	Subject	Response	Action
1	There is a Junction box in Llanvanor Rd, the doors of which keep swinging open to the annoyance of passing pedestrians	There are two Virgin Media cable TV cabinets side by side. When inspected the doors on both had been wedged shut. We have reported the defect to Virgin Media and asked them to carry out repairs.	No update necessary
2	There was a fire at Garth Hall and Garth House in Cricklewood Lane NW2. Would the Council consider turning the area into a Further Education facility? It is something that the area is lacking.	The Council will assess any planning application that is submitted in accordance with the Unitary Development Plan. The use of the site can not be determined prior to a formal planning application. Any application that is submitted will be consulted on with neighbours.	No update necessary
3	Why does the Council nor the Police do anything with regards to a lady named Susan who lives in shop doorways in Golders Green Road?	Susan has been offered more assistance by the Council and everything is being done to help Susan, however Ward Councillors do not wish to persecute her.	Susan was taken on 6 February 2009 by London Ambulance Services to Royal Free Hospital. She was offered treatment but refused as per her rights. She was then picked up by Camden's Housing Out of Hours Emergency Placement Team and taken to a Hostel in Englands Lane NW3. Susan accepted this placement as she was saying she had no money or food. She should have seen someone from Camden's Housing Options Team by Wednesday 11 February but simply

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			walked out leaving behind her personal belongings. She was seen back in Golders Green on Thursday 12 February and is back there. She was spending her days in and out of Costa Coffee or Starbucks. The Council understands she is not sleeping in the bus shelters. It is possible she is sleeping in doorways. The Council is trying to arrange a briefing for Heads of Service-Dorne, Pam Wharfe, Irene Findlay, Shahin Farjami, the Police and Primary Care Trust (Mental Health) to try and reach a collective position on this case.
4	There are rumours appearing in the papers with regard to privatisation of Council services. What is the purpose and who has been consulted?	The Cabinet Committee received a report in December detailing information on the possibility of a joint venture between the Council and one or more private, public or voluntary sector partners. The Committee agreed decided that more consideration was necessary before a decision was made and a future report would be submitted to Cabinet in June 2009.	In May, the Council established an initial research programme to look at the shape the Council should be to respond to a number of very different challenges: the need to constantly improve services; a growing and changing population of the borough creating new demands for services; and year on year reductions in central government grant settlements, meaning we have to find new ways to improve performance while also reducing costs. The conclusion of this phase of work was the Future Shape of

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			the Council report that Cabinet discussed in December. Contrary to reports in some local papers, the proposals do not suggest largescale privatisation of Council services. They propose that the Council should focus on the things it does best and work with other organisations where they can provide the best results at reduced cost. As a result of this report, a programme of feasibility work has been set up, to report in the summer, to look at the potential for working more with private, voluntary and other public sector organisations to provide better results for lower cost.
5	What is the current financial situation of the Council after the financial crisis in Iceland?	Other Local Authorities have made deposits into banks in Iceland. These were not investments. The investments were made during 2006 and 2007 when the economic climate was different to the current conditions and the Council took government accredited advice before making any deposits. The Director of Resources for Barnet Council as well as the Director of Resources at Kent County Council are currently dealing with the matter.	Councils with deposits in Icelandic banks have organised themselves into an overall steering committee, with two bank specific committees underneath that – Heritable, and Landsbanki/Glitnir. The Council's Director of Resources & Chief Finance Officer, Clive Medlam, chairs the Glitnir/Landsbanki committee. The overall committee has a wider remit, which includes engagement of legal support and liaison with the Treasury and CLG etc.

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		Two Informal Creditor
		Committee (ICC)
		meetings for each
		bank have so far
		been held in Iceland,
		in November and
		December. These
		ICC meetings are by
		invitation only, they are not required to be
		held at all but the fact
		that they are
		demonstrates the
		desire of the Icelandic
		FME (their regulatory
		body) and the
		Resolution
		Committees to work
		with creditors to
		maximise asset value
		and ultimately return
		of deposits, bonds
		etc. to them. Both banks are now what

		there will be an Open
		Creditors meeting for each bank, which is

		The moratorium can
		be extended for up to
		two years, in steps of
		six month
		intervals/decisions.
		There is no reason at
		this time to think that
		the moratorium won't
		be extended.
