## Appendix H: General Budget Consultation Report update

The following updates highlighted in yellow are to be made to Appendix H. These updates do not change any of the overall consultation findings reported in the P \& R Report or in Appendix H.

1. Appendix H Page 279, paragraph 1.2.2, and page 288, paragraph 3.2 update:

- just under two fifths of respondents ( $36 \%, 34$ out of 95 respondents) support both the council's proposals on Council Tax: the proposal to increase general Council Tax by 2.99\% 1.99\% and the proposal to apply a further 1.99\% 2 \% Social Care Precept in 2020/21

This is correct in the Policy and Resources Committee Report.
2. Appendix H, Page 279: Paragraph 1.2.2 update:

- $16 \%$ ( 15 out of 95 respondents) support the proposal to increase general Council Tax by 1.99 \% in 2020/21 only.
