2. continued	We also want to give citizens greater control over their lives and the ability to make informed choices for themselves. To ensure all citizens have an equal opportunity to do all of this we need to find innovative forms of engagement and new ways of communicating with them. As part of this recognition and new approach the council has recently developed a strong online presence, namely through our own social media website, whereilive.org. The council has also established a presence on facebook; twitter, flickr and the Leader of the Council has launched his own Leader Listens website. 3. Whereilve.org in detail Whereilive.org is an attempt to create a space for residents to share their experiences of the borough in their own words through the ability to write text, take photographs or record videos that best describe how they feel about their area. Simply posing the questions "what's it like where you live? What do you most like and what would you most like to change?" The website was piloted with staff during August before launching it in the pilot areas in September, and launched Borough- wide Jan 2009. This website site is supplemented with additional online work to reach out into places where people are already having these conversations, such as Facebook, video sharing sites such as YouTube, photo sharing sites such as Flickr and a host of local blogs. The council has also gone out and engaged with residents face to face through a series of vox pop interviews which can now be viewed on the whereilive website.
