1. RELEVANT PREVIOUS DECISIONS

1.1 Cabinet, 20th June 2012 (item 6) – authorisation of the Barnet Skills, Employment and Enterprise Action Plan and a package of targeted support to help young people into employment, including support to local businesses

2. CORPORATE PRIORITIES AND POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

- 2.1 Producing an economic development and growth strategy will help us work towards one of the key aims of the Corporate Plan which is to sustain Barnet as a 'successful London suburb'.
- 2.2 This research contributes to the key objective of developing our level of engagement with businesses. Supporting local businesses better through an improved understanding of their needs will ensure we can be more responsive to the sector and ensure its continuing success.

3. RISK MANAGEMENT ISSUES

3.1 The issues involved are not likely to raise significant levels of public concern or give rise to policy considerations as this research is designed to help us better support the needs of the local economy, an aim which will positively benefit the whole borough.

4. EQUALITIES AND DIVERSITY ISSUES

- 4.1 Any organisation providing public sector services will be under scrutiny of the council to ensure that the delivery of services complies with the council's public sector equalities duties.
- 4.2 This research is designed to help us better support the needs of the local economy, an aim which will positively benefit the whole borough. Understanding our businesses and supporting growth will ensure adequate employment opportunities for residents; this will help the borough to remain cohesive and at ease with its growing diversity.
- 5. USE OF RESOURCES IMPLICATIONS (Finance, Procurement, Performance & Value for Money, Staffing, IT, Property, Sustainability)
- 5.1 The resources recommended for approval are £22,260. This funding will be drawn from the 2012/13 contingency reserve.
- 5.2 There are no staffing, ICT or property implications in the context of this report.

7. CONSTITUTIONAL POWERS

- 7.1 Constitution, Part 3 Responsibility for Functions, Section 6.1 Powers of Chief Officers Chief Officers may use whatever means they consider appropriate to discharge the functions allocated to them.
- 7.2 The Council's Constitution, under the contract procedure rules, provides that service contracts with values of less than 24,999 must be procured using a reasonable means of selection including budget authorisation and an audit trail. Reasonable means of selection is defined in the constitution as" an unbiased selection process based on the relative merits of the quotation provided and taking account of previous purchasing practices for supplies, services or works of a similar type. This process would normally involve attaining more than one quotation, audit trail of action undertaken and confirmation from Assistant Director that budget is available and rationale for appointment is accepted."

8. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 8.1 Despite the challenging economic climate, Barnet remains a successful and enterprising borough, with the third highest number of registered businesses in London. However, there are variations in different parts of the borough. There are areas of deprivation, notably around the western boundary's 'A5 corridor' and in some of our local housing estates.
- 8.2 Our aim is to ensure Barnet remains a successful London borough despite a challenging economic climate and reduced public funding. We believe one of the best ways to do this is to promote enterprise and employment, and develop new business and growth.
- 8.3 The Barnet Skills, Employment and Enterprise Action Plan and package of support to unemployed young people has been approved by Cabinet. These papers focus on the need to understand local businesses and our economy to ensure we have an adequate supply of employment opportunities for residents. They also establish a strategy for growth in the borough, something that is of particular importance given the changes to business rates retention in upcoming months.
- 8.4 We need a better understanding of the employment and skills needs of Barnet employers, as well as other factors which may be constraining business growth. Research undertaken by Middlesex University will provide us with an analysis of the enterprise dynamics in the Barnet economy. It will also provide us with the relevant indicators by which we can track the performance of the economy in relation to any interventions undertaken. The project will also contribute towards the council's objective of developing effective business engagement. The research will produce

- an interim report based on desk based analysis by October 2012 and a final report including policy recommendations by December 2012.
- 8.5 Given the University's experience in business and enterprise research, their location within the borough and the geographical focus of the research, it was deemed appropriate that they were selected to undertake this piece of work.
