- 1.1 Councillor Tom Davey has requested that a Member's Item be considered on the following matter

"There is currently no crossing point (which requires vehicles to stop) between Mathilda Marks (Hale Lane), Bunns Lane Carpark, and even further down towards Woodcroft Park.

There are two crossing islands on Bunns Lane which residents believe may present an opportunity to introduce a zebra crossing (one just before, and one just after the T-junction with Langley Park. In addition the crossing point on Hale Lane (near the junction with Mill Hill Broadway & Bunns Lane) is not wide enough for a pram or wheelchair.

Can the committee request that options are explored for improved road crossing points on Bunns Lane, with specific attention to the above mentioned sites"
