Officers recently had a constructive meeting with Councillor Greenspan and residents to discuss concerns raised and it was subsequently agreed that a further meeting should take place on site to review the proposals and to consider additional points raised by the residents. The meeting will be arranged once utility works in the area have been completed which is expected to be by the second week of July.	A number of subsequent meetings have taken place to observe traffic including driver and pedestrian behaviour. Information gathered from these meetings is being reviewed that will help to inform the way forward which will be discussed with residents in due course.
2	Barnet Website : The Barnet website used to have a section called 'Halls for Hire' where local organisations could give details of halls or rooms that could be hired by the public. Action Taken : Action Taken : A housing officer went to 11 Mountfield Rd Finchley on Friday, 25 June with a representative from the managing agents. He inspected the back and rear gardens and the front door. The glazing in the front door had been repaired, rubbish including a large TV was gone, weeds and undergrowth had been removed, and the estate agent's sign had gone. Having inspected the property, the Temporary Accommodation Officer spoke to the neighbour, who expressed satisfaction with all that had been done. With respect to the exterior of the building Environmental Health is satisfied that the action so far taken

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			respect to the interior there are some concerns with the state of repair of the property which are being addressed. The complainants can be assured that there was nothing found that would warrant, immediate or prohibition action.
