1	Petitions Received – West Hendon WH3 Controlled Parking Zone		
	<u>Overview</u>		
	The Council undertook a consultation process between 29 November and 20 December 2012 on proposed changes to the parking layout in certain roads within the West Hendon WH3 Controlled Parking Zone in order to continue to effectively manage the public highway in the vicinity of Montagu Road NW4 with a view to deterring congestion and improving parking and traffic management, and safety in the area. Issues a) Four petitions had been received following the statutory consultation period objecting to aspects of Council's proposals including from:	Responses received to the proposals during the statutory consultation period are currently being considered and it is expected that a formal decision on the way forward will be made by mid February 2013. Once a decision is made, the relevant report will then be made public and the details published on the council's website. 	A petition with 415 signatures has been received requesting the installation of a pelican crossing on Broadfields Avenue (between Glengall Road and Bullescroft Road, Edgware, HA8)	part of School Travel Plan initiatives to improve safety and encourage sustainable travel and walking to/from school. and Broadfields) where parents have to park on the road and cross heavy traffic particularly at 0830 and 1540 daily taking children to and from school. Whilst there are two islands they are not positioned close to Glengall Road and a pelican crossing would ensure that traffic slows and enables children to cross safely. We do not want to wait for a tragedy to happen before a pelican crossing is put in place." The lead petitioner Ms Suzy Kaye outlined the safety issues at this location. She raised particular concern regarding children and parents having to cross this busy road at peak times and requested that a crossing be installed.	pedestrian islands were installed to accord users opportunities to cross Broadfields in two stages where possible. It was not possible to identify one concentrated location that could serve as a pedestrian desire line warranting the recommendation of a formal crossing. In addition, at this time vehicle-activated signs were also installed to alert speeding drivers and therefore help in creating a safer environment including the one by the Glengall Road junction. Until now, the next most recent assessment at this location was during early 2011 following an incident involving a drunken driver crashing through a private wall facing Glengall Road that culminated in a court case. Officers have now completed the latest review guided by the existing Traffic Management Budget (TMB) criteria that insists on focussing the limited resources at those locations that have a known history of related Personal Injury Accidents (PIA). Under this TMB criteria, PIA data for the last 3 years (currently goes up to 31 August 2012) is used to prioritise locations against other competing requests. There have been no incidents involving pedestrians at this location and the pedestrian counts, although not formally quantified, have been assessed on site to be too low to justify a formal crossing such as a pelican. The costs of such a facility at this location would be disproportionate. Therefore, the petition request has not met the	RESOLVED that the Sub-Committee note that although this location does not meet the criteria to justify the a recommendation for the installation of a crossing, Officers be instructed to carry out a feasibility study with a view to introducing a crossing and report the findings back a future meeting of the Hendon Area Environment Sub-Committee for consideration.
