Qn No	Item No	Raised by	Question Raised	Answer
1	10	Mr Levy	As proposed, Barnet would have the highest minimum charge per 240L Garden Waste binload in the NLWA, being over 3x the mean over the remaining six boroughs if weighted equally. Hackney, Islington and Waltham Forest have no charge. Camden, Haringey both £75 for 52 collections; Enfield £65 for 26 collections. The last three allow residents to share use of Garden Waste bins to split the cost, so in practice more collections can mean savings for many residents. The six-borough mean is 90p per binload, highest £2.50 for Enfield, versus £3.04 minimum for Barnet. Can you fault my calculations?	<p>The calculations appear to be mathematically correct. However, it should be noted that the average of £70 is for the boroughs adjacent to Barnet.</p> <p>If a decision is made to introduce charges for garden waste collections, residents would also be able to share the use of bins in the London Borough of Barnet.</p>
2	10	Maria Accurso	<p>Why the Council have done a u turn on the previous years manifesto of pledging to not charge residents for the green bin as long as the frequency changed from weekly to fortnightly there would be no charge.</p> <p>The Council have now gone back on that pledge that was made to the Borough.</p>
