW11 8LL

#### 1. The Applicant

An application was submitted by Sgt Mark Altman on behalf of Metropolitan Police.

### 2. The Application

This application has been made under Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 to review the Premises Licence held by Mr Kalender Cakir & Mr Mustafa Cakir.

Licensing objectives to which the review application relates is:

- The prevention of Crime and Disorder,
- Public safety

Sgt Altman has made the following statements within the Police's application:

• The immigration services in partnership with the Police complete checks for immigration offences on a number of businesses within Barnet. The purpose for these visits is to ensure that all staff within the store are working legally. On several occasions Immigration Officers have found employees at the store that are not legally entitled to work. In doing so the store is regularly breaking the law. As nothing is known about the staff they are employing there is also a clear chance of that the safety of the public and the staff themselves could be at risk.

Sgt Altman has also provided additional information which can be found with a full copy of the Review application attached to this report in **Annex 1**.

### 3. Premises Licence History

This premises licence was first applied and granted back in 2005. Since then there have been 3 applications to vary the designated premises supervisor and 3 applications to transfer the premise licence. The last transfer granted on 10<sup>th</sup> November 2010 placed Mr Kalender Cakir & Mr Mustafa Cakir as the premises licence holders.

#### 4. Current Premises Licence

The current licence allows the following licensable activities:

# The times the licence authorises the carrying out of licensable activities Sale by retail of alcohol off the premises only

<u>Standard Days and Timings:</u> Monday to Thursday Friday to Saturday Sunday

08:00hrs - 00:00hrs 08:00hrs - 02:00hrs 10:00hrs - 00:00hrs

The current premises licence showing the above stated hours and all of the conditions attached to the premises licence can be found in full attached to this report as **Annex 2** 

#### 5. Representations

No representations were received by the licensing authority in relation to this review application.

#### 6. Guidance

#### 7. Determination

The sub-committee shall determine the application in accordance with Section 52 of the Licensing Act 2003.

S 52 (3);

"The authority must, having regard to the application and any relevant representations, take such of the steps mentioned in subsection (4) (if any) as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

- 4. The steps are-
  - (a) to modify the conditions of the licence;
  - (b) to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
  - (c) to remove the designated premises supervisor;
  - (d) to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;
  - (e) to revoke the licence;

and for this purpose the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added.

5. Subsection (3) is subject to sections 19, 20 and 21 (requirement to include certain conditions in premises licences).

6. Where the authority takes a step mentioned in subsection (4) (a) or (b), it may provide that the modification or exclusion is to have effect for only such period (not exceeding three months) as it may specify.

Full Copies of the Councils Statement of Licensing Policy and the Statutory Guidance to the Act will be available at the Licensing Sub Committee hearing or in advance if required.
