## **Hot Spot Locations and Comments**

Hotspot	Street Cleansing Response / Comment
Cool Oak Lane NW9,	The area supervisor inspects regularly due to excessive littering from passing cars & fly tipping. Reports also gratefully received from Cllr Johnson which enables us to react promptly.
Entrance to Woolmead Avenue NW9	Littering and dumping is checked and dealt with by hot spot team as directed by area supervisor.
Garrick Road and streets off NW9	Poorly presented domestic waste and recycling boxes create litter problems, wheeled bins left out on pavements by residents. A letter drop from the refuse team is to be arranged to give clear instructions to residents.
Wilberforce Road and Herbert Road NW9	Comments as above for Garrick Road.
Montagu Road	We have been in discussion with the head of Childrens Services and asked if the school head teachers can be contacted in order to speak / write to parents and pupils
Bertram Road	regarding littering on the way to and from school. Follow up message to be arranged. Refuse problems are being dealt with by proactive
Dartmouth Road	supervisory / enforcement visits to problem addresses and meetings with landlords / managing agents. There are still some residents who continue to disregard guidance and bins
Algernon Road	are still being left out all week, we will continue to advise these residents. Anti-littering and fly tipping signs have been posted on lamp columns and regular frequent contact
Audley Road	between Kavita Singh and street cleansing team are having a positive effect. We have increased to a weekly sweep / visit to Bertram Road, this is to be kept under review.

Dallas Road NW4 Brent Park Road NW4	Frequent problems with fly tipping under the road / rail bridge are dealt with promptly by our teams. We have regular contact with Brent Cross regarding abandoned shopping trolleys in these roads, they carry out frequent patrols to remove these from the highway.
Pavement o/s Vauxhall Garage Staples Corner NW9	A recognised litter hot spot created by motorists lining up to get on to the roundabout.  Hot spot team visit and clean 3 times per week.

A5 end of Park Road NW9. Perryfield Way	Frequent fly tipping occurs at these recycling bins and our teams react promptly to remove these.	
Top of Cool Oak Lane Left hand side of Esmar Crescent	The area supervisor did have contact with the builders and ensured that the area was left in a tidy condition before they departed the site.  Any fly tipping is continually removed by our teams.  This is private land and the fencing isn't owned by the council, however we have removed the rubbish that was affecting the public highway.	
Malcolm Crescent fly tipping	Residents in this road frequently dump bulky items onto the highway. Supervisor does inspect weekly. Problems reported by Judy Shepherd are gratefully received by us and dealt with promptly.	
Some of the above roads do require more frequent cleaning and this is being reviewed currently. We take on board comments regarding more frequent servicing of litter bins.		
Colindale Avenue	We now have a dedicated town keeper at Colindale Avenue, we put this arrangement in place due to the high footfall associated with the underground station and the new	
Colindeep Lane	developments in the area.	
Sheaveshill Avenue all from the A5	Sheaveshill Avenue now receives fortnightly sweeping due to the huge littering problems and the adjacent busy town centre footfall. It is also subject to frequent visits by the area hot spot team as directed by the area supervisor	
Court Way off Sheaveshill Avenue	Court Way is currently listed as a hot spot for litter and receives a weekly visit. Litter bins are emptied daily.	
Woodfield Avenue	Woodfield Avenue is scheduled as per Court Way above.	
Poolsford Road Hillfield Avenue	Poolsford Road is scheduled as per Woodfield Avenue above/	
Silkfield Road all roads leading to	Hillfield Avenue is scheduled as per Poolsford Road above but also receives a weekly priority sweep when required.	
Colindale School	Silkfield Road is scheduled as per Hillfield Avenue above.	
New Way Road	New Way Road is scheduled as per Silkfield Road above.	
Colin Gardens	Colin Gardens is not currently listed as a hot spot. We will review this	
Colin Crescent	Colin Crescent suffers from residents dumping bulky waste onto the highway and frequent removals are required. It does have priority listing and gets a weekly sweep as required.	
Crossway	Crossway is currently listed as a litter hot spot and gets a weekly visit or more if required by supervisor inspection.	

Concourse is very bad and the rest of Grahame Park needs looking at.	The Concourse Grahame Park is cleansed and maintained by Barnet Homes caretaker estate services as are many of the central areas, we clean the peripheral areas of the estate as per other residential roads.
Watling Avenue	A section of this falls within the Burnt Oak town centre and receives daily attention. The residential section suffers from frequent dumping of bulky waste and bagged domestic refuse onto the highway.  Littering is also a major issue with drink cans and fast food waste being deposited into hedges and onto the highway.  It is currently listed as a hotspot and gets cleaned of litter three times a week.
Silkstream Road,	Is currently listed as a litter hotspot and gets twice weekly visits.
Barnfield Road	Is within the Burnt Oak town centre and receives daily attention, this road suffers from frequent fly tipping by residents.
Gervase Road	Is not currently listed as a hotspot although the area supervisor does frequently redirect resources to clean up refuse spillages caused by poorly presented waste.
Burnt Oak Broadway	Is within the Burnt Oak town centre and receives daily attention.
Gaskarth Road	Is listed as a litter hot spot and gets cleaned weekly.
Back Lane	Is a dumping hot spot, residents from flats above the shops and businesses abuse the environment on a regular basis.  We continually have to commit resources to clean and remove waste.
