## 1. The Applicants

The application was submitted by Poppleston Allen on behalf of Power Leisure Bookmakers Ltd

## 2. Application

The application before the subcommittee was submitted under Section 159 of the Gambling Act 2005 for a premises licence. The licence seeks to allow the premises to be used for adult Betting (other).

- Default conditions state gambling can only take place between 7am and 10pm.

The Licensing Team have received a petition of which has 112 valid signatures by members of the public and 1 valid signature from a local ward councillor, this objection relates to the licensing objections of protecting children and other vulnerable people from being harmed or exploited by gambling and preventing gambling from being a source of crime and disorder, being associated with crime or disorder or being used to support crime.

The Parade should be enhanced as a local shopping centre not weakened by more betting or fast food outlets. The Co-Op has shown the way by investing in the Parade. Planning permission should not be granted for the loss of a valued local service---currant planning thinking and guidance is about enhancing local facilities and reducing traffic movements. This proposal flies in the face of currant best practice on sustainability and maintaining viable local services. It has nothing whatsoever to commend it a should be refused.
