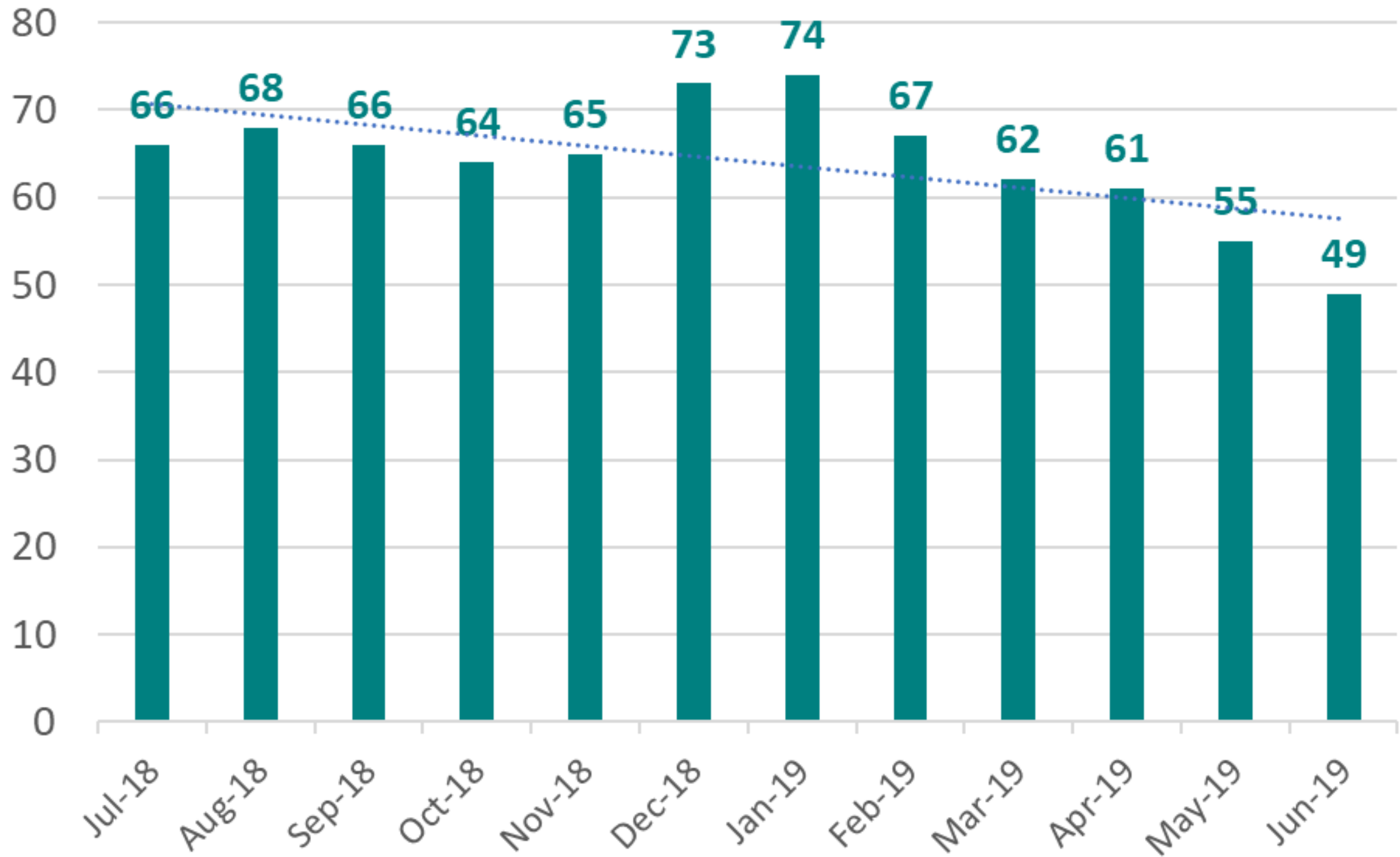

- **Troubled Families Programme. (Brief)**
- **All local authorities in England now in the final eight months of the Phase 2 Troubled Families Programme ending 31st March 2020**
- **3,990 families have been attached to the programme; no further families will be attached to the Programme as focus is on achieving ‘turnaround’ with the families currently being worked with.**
- **Since April 2015, Barnet has submitted 1,554 ‘turnaround’ claims, representing 70% of our 2,220 target.**
- **Barnet are on track to meet claims target by 2020**
- **Partnership posts from Probation, RISE (domestic abuse), Education and Health are having a positive impact on the join up of services for families.**
- **Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government (MHCLG) meeting with Directors for Children’s Services to review next steps in July.**

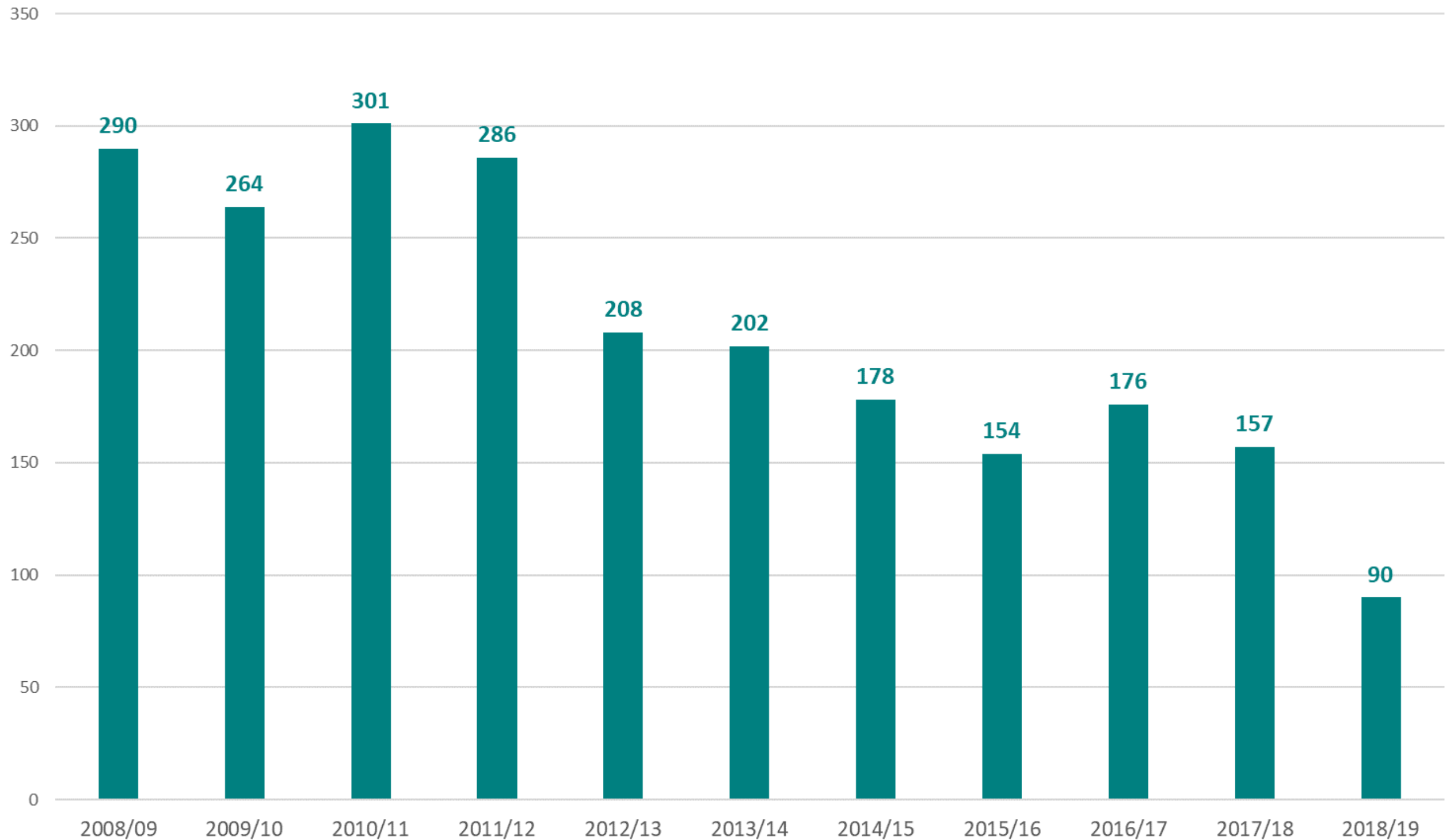

Total number of cases currently open to the YOT

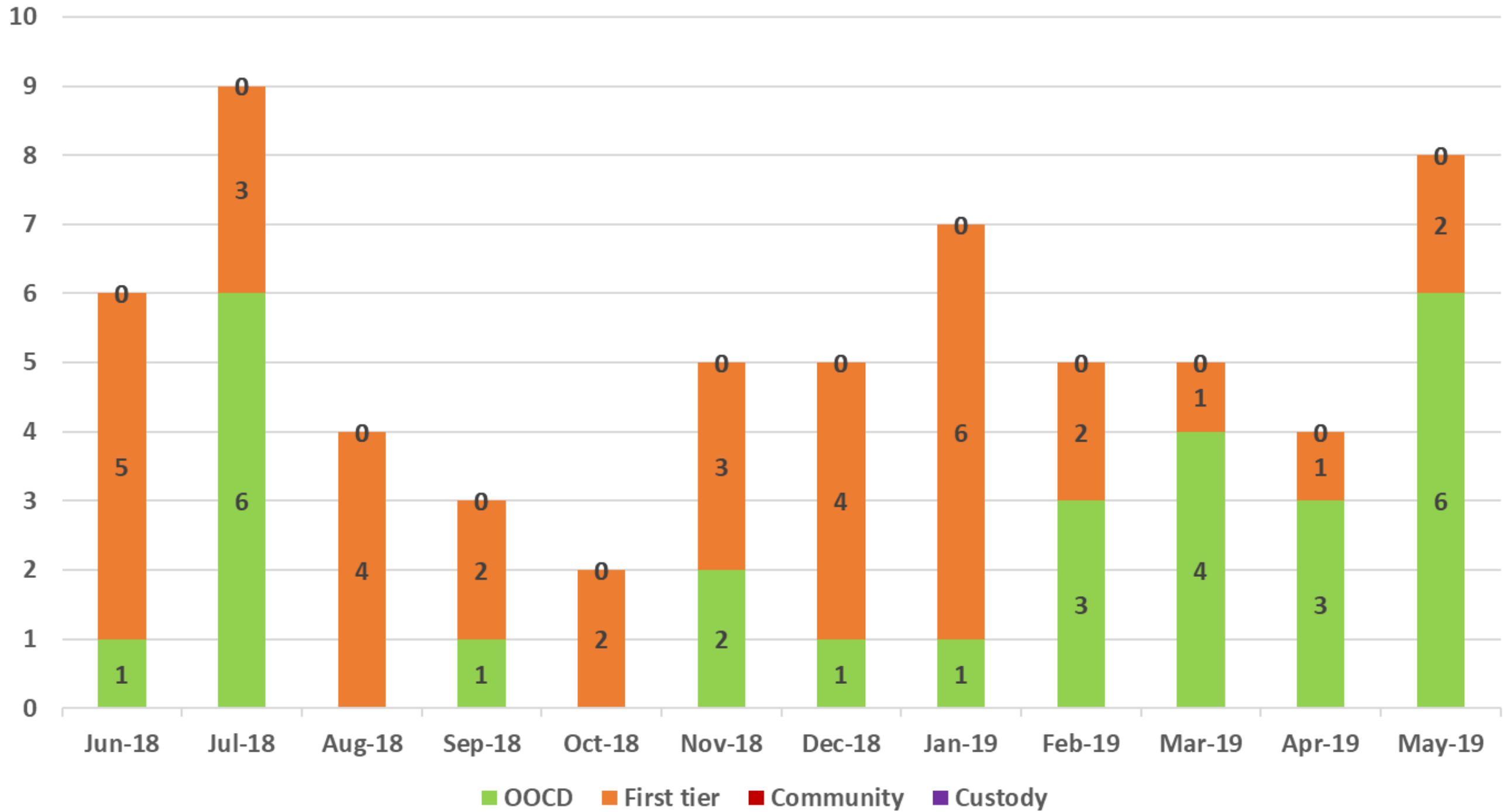


This indicator has seen a gradual decrease in the number of open cases, with occasional spikes such as that experienced in December 2018 / January 2019

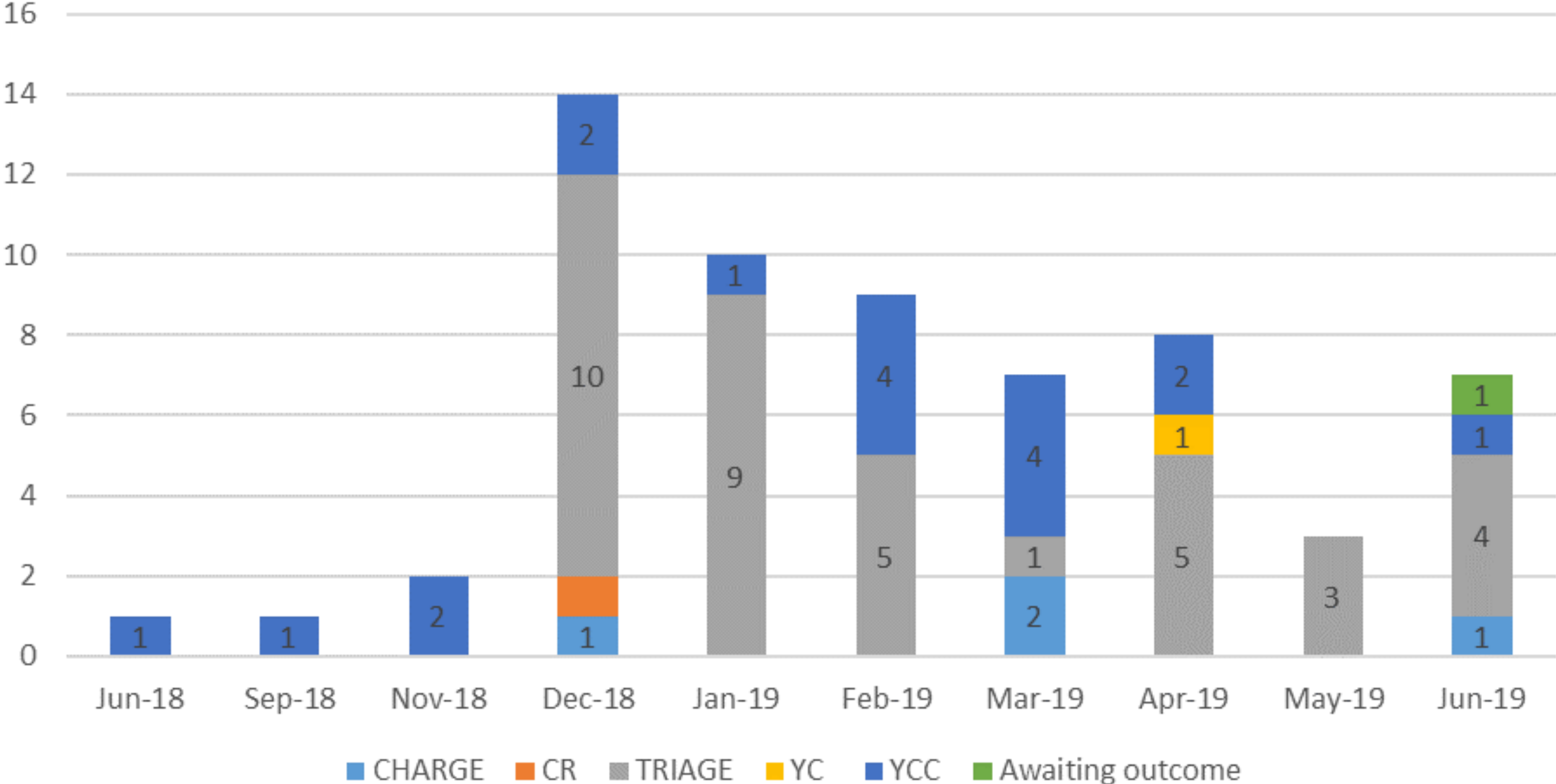
Young people sentenced to YOT-managed court orders (Barnet YOT)



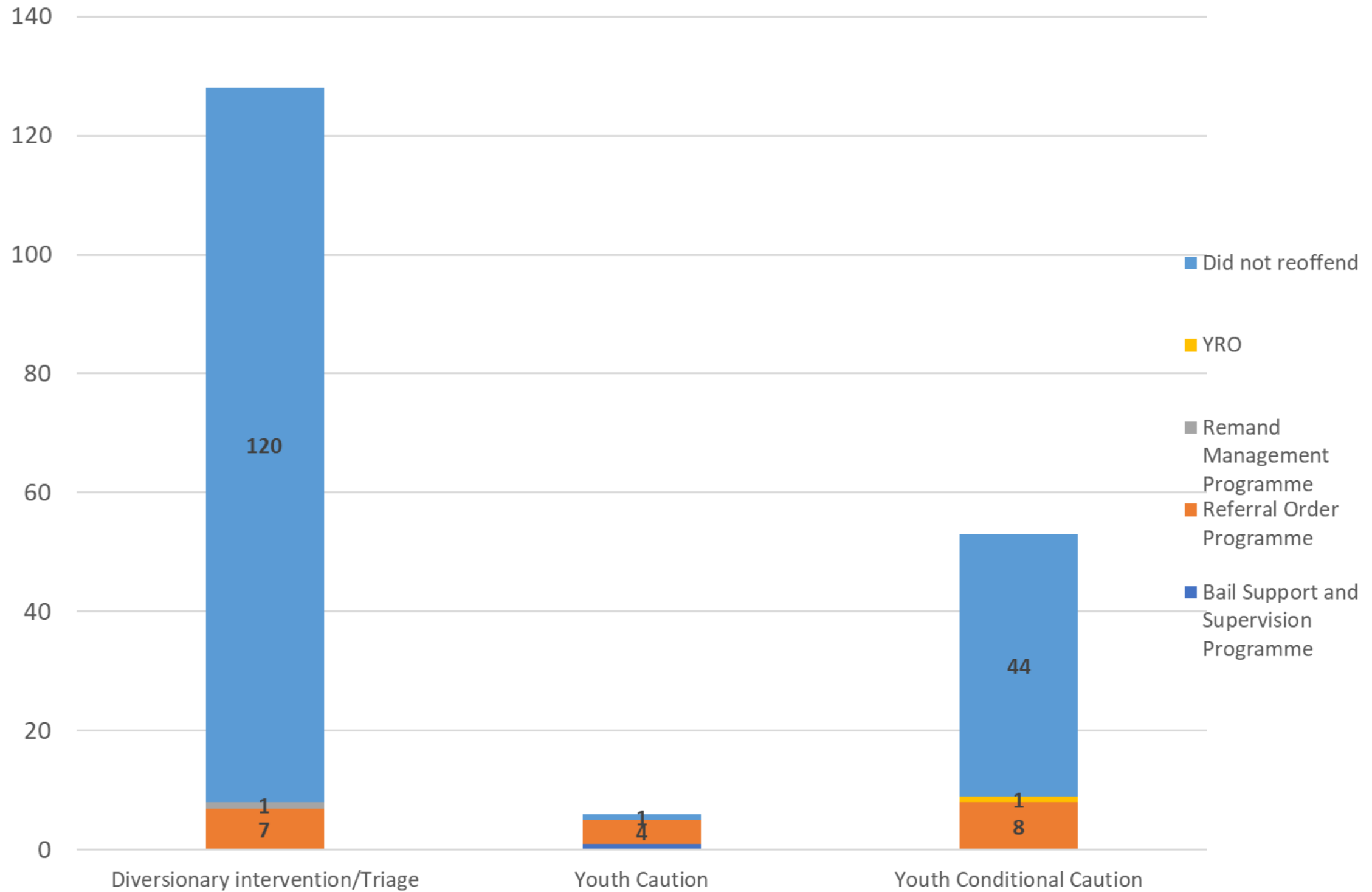
First Time Entrants by Tier (aged 10-17)



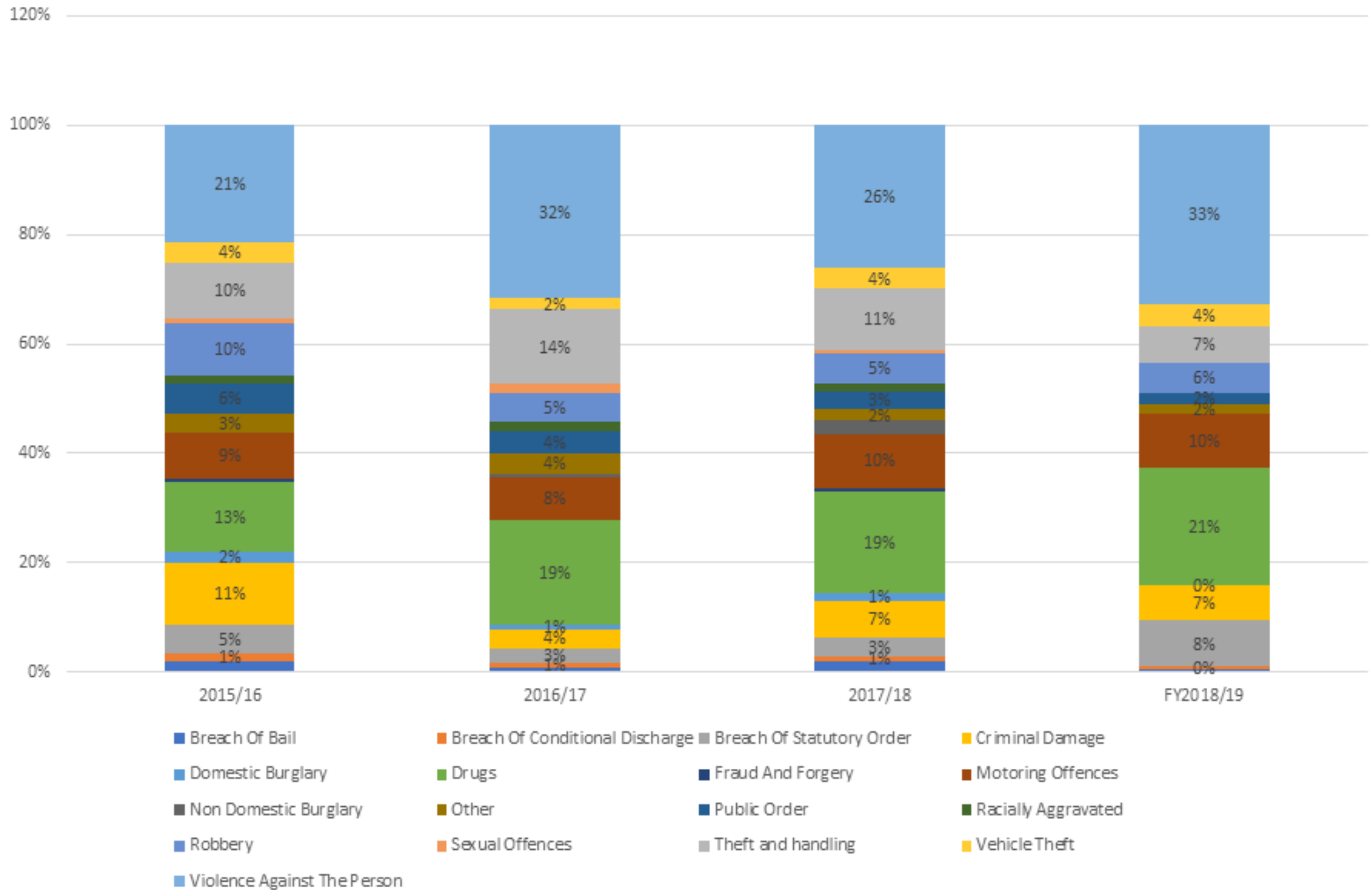
Outcomes following arrest at Colindale Police Station (O OCD)



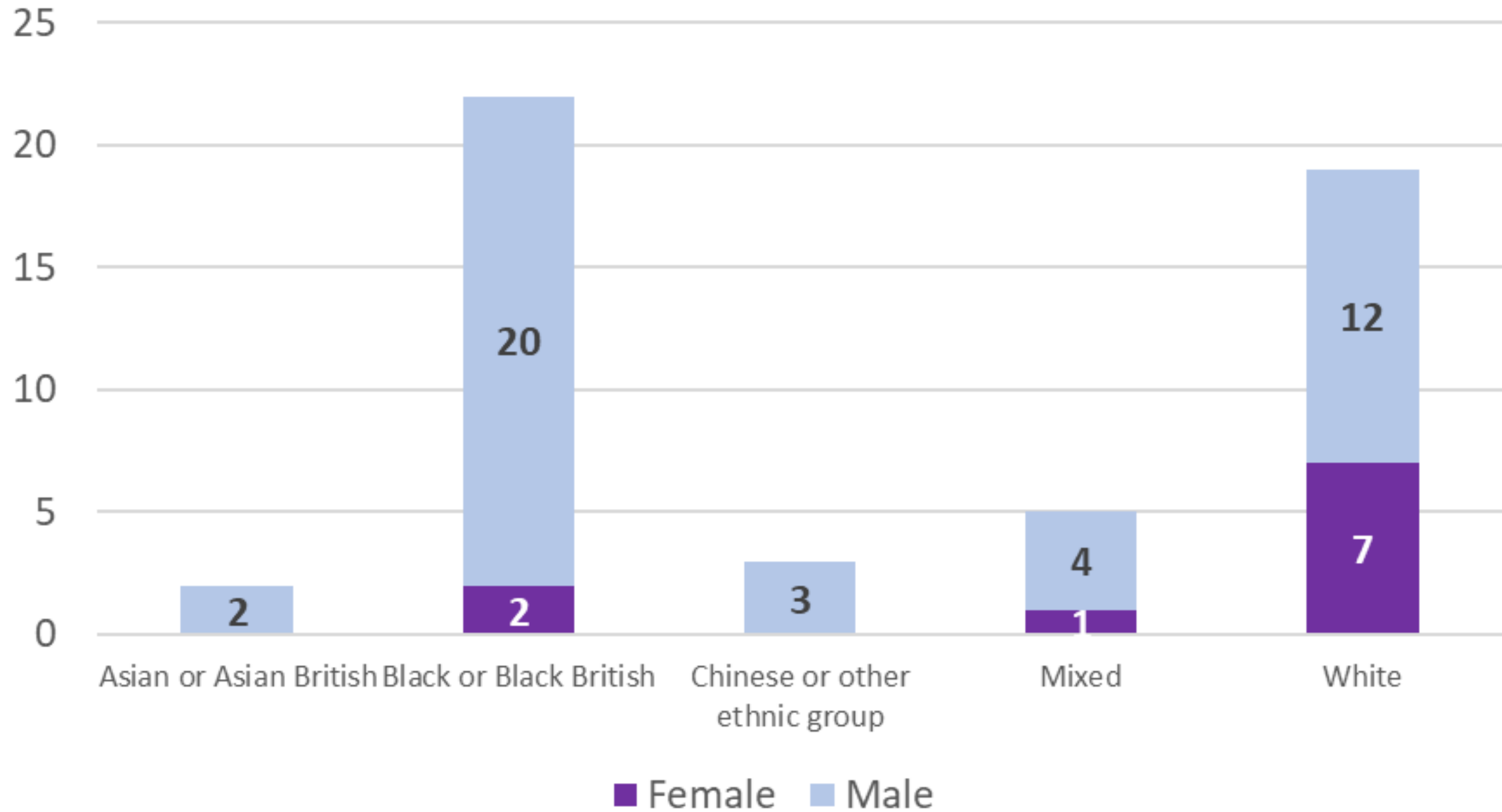
Reoffending following intervention from 0-19 Services



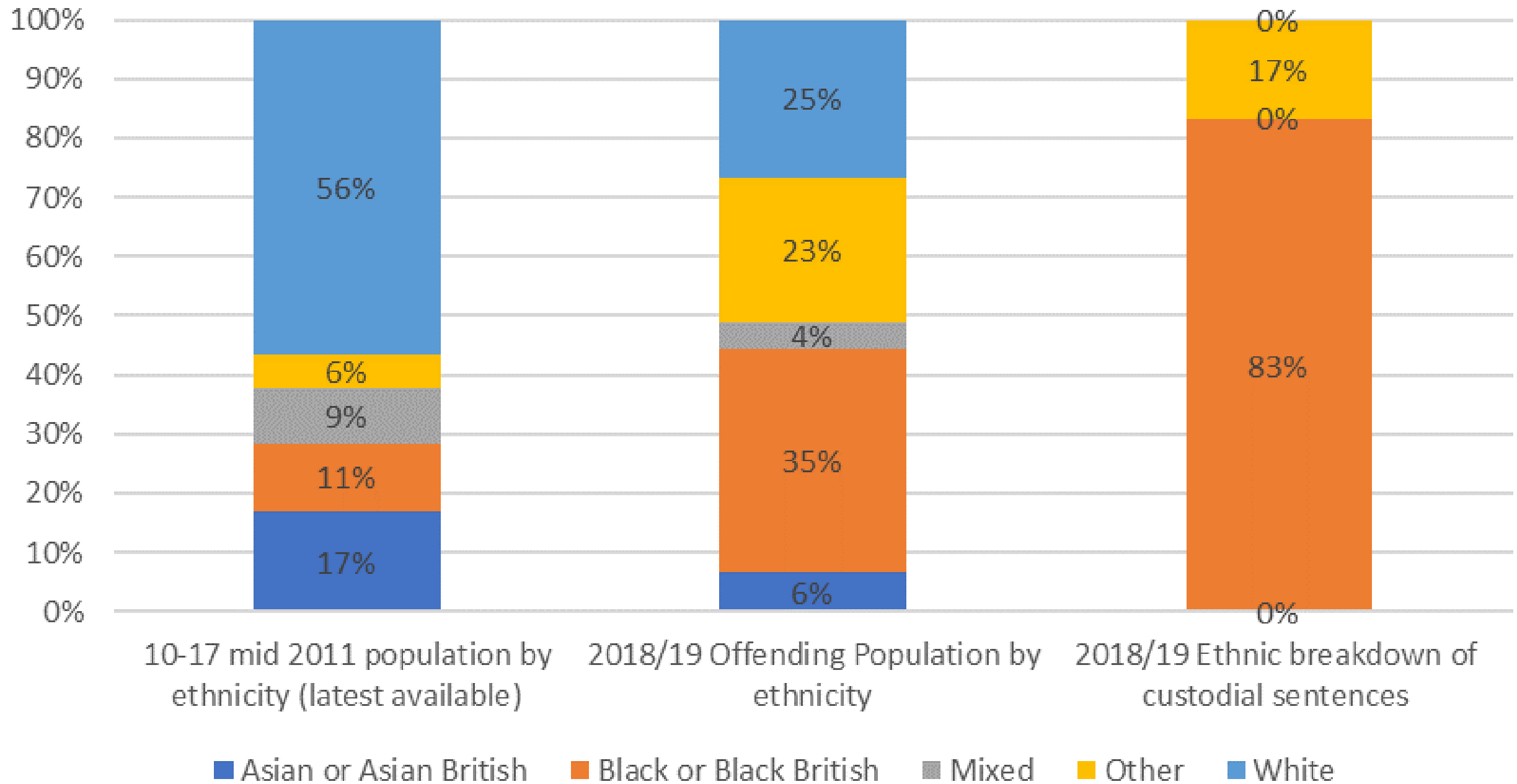
Proportion of offences committed by financial year 2015/16 - 2018/19

Key Themes & Issues

- **YOT caseloads are the lowest they have ever been – the cohort is made up of young people with highly complex needs and who offend more frequently**
- **Over a 10 year period there has been a 60% reduction in young people sentenced to YOT managed orders.**
- **First Time Entrants have seen an increase in May 2019 and is at the highest level since July 2018.**
- **Arrest outcomes evidence higher use of Out of Court Disposals which demonstrate lower re-offending rates over time.**

- **Proportionately, violent offending and drug related offending have been increasing over time.**
- **Black young males are disproportionately represented in the YOT cohort and in custody**
- **79.5% of the YOT cohort are aged 16+**
- **Mental Health Support and Education, Training and Employment opportunities are a key focus for 2019/20**
- **Young Londoners Fund Bid submitted to enable transitional safeguarding of young people aged 16 – 21 years engaged in offending behaviours or at risk of involvement in offending with transition from children’s services and YOT into CRC, NPS and/or adult services**

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
