Council 17 May, 2005 membership of Committees and Political Balance

Council on...., when approving the establishment Committee, agreed to reduce the number of Appeals Committees to one, with effect from the 2005 Annual Meeting.

The Council also on 12 April, 2005, agreed, with effect from the Annual Meeting to

- (i) restructure the Overview and Scrutiny Committees into six Overview and Scrutiny Committees; and
- (ii) introduce a new Audit Committee

The opportunity has also been taken to review the membership of the Planning and Environment Committee. For some time there has been concern that the size of the Committee, with 21 Members, is extremely unwieldy and is not conducive to good governance or the enhancement of the planning process. It is therefore proposed to reduce the membership on this Committee to

All the forgoing developments impact on the make – up of the Committees insofar as achieving political balance is concerned.

Political Balance : Background

The Council must allocate seats on committees and other prescribed bodies so as to give effect to the political balance rules under the Local Government and Housing Act 1989.

The political proportionality rules also apply to those outside bodies dealing with local government matters to which the council appoints three or more representatives. They therefore apply to the Welsh Harp Joint Consultative Committee. The calculation indicates that the allocation must be two Conservative and two Labour.

The Council appoints or nominates members to a variety of special statutory bodies, or informal or consultative bodies that are not council committees or sub-committees. The political balance rules do not apply to these.

The consultative bodies established for consultation with staff are also not regarded as council committees subject to the political balance rules. Each has a special composition.

The Regulations provide an exception from the political balance requirements where a committee is established to discharge functions in part of an authority's area, and

- (a) consists entirely of members elected for wards which comprise the area, and
- (b) either the area or its population does not exceed two-fifths of the total for the authority.

This allows the six area planning and environment sub-committees to be constituted on a ward member basis and still comply with the law.

The political group with the majority of seats on the council is entitled to a majority of seats on all the relevant Committees.

Achieving Political Balance

For the purposes of this paper, the political balance calculations have been based on the following political split. :

Conservatives :33 Labour : 24 Liberal Democrat : 6

Enclosure 1 demonstrates the current situation, which includes 11 Overview and Scrutiny Committees, 10 of which have 7 members, one 11, and five Appeals Committees consisting of nine members.

Enclosure 2 demonstrates the effect on political balance of reducing the number of Overview and Scrutiny Committees to six, the Appeals Committees to one and the inclusion of the Audit Committee, retaining 11 Members for the Cabinet Overview and Scrutiny Committee and otherwise on the same make – up as currently, with the Audit Committee having a proposed membership of seven.

It is not possible to achieve political balance on this basis. The Liberal Democrat Group would not be entitled to seats on two relevant committees. It would then be necessary to reduce two Committees by one seat each and for the Conservative Group to agree to relinquish their majority on three Committees.

Enclosure 3 exemplifies the foregoing comment. The choice on where the adjustments are made rests with the political groups.

If the objective is for the Liberal Democrat group to have a seat on each committee, a total of 114 seats would need to be achieved. **Enclosure 4** demonstrates how this could be achieved.

However, there have been some concerns expressed in the past over the size of the Planning and Environment Committee and that it is unwieldy and not conducive to good governance either. Having two thirds of Councillors either as members or substitutes of this Committee is disproportionate and unnecessary. It can create difficulties in terms of the numbers of Members who feel unable to pre-comment on matters coming before the Committee because of concerns that they might prejudice their participation in the decision making process. There are also difficulties with public perceptions of impartiality when some Members are also part of the Executive or the Regeneration and Development OSC.

With that in mind, **Enclosures 5 and 6** demonstrate how political balance could be achieved if the Planning and Environment Committee were reduced to either 9 or 11 members respectively, resulting in a total number of seats of 103 and 106 respectively.

These calculations would allow for the Liberal Democrat Group to have a seat on each committee, but would mean that the Conservative Group would not have an absolute majority on four committees, but a working majority only. If one of these options was to be pursued, again the decision as to which Committees the conservative group would hold a working majority would be a matter for that Group.

Recommendation : linstructions are requested on

- (1) the size of the Planning and Environment Committee;
- (2) the make up of the Committees which are subject to the political balance calculations.

1. Political Balance calculation and allocation of seats

2. Representation of the Council on Outside Bodies

Appendix A lists in bold the vacancies in the Council's representation on Outside Bodies.

The Group Secretaries have been advised of the vacancies.

Members are asked to note that the Association of London Government Education Forum has been discontinued and that nominations are no longer required for the Association of London Government Lead Member for Equalities due to a change in the way this postholder is appointed.

In addition, the North London Chamber of Commerce (Barnet) has been restructured and no longer requires a representative from the borough.

Friern Barnet Voluntary Care for the Elderly has a Council representative appointed as a condition of the previous award of a grant, but it is no longer in receipt of grant aid. Council is asked to agree that appointments to this body need no longer be made. The current appointment expires on 17 May 2005.

RECOMMEND:

1. That the Council make appointments to fill the vacancies reported.

2. That the Council agree that no further representatives will be appointed to Friern Barnet Voluntary Care for the Elderly.

3. Representation of the Council on Artsdepot Trust Ltd

6. Vacancies on School Governing Bodies

However, as this may lead to a reduction in the number of LEA governors on those bodies, it is not proposed to fill those vacancies until the position at each school is clarified. The table below gives numbers for all LEA governors, including those vacancies which are not presently being filled.

The governing body of Dollis Infant School will shortly be reconstituted with the effect that the number of LEA governors will reduce from four to three. Therefore, although there are two vacancies on this governing body, only one needs to be filled. The governing body of Monkfrith JMI School has reconstituted, reducing its LEA governors by one, so the vacancy at this school reported to the last Council meeting has now been deleted.

Part 3

Responsibility for Functions

Responsibility for Functions

(Section revised Council 12 April 2005)

References: Chapter 5, Guidance The Local Authorities (Functions and Responsibilities) (England) Regulations 2000 Section 13, Local Government Act 2000

Explanatory Note

1. The Local Government Act 2000 divides the functions of the local authority between the full Council (and its Committees) and the Executive. The Council is no longer the body responsible for all the activities of the local authority in the borough.

The Council's statutory duties are now broadly:

- 1. Approval of the budget and statutory policy framework.
- 2. Constitutional and quasi-legislative functions.
- 3. Dealing with applications for licences, approvals, consents, permissions (including planning permission) and registrations; and related regulation and enforcement action.

All other functions of the local authority are functions of the Executive, i.e. the Leader and Cabinet, and cannot be exercised by the Council (Section 13 (10) Local Government Act 2000).

This Part of the Constitution is the Scheme of Delegation that sets out the detailed arrangements for the allocation and discharge of responsibilities.

2. The principles of the Scheme of Delegation are that functions are delegated from the Council and the Executive to subordinate bodies and persons by exception rather than specifically.

This Part of the Constitution, therefore, also sets out the decisions that are reserved to specific decision takers and cannot be taken by subordinate decision takers.

3. It is a general legal principle that although delegation involves conferring authority on subordinate bodies and individuals, this does not mean that the delegator gives up the authority to act or take decisions. That general principle is expressly recognised in Section 15(9) of the Local Government Act 2000:-

"Any arrangements made by virtue of this section by an executive leader, executive member or committee for the discharge of any functions by an executive, member, committee or officer are not to prevent the executive leader, executive, member or committee by whom the arrangements are made from exercising those functions".
