General points

The following procedure is based on Regulations made by the Secretary of State under the Licensing Act 2003 (“the Hearings Regulations”) which may be viewed or downloaded from the website of the Department for Culture, Media and Sport by following links from www.culture.gov.uk

The procedure is intended as a general framework to ensure natural justice and a fair hearing. The conduct of individual hearings may vary slightly according to circumstances and the discretion of the Chairman. In all cases, however, this general framework will be followed.

The procedure allows each party a maximum period of 5 minutes in which to present their case (Regulations 16 & 24). At the end of the time allowed, the Chairman will terminate the presentation and the hearing will proceed in the form of a discussion led by the authority to explore points of dispute. The discussion will not be timed.

The procedure is subject to periodic review and amendment to reflect best practice and relevant legislative changes. An updated version of this procedure is published as soon as possible following any such amendments.

Governance Officer

- To seek nominations for Chairman
- Elect Chairman
- Hand over to the Chairman

Chairman

- Introduces him/herself and Members of the Committee, and outlines their roles.
- Introduces Licensing, Legal and Governance Officer.
- Explains that Legal and Governance Officers will be present during the Committee’s deliberations to advise only, and that the Licensing Officer will be excluded from deliberations.
- Asks parties present to introduce themselves.
- Outlines procedure to be followed.
- Asks all parties to confirm their understanding of the procedure.
- Clarifies any aspect(s) of the procedure where any parties are uncertain or asks Legal or Governance Officer as appropriate to clarify.

Governance Officer

- Informs Committee of absent parties.
- Details persons whom a party is seeking permission to represent them at hearing.
- Panel confer regarding permission.
- Chairman announces decision regarding permission.

Licensing Officer presents the report to the Committee

- Is a statement of the facts including details of the application and operating schedule, relevant policy details, detail representations made, a chronology of events and highlights the points on which the Authority requires clarification.

Applicant

- Presents opening submissions and clarifies points raised by Authority in notice of hearing. Time allowed 5 mins.

Other parties

- Presents opening submissions either in person or by spokes person Time allowed 5 mins per interested party.

Note regarding use of video evidence

Video evidence must be in DVD format and will form part of the relevant party's five minutes opening submission. Any party wishing to use video evidence must submit a copy to the Authority along with sufficient, identical extra copies to serve on all the opposing parties – i.e. if the applicant is submitting it, there must be enough copies for all parties making representations and if a party making representations is submitting it there must be a copy for the applicant. The recording must be edited down to the highlights, containing only relevant matter which relates to the written representation previously submitted. In addition, a description of how, when and where the video was recorded and what it contains must be submitted. These must be supplied to the Authority at least five working days before the hearing.

Members question Licensing Officer on Policy

Discussion

Chairman leads a discussion concentrating on points of dispute:

Chairman asks Applicant what he disputes in other parties' submissions, and asks other parties to comment.

Chairman proceeds through all objectors dealing with all matters of contention.

When Chairman feels all matters have been thoroughly discussed and all parties have been given a fair and equal opportunity to comment and make representations, she/he closes discussion.

Determination

There are two procedures depending on whether or not determination is to be made at the end of the Hearing or within five working days of the Hearing. This later announcement of determination is permitted in terms of the Legislation for certain types of applications.

Chairman informs all present that the Committee will deliberate, that Legal and Governance Officer will remain to advise but will not be part of decision-making process, and that all others must leave (under Regulation 14).

- Parties, apart from Legal and Governance Officer, leave the room.
- The Committee deliberates, with advice as required from Legal and Governance Officer, and reaches a conclusion. The Legal officer may assist, as required, in formulating the wording of the determination.
- Parties return.

- Chairman reads out determination, and advises it will be sent in writing to all parties.
- Opportunity for determination to be clarified by any interested party who is unclear.
- Chairman gives advice about appealing against the determination.
- Chairman thanks all for attending and closes the meeting.


...Within five working days of the hearing

- Chairman explains requirement to determine the Hearing within five working days, and advises that the Committee will proceed to deliberate and announce the determination within that time.
- During deliberations, Legal and Governance Officers remain to advise on law and procedure as required. The Legal Officer may assist, as required, in formulating the wording of the determination. The Licensing Officer plays no part in the determination and withdraws for this part of the proceedings.
- Chairman advises all parties that they will receive written notification of the determination within five working days of the Hearing date, together with general information on how to appeal against the determination.
- Chairman thanks all parties for attending and invites the applicant, objector(s), other party(ies) and the Licensing Officer to leave.

Information on Appealing against the decision

You may at any time before the expiration of a period of 21 days from notification appeal to Willesden Magistrates' Court, 448 High Road London England NW10 2DZ (Telephone 020 8955 0555, DX 110850 Willesden 2) by way of Complaint for an Order. The Court may either dismiss the appeal, substitute for the decision appealed against any other decision which could have been made by the Licensing Authority or remit the case to the Licensing Authority to dispose of it in accordance with the directions of the court, and can make such order as to costs as it thinks fit.

Summary

This report asks the Sub-Committee to consider an application for a New Premises Licence, under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003

Officers Recommendations

1. This report asks the Sub-Committee to consider an application for a New Premises Licence, under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003 for Nez, 418C Watford Way, NW7 2QJ

1. WHY THIS REPORT IS NEEDED

- 1.1 The licensing authority having received valid representations against the application for a premises licence is expected to hold a hearing to consider those representations. The application can be determined by the licensing authority without a hearing in certain circumstances.

2. REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS

- 2.1 Where a representation is submitted under Section 18 (3) of the Licensing Act 2003 the authority must hold a hearing to consider such representations, unless the representation is withdrawn, the applicant or any party or responsible authority who has made a valid representation agrees or where the authority considers that the representations are frivolous or vexatious.

3. ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED AND NOT RECOMMENDED

- 3.1 The Licensing Sub-Committee is required to give appropriate weight to the representations (including supporting information) presented by all the parties, the Guidance issued pursuant to section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, the Council's statement of licensing policy and the steps that are appropriate to promote the four licensing objectives.

Having considered those relevant matters, the Licensing Sub-Committee is required to take such of the following steps (if any) as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

The steps are—

- (a) To grant the licence subject to—

(i) conditions that are consistent with the operating schedule accompanying the application modified to such extent as the authority considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives, and

(ii) any condition which must under section 19, 20 or 21 of the Licensing Act 2003 be included in the licence;

- (b) to exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
- (c) to refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premises supervisor;
- (d) to reject the application

For the purposes of 3.1(a) (i) above, the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them are altered or omitted or any new conditions added.

1. The Applicants

The application was submitted by Ales Licensing Services on behalf of Hydamin Ltd.

2. Application

The application before the subcommittee was submitted under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003 for an application for a New Premises Licence. The application seeks to allow the following:

Supply of Alcohol - for consumption both on and off the premises

The premises are currently trading as a supermarket and café. Should the committee be minded to grant the application, this will mean the premises will be able to supply alcohol both on and off the premises, to cover sales in the supermarket and the café.

In their application, the agent states the following:-

“The premises will offer both on and off sales. The on sales are very specific, with alcohol only being sold and supplied as a spirit, syrup, or liqueur-based product and served as part of a tea, coffee, milk or juice drink. These drinks will only be served for consumption on the premises, to customers who are seated in the café area”

Off sales of alcohol will be restricted between the hours of 8am and midnight, with the limited offering of on sales taking place between 10am and midnight."

A full copy of the application form and plan can be seen attached to this report in **Annex 1**.

3. Agreement with the Police

During the consultation period, the police have been in contact with the applicant's agent who have agreed that conditions be attached to the application. Should the Sub-committee be minded to grant the application today, these conditions will be shown in Annex 2 of the premises licence.

The following agreed conditions have been attached to the application.

- 1) A CCTV system must be installed and operational at all times when the premises is open to the public. The system will comply with the following:
 - a) The system will incorporate camera(s) covering the entrance door, internal licensed area, serving/till area and any other area used for sale or consumption of alcohol. It must be capable of recording an image which on playback is of a sufficiently high quality to allow accurate identification of the subject matter recorded.
 - b) The system will incorporate a recording facility and any recording will be retained and stored in a suitable and secure format for a minimum of 31 days, and made available for inspection on the lawful and reasonable request of a Police officer, or an authorised officer from the licensing authority. This is subject to compliance with Data Protection Legislation.
 - c) The system must have a suitable facility to export the recorded images to a common format that is easily read by standard devices, e.g. CD/DVD/USB Stick. The system must also have a facility whereby the recordings can be reviewed on a monitor or similar device at the premises.
 - d) The correct date and time must be recorded as part of the image
 - e) If for whatever reason the CCTV system is not operating in accordance with these conditions, both the Police and Council Licensing officers must be immediately informed via email. Details of the problem affecting the CCTV and when this is likely to be fixed must be contained within this email. In these circumstances the temporary suspension of the CCTV condition will be considered and following this a response will be sent by either the Police or Licensing Authority to the premises licence holder.
- 2) All staff directly involved with sale of alcohol on the premises shall receive appropriate training in the legislation and age restricted sales:
 - a) Induction training which must be completed and documented prior to the sale of alcohol by any person at the premises.

b) Refresher training at intervals of no more than 6 months.

A record of this training must be kept at the premises and made available for inspection on the lawful and reasonable request of a police officer or an authorised officer from the licensing authority.

- 3) All refusals of alcohol sales will be recorded in an easily retrievable format and made available for inspection, on reasonable demand by Police Officers or Authorised Officers from the London Borough of Barnet.
- 4) All significant incidents including calls made to the emergency services will be recorded in an easily retrievable format and made available for inspection on reasonable demand by Police Officers or Authorised Officers from the London Borough of Barnet.
- 5) Appropriate and adequate signage will be placed at the entrance and exit of the premises informing customers not to loiter in the area, consume alcohol outside or discard litter.
- 6) External monitoring shall be carried out by the premises licence holder to dissuade customers from causing any issues and the immediate area outside the premises will regularly be cleared of any litter originating from the premises.
- 7) Appropriate measures of Alcoholic syrup, liqueur or spirit will only be sold for consumption on the premises in the café area, as shown on the plans. The alcohol will only be sold as part of a tea, coffee, milk (shake) or fruit/vegetable juice-based drink. No other forms of alcohol will be permitted to be sold for consumption on the premises.
- 8) Drinks containing alcohol, as outlined at condition 7, will only be sold between 10am and midnight on every day, and will only be served to people seated at a table.
- 9) A challenge 25 "proof of age" scheme will be implemented, unless a different "best practice" scheme is requested by the Police or Licensing Authority.

4. Licensing authority mediation

The applicant's agent requested the licensing authority forward on a document, to those that submitted representations, addressing concerns raised within the representations received in relation to their client's case. The document forwarded on behalf of the applicant's agent can be found attached in this report in **Annex 3**.

5. Representations

The Licensing Team have received 2 valid representations from local ward Councillors. The Councillor's representations relate to public nuisance in terms of the hours applied for.

In addition, we received 151 valid representations from members of the public. Their concerns surround public nuisance, protection of children from harm and public safety.

The representations can be seen attached to this report in **Annex 4**.

6. Policy and Guidance

London Borough of Barnet Licensing Policy

5.1 When exercising its licensing functions, the Licensing Authority will not be influenced by the question of need. The question of whether or not there is a need for any particular premises is a commercial matter which is not relevant to the Licensing Authority's considerations. The issue of need may be a matter for planning consideration or for the market to decide and does not form part of this licensing policy statement.

Guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003

In relation to the Amended guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act section 9.34 In determining the application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives in the overall interests of the local community, the licensing authority must give appropriate weight to:

- the steps that are appropriate to promote the licensing objectives.
- the representations (including supporting information) presented by all the parties.
- the Guidance of the licensing Act 2003.
- its own statement of licensing policy.

7. Attaching conditions

The operating schedule, which is part of the application, includes certain additional steps that the applicant will take to protect the licensing objectives. These will become enforceable conditions, should the licence be granted. Additional conditions may be attached to the licence if the committee thinks it appropriate.

The Committee must have regard to all of the representations made and the evidence it hears, and is asked to note that it may not attach conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be appropriate in order to promote the licensing objectives.

In relation to conditions, the statutory guidance at chapter 10.8 states that “The licensing authority may not impose any conditions unless its discretion has been engaged following receipt of relevant representations and it is satisfied as a result of a hearing (unless all parties agree a hearing is not necessary) that it is appropriate to impose conditions to promote one or more of the four licensing objectives.

Full Copies of the Councils Statement of Licensing Policy, the Statutory Guidance to the Act and the Council’s Guide to Good Practice at Licensed Premises will be available at the Licensing Sub Committee hearing or in advance if required.

The premises are currently open between 7:30 am and midnight. These times will initially continue if the licence is granted. However the business plans also incorporates a 24 hour operation for activity that doesn't require an authorisation. Off sales of alcohol will be restricted between the hours of 8am and midnight, with the limited offering of on sales taking place between 10am and midnight.

It is not anticipated that any significant quantities of alcohol will be sold for consumption on the premises, and due to the conditions restricting such sales, and that alcohol is only an accompaniment added to a specific drink. It is highly unlikely that any of the licensing objectives will be compromised.

High value alcohol including all spirits will be kept behind the checkout counter/till to the front left as you enter the premises, including most of the wine selection. Certain alcoholic beverages will be placed in one of the chiller units a sufficient distance away from the entrance, and in a position that is fully covered by at least one of the cameras in the multi camera CCTV system. This chiller can be closed with a screen shutter at times when off sales are not permitted, and suitable notices will be displayed to explain this to customers.

The late night refreshment will initially only be between 11pm and midnight, although future plans allow for the operation to be a 24 hour one, and they would like the flexibility to primarily sell hot drinks, and a few reheated food offerings. These are restricted to the cafe area, and after midnight will only be available for take away. This is not going to be a fully blown take away section as there is no commercial kitchen or suitable preparation area for this, and it is not the intention of the applicant to run such an operation.

NOTES ON DEMONSTRATING ENTITLEMENT TO WORK IN THE UK

Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this in one of two ways: 1) by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the documents listed below (which do not need to be certified), or 2) by providing their 'share code' to enable the licensing authority to carry out a check using the Home Office online right to work checking service (see below).

- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.

- A **current** passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A **current** Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A **current** Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or residence.
- A **current** Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, **less than 6 months old**, issued by the Home Office under regulation 18(3) or 20(2) of the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2016, to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in the UK including:-
 - evidence of the applicant's own identity – such as a passport,
 - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member – e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
 - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:
 - (i) working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer,
 - (ii) self-employed e.g. contracts, invoices, or audited accounts with a bank,
 - (iii) studying e.g. letter from the school, college or university and evidence of sufficient funds; or
 - (iv) self-sufficient e.g. bank statements.

Family members of European Economic Area nationals who are studying or financially independent must also provide evidence that the European Economic Area national and any family members hold comprehensive sickness insurance in the UK. This can include a private medical insurance policy, an EHIC card or an S1, S2 or S3 form.

Original documents must not be sent to licensing authorities. If the document copied is a passport, a copy of the following pages should be provided:-

We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.

Home Office online right to work checking service

As an alternative to providing a copy of the documents listed above, applicants may demonstrate their right to work by allowing the licensing authority to carry out a check with the Home Office online right to work checking service.

- **Films:** no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- **Indoor sporting events:** no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- **Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment:** no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
- **Live music:** no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- **Recorded Music:** no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.



We are a family run business and also live in the London Borough of Barnet. It is not our intention to allow the local area to become a crime hot spot, or attract people to our premises who act other than in a considerate and polite way to local residents.

Our application for a new premises licence has attracted a number of representation's (objections) Unfortunately some of the objections are based on points about the hours and activities that are not correct.

We hope that the following information will be of assistance to you, and set the record straight. The information sets out the facts of the application, how we intend to operate the premises, and the conditions we have asked to be attached to the licence to ensure that the 4 licensing objectives are fully promoted.

We hope that after reading this you will consider withdrawing your representation and communicate this to the Licensing Team.

If you have any questions, or require additional information, please email or ring our licensing consultant Mark Altman, his contact details are contained in the footer.

It is very important to note that even if this application was refused, no licence, or other permission, is required for these premises to operate 24 hours a day e.g. for sale of general supermarket goods.

Whilst we are currently not open later than midnight, our business model does incorporate an option to do this at a later stage. Before doing so we have taken the decision to close no later than midnight, until we have had the opportunity to assess the dynamics and viability of operating the extended hours.

More importantly the licensable activity we have requested does not allow alcohol to be sold for consumption, on, or off, the premises after midnight.

Licensable Activity on every day:

- 1) Off sales of alcohol between 8am & midnight.
- 2) Specific limited on sales of alcohol, only in the café area, between 10am and midnight (see conditions 7 & 8)
- 3) Late-Night Refreshment between 11pm and 5am the following day. No one may be seated in the premises to consume hot food or drink, and we do not have a kitchen, so the products will mainly be hot drinks and possibly some re-heated (microwave) food

Information provided to the Police - Operating schedule – Description

Family owned and run specialist supermarket with separate areas comprising of a butchers' shop and café.

The premises will offer both on and off sales. The on sales are very specific, with alcohol only being sold and supplied as a spirit, syrup, or liqueur-based product and served as part of a tea, coffee, milk or juice drink. These drinks will only be served for consumption on the premises, to customers who are seated in the café area as shown by a blue boundary on the plans.

The premises are currently open between 7:30 am and midnight. These times will initially continue if the licence is granted. However, the business plans also incorporate a 24-hour operation for activity that doesn't require an authorisation.

Off sales of alcohol will be restricted between the hours of 8am and midnight, with the limited offering of on sales taking place between 10am and midnight.

I am really concerned that there could be a high possibility that alcoholics will gather under the underpass on a daily basis which ultimately affects the safety of these pupil and other individuals. In addition to this, the increase of alcohol sales will unquestionably lead to an increase into broken glass along the pedestrian paths which poses a significant hazard to the members of the public and not to mention possible nuisances during the night affecting the local neighbourhood.

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



The applicant proposes to allow:

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

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



The applicant proposes to allow:

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Granting a licence would provide a further source of alcohol within an area already so heavily populated with licensed premises, there are already 10 premises which obtain a premises licence within a 1-mile radius. Resulting into crime, disorder and public nuisance have already reached problematic levels for the local police.

Residents in this area already suffer noise nuisance and antisocial behaviour at all hours of the day and night. They have endured this inconvenience since 2003 when the licensing legislation was first amended, and it is totally unacceptable to expect them to continue to do so

Introduction

The applicant has consulted with the expert and professional bodies who ensure that the licensing objectives are upheld by licensed premises.

They have also sought to reach out to everyone who has submitted a representation, and offered the opportunity of a meeting to further explain the business model. The 3 ward councillors have similarly been contacted by email and asked for their views, comments and suggestions. The licensing consultant acting in this matter provided contact details for anyone wishing to obtain additional information or ask any questions. Up to the current date no response has been received from any party.

No representations have been received from any of the responsible authorities, in particular the police who are the experts on crime and disorder, and the council's own departments, Safeguarding Children Board, Health and Safety Team, Nuisance Team, Trading standards and the Licensing team. All of these bodies are experts in their own field, who advise and guide the council.

None of them have raised any concerns or evidence, with regard to the applicant and application, to suggest that it is likely that granting the application would increase the risk to; children and young persons, safety, noise nuisance, sale of illegal goods, or any other person due to the licensable activity.

It is highly unlikely that this family run business would do anything other than fully promote the 4 licensing objectives. It will certainly be an asset to the area, and a vast improvement on what was a run down and unsightly vacant site.

Rebuttal of representations and concern re the submission and relevance of them

Mr Patel has orchestrated a thoroughly unpleasant and vexatious business campaign against the applicant and their application. Mr Patel:

- Produced and delivered a letter encouraging people to make objections against the application (**Appendix 'A'**)
- Encouraged residents and his customers to sign the pre written forms which were attached to the letter and apparently pushed for customers to sign these whenever they were in the store (**Appendix 'B'**) and
- Produced an identically worded document to the first one with a supplementary document attached and headed with the words "Petition" (**Appendix 'C'**).
- Offered to deliver the completed documents himself to the council. It appears that this was the case with most of them.

Trade based objections are irrelevant for the purpose of the licensing act 2003. The content of virtually every objection is identical and they all reference "the need" for additional premises. As you are aware "need" is not a relevant matter for the licensing act 2003, and is clearly explained in Barnet's Statement of Licensing Policy, and the statutory guidance at sect 182 of the Licensing Act 2003.

None of the objectors have outlined what they feel would resolve or reduce their concerns, as per Barnet's statement of licensing policy at paragraph 12.15.

We have also not received a single reply to the explanation letter, that was kindly sent out by the council to every named person.

A number of them have also withdrawn their objections, whilst others have confirmed that they will not be attending the hearing.

We have grave concerns regarding the authenticity of the representations, and that many of these may well have been signed without the signatory realising the full content of the pre written response.

We respectfully request that the officer presenting the information for the hearing includes the number of people who responded to the council's letter, as this would be a reasonable indication of the amount of genuine representations.

You will also note that some of the addresses are shown in Boroughs outside of Barnet e.g. Uxendon Hill HA9 which is in Brent near Wembley stadium.

In all of my 25 years dealing with both the previous licensing act, and the current one. I have never seen a campaign driven by a single person, where all of the responses use the same forms written by that person, and lack any different wording, or reasons for objecting to the application.

We ask that the licensing committee carefully scrutinise this and give due consideration to them being mainly irrelevant, vexatious, lacking in any evidence, and effectively a trade-based objection. One that is principally concerned with "need", and disguised by Mr Patel to appear as genuine representations.

As such we respectfully request that the licensing sub-committee attach no weight to them in reaching their decision.

Rebuttal and Comments re the Representations

Appendix 'A' Information provided to Mr Patel's Customers

This document clearly demonstrates that Mr Patel's campaign and the wording he has provided for the pre written objections is entirely based on the irrelevant (illegal) grounds of a "trade objection" He uses the phrases:

- a) if the above application is granted it would be extremely detrimental to our business
- b) we are seeking the help of the local community
- c) we request your help and assistance to oppose this application
- d) to make the process of application easier we have enclosed a draft template letter
- e) bring it to my shop by the 15th September and I will then send all of the signed copies to the licensing committee

Appendix 'B' (petition)

We respectfully request that the licensing sub committee strikes all of the information detailed in these documents as irrelevant.

None of it has any relevance for the licensing act 2003. The content is purely trade based, and with reference to need for another premises. Neither of which carry any weight in the licensing sub committee's determination.

Appendix 'C' pre written objection provided by Mr Patel

For ease of reference we have broken this down into 6 paragraphs which will be addressed below:

- 1) Introduction/outline of application – we have no comments regarding this
- 2) Introduction/outline of application – we have no comments regarding this
- 3) Introduction/outline of application – we have no comments regarding this
- 4) It is not a matter for the licensing act to address, limiting or setting targets for the number of premises permitted to sell alcohol in a particular area. If this was indeed a particular issue in the ward it would have been included as part of a cumulative impact area. There is no data to support such an area for this ward.
The case for "need" and the number and type of premises is a matter for planning. No evidence has been provided by Mr Patel or any of the other objectors that these premises would increase, crime, disorder or public nuisance. If these are at problematic levels, then they must be caused by the premises currently selling alcohol in the area, including Mr Patel's own shop. However, during my communications with the Police, they are unaware of these issues and have no data to support this. Barnet Councils own analysis on "*alcohol-related ambulance call outs*" confirms that the Mill Hill ward is the 2nd lowest out of the 21 wards, returning a figure of 7.5 cases per 10,000 head of population.
Barnet as a Borough had the 2nd lowest crime rates for Violence, sexual offences and Drugs out of all the 32 London Boroughs (year to June 2019) Mill Hill is also amongst one of the safest wards in Barnet for all crimes. There are also no recent incidents, actions or operations in relation to alcohol related crime and disorder or children being at risk due to licensed premises, recorded on the Police Safer Neighbourhood Team site. This alone would discount the allegations and fears contained in this paragraph. There is certainly no evidence, or likelihood that granting a licence to these premises is more likely than not to change this.
- 5) As per the information above, there is no evidence to support that this ward suffers from higher levels of noise nuisance and anti-social behaviour, or that it has been occurring since 2003 and has been caused by the 2003 Licensing Act. This act didn't come into effect until the

24th November 2005. I was certainly not aware of any issues or increase in the incidents complained of. As stated in bullet point 4, even if the issues complained of were facts, they would currently be happening and have a causal link to the all licensed premises, of which Mr Patel's shop is one of them.

- 6) The presence of 2 girl's schools in the nearby area is not a matter for the licensing sub committee to consider. The safeguarding children from harm team have not flagged any issues in relation to this application or the applicant, and no evidence has been provided that the applicant, or indeed the premises, present any threat to children or anyone else's safety.

Similarly, there is absolutely no evidence or reasonable cause that; alcohol sales will increase if a premises licence is granted, alcoholics will gather in the underpass, or incidents of broken glass will increase.

With regard to public nuisance during the night, this is a matter covered by the operating schedule, the conditions volunteered, and the professionalism of the operator. It is highly unlikely that these premises will cause any issues.

The request made by all of the representations is exactly the same, that the licensing authority should refuse the application. Ordinarily, and in all similar applications I have ever seen, a reasonable and proportionate request is made. It is inconceivable that virtually every single representation makes exactly the same request, with none of them outlining what they feel would resolve or reduce their concerns. This is shown as good practice and set out in Barnet's Statement of Licensing Policy at paragraph 12.15

Legislation – Guidance – Barnet’s SLP – Regulation’s

Sect 182 Guidance April 2018

Each application on its own merits

1.17 Each application must be considered on its own merits and in accordance with the licensing authority’s statement of licensing policy; for example, if the application falls within the scope of a cumulative impact policy. Conditions attached to licences and certificates must be tailored to the individual type, location and characteristics of the premises and events concerned. This is essential to avoid the imposition of disproportionate and overly burdensome conditions on premises where there is no need for such conditions. Standardised conditions should be avoided and indeed may be unlawful where they cannot be shown to be appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives in an individual case.

Relevant, vexatious and frivolous representations

9.4 A representation is “relevant” if it relates to the likely effect of the grant of the licence on the promotion of at least one of the licensing objectives. For example, a representation from a local businessperson about the commercial damage caused by competition from new licensed premises would not be relevant. On the other hand, a representation by a business person that nuisance caused by new premises would deter customers from entering the local area, and the steps proposed by the applicant to prevent that nuisance were inadequate, would be relevant. In other words, representations should relate to the impact of licensable activities carried on from premises on the objectives. For representations in relation to variations to be relevant, they should be confined to the subject matter of the variation. There is no requirement for a responsible authority or other person to produce a recorded history of problems at premises to support their representations, and in fact this would not be possible for new premises.

9.5 It is for the licensing authority to determine whether a representation (other than a representation from responsible authority) is frivolous or vexatious on the basis of what might ordinarily be considered to be vexatious or frivolous. A representation may be considered to be vexatious if it appears to be intended to cause aggravation or annoyance, whether to a competitor or other person, without reasonable cause or justification. Vexatious circumstances may arise because of disputes between rival businesses and local knowledge will therefore be invaluable in considering such matters. Licensing authorities can consider the main effect of the representation, and whether any inconvenience or expense caused by it could reasonably be considered to be proportionate.

9.6 Frivolous representations would be essentially categorised by a lack of seriousness. Frivolous representations would concern issues which, at most, are minor and in relation to which no remedial steps would be warranted or proportionate.

9.12 Each responsible authority will be an expert in their respective field, and in some cases it is likely that a particular responsible authority will be the licensing authority’s main source of advice in relation to a particular licensing objective. For example, the police have a key role in managing the night-time economy and should have good working relationships with those operating in their local area. The police should usually therefore be the licensing authority’s main source of advice on matters relating to the promotion of the crime and disorder licensing objective. However, any responsible authority under the 2003 Act may make representations with regard to any of the licensing objectives if they have evidence to support such representations. Licensing authorities must therefore consider all relevant representations

from responsible authorities carefully, even where the reason for a particular responsible authority's interest or expertise in the promotion of a particular objective may not be immediately apparent. However, it remains incumbent on all responsible authorities to ensure that their representations can withstand the scrutiny to which they would be subject at a hearing.

9.14 Licensing authorities are not expected to act as responsible authorities on behalf of other parties (for example, local residents, local councillors or community groups) although there are occasions where the authority may decide to do so. Such parties can make relevant representations to the licensing authority in their own right, and it is reasonable for the licensing authority to expect them to make representations themselves where they are reasonably able to do so. However, if these parties have failed to take action and the licensing authority is aware of relevant grounds to make a representation, it may choose to act in its capacity as responsible authority.

9.15 It is also reasonable for licensing authorities to expect that other responsible authorities should intervene where the basis for the intervention falls within the remit of that other responsible authority. For example, the police should make representations where the representations are based on concerns about crime and disorder. Likewise, it is reasonable to expect the local authority exercising environmental health functions to make representations where there are concerns about noise nuisance. Each responsible authority has equal standing under the 2003 Act and may act independently without waiting for representations from any other responsible authority.

Disclosure of personal details of persons making representations

9.26 Where a notice of a hearing is given to an applicant, the licensing authority is required under the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005 to provide the applicant with copies of the relevant representations that have been made.

9.27 In exceptional circumstances, persons making representations to the licensing authority may be reluctant to do so because of fears of intimidation or violence if their personal details, such as name and address, are divulged to the applicant.

9.28 Where licensing authorities consider that the person has a genuine and well-founded fear of intimidation and may be deterred from making a representation on this basis, they may wish to consider alternative approaches.

9.29 For instance, they could advise the persons to provide the relevant responsible authority with details of how they consider that the licensing objectives are being undermined so that the responsible authority can make representations if appropriate and justified.

9.30 The licensing authority may also decide to withhold some or all of the person's personal details from the applicant, giving only minimal details (such as street name or general location within a street). However, withholding such details should only be considered where the circumstances justify such action.

Hours of trading

10.14 Where there are objections to an application to extend the hours during which licensable activities are to be carried on and the licensing authority determines that this would undermine the licensing objectives, it may reject the application or grant it with appropriate conditions and/or different hours from those requested.

10.15 Shops, stores and supermarkets should normally be free to provide sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises at any times when the retail outlet is open for shopping unless there are good reasons, based on the licensing objectives, for restricting those hours.

The need for licensed premises

14.19 There can be confusion about the difference between the “need” for premises and the “cumulative impact” of premises on the licensing objectives, for example, on crime and disorder. “Need” concerns the commercial demand for another pub or restaurant or hotel and is a matter for the planning authority and for the market. This is not a matter for a licensing authority in discharging its licensing functions or for its statement of licensing policy.

Licensing hours

14.51 With regard to licensing hours, the Government acknowledges that different licensing approaches may be appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives in different areas. The 2003 Act gives the licensing authority power to make decisions regarding licensed opening hours as part of the implementation of its licensing policy statement and licensing authorities are best placed to make such decisions based on their local knowledge and in consultation with other responsible authorities. However, licensing authorities must always consider each application and must not impose predetermined licensed opening hours, without giving individual consideration to the merits of each application.

14.52 Statements of licensing policy should set out the licensing authority’s approach regarding licensed opening hours and the strategy it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives in its area. The statement of licensing policy should emphasise the consideration which will be given to the individual merits of an application. The Government recognises that licensed premises make an important contribution to our local communities, and has given councils a range of tools to effectively manage the different pressures that licensed premises can bring. In determining appropriate strategies around licensed opening hours, licensing authorities cannot seek to restrict the activities of licensed premises where it is not appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives to do so.

STATEMENT OF LICENSING POLICY - LONDON BOROUGH OF BARNET January 2020

5. Approach to licensing applications

5.1 When exercising its licensing functions the Licensing Authority will not be influenced by the question of need. **The question of whether or not there is a need for any particular premises is a commercial matter which is not relevant to the Licensing Authority's considerations**. The issue of need may be a matter for planning consideration or for the market to decide and does not form part of this licensing policy statement.

4. Fundamental Principles

4.5 In determining a licence application the overriding principle will be that each application will be determined on its individual merits.

4.6 Nothing in the Licensing Policy will:

- Undermine the rights of any person to apply the 2003 Act for a variety of permissions and have the application considered on its individual merits.
- Override the right of any person to make representations on any application or seek a review of a licence or certificate where they are permitted to do so under the Act.

4.7 The decision taken by the Licensing Authority will be focused on matters that are within the control of the individual licensees and others granted relevant permissions. Accordingly, these matters will centre on the premises and places being used for licensable activities and the vicinity of those premises and places. The Licensing Authority will focus on the direct impact of activities taking place at the licensed premises on both adults and children living in, working in or visiting the area concerned.

4.8 In taking its decisions, the Licensing Authority will take into account that licensing law is not the primary mechanism for the control of anti-social behaviour once individuals are beyond the direct control of the premises concerned. Nonetheless, licensing law will be part of a holistic approach to the management of the evening and night-time economy in town and city centres

4.9 Licence conditions imposed will be relevant to the individual application and appropriate to meet the licensing objectives. Licence conditions will not be imposed where other regulatory regimes, such as fire safety legislation, provide sufficient protection for patrons and other members of the public.

4.14 Appropriate weight is given to all relevant representations made to the Licensing Authority. This does not include those representations which are considered to be frivolous, vexatious or repetitious, which will be disregarded.

5. Approach to licensing applications

5.1 When exercising its licensing functions the Licensing Authority will not be influenced by the question of need. **The question of whether or not there is a need for any particular premises is a commercial matter which is not relevant to the Licensing Authority's considerations**. The issue of need may be a matter for planning consideration or for the market to decide and does not form part of this licensing policy statement.

12. Representations

12.1 Representations should be made in writing to the licensing authority. The interested party must ensure they include their name, address and contact details. Please be aware that the Licensing Act 2003 requires all parties that wish to make a representation against an application ensure that their name and addresses are included in the representation to make it valid.

12.2 **The name and address is required so that the Licensing Authority and the applicant or their representation can validate that the person making the**

representation is qualified to do so in terms of living or working in the vicinity of the premises concerned.

12.3 In exceptional cases an interested party can request the Licensing Authority to withhold their details, in any event the original letter must contain the information required.

12.4 All representations will be available in the public domain and some will be contained in reports that will be able to be viewed on the website.

12.5 All representations must be about the likely effect of granting the licence or certificate on the promotion of at least one of the four licensing objectives. It would be wise, therefore, to explicitly link any representation to one or more of the objectives.

12.6 It will also assist if the representations are specific to the premises and evidence based. Interested parties may, therefore wish to talk to the relevant responsible authority beforehand, or document problems themselves by, for example, keeping a diary or photographic evidence of any incidents.

12.7 The Licensing Authority will need to be satisfied that there is an evidential and causal link between the representations made, and the effect on the licensing objectives.

12.8 In addition, the Licensing Authority can only consider representations that are not “vexatious” or “frivolous”. Whether representations are frivolous or vexatious will be for the Licensing Authority to determine. For example, the Licensing Authority might find the representations were vexatious if they arise because of disputes between rival businesses or they might be frivolous representations if they plainly lacked seriousness.

12.9 It is also important that an applicant is able to respond to a representation, for example, if they believe that it is not a “relevant” representation. If interested parties are concerned about possible intimidation, they could consider asking the appropriate responsible authority to make a representation on their behalf.

12.10 If no relevant representations are made, the licence or variation must be granted, therefore interested party representations are very important.

12.11 It may be beneficial for those wishing to make a representation to get the backing of other people living, or businesses operating in the vicinity of the premises.

Note 12.12 is apparently missing from the policy (Typo ?)

12.13 If any party is considering raising a petition, it is important to ensure that the Licensing Authority can determine whether all the signatories are within the ‘vicinity’ of the premises. So, including addresses and indicating clearly what representation(s) they are all making is essential.

12.14 If interested parties want to ask another person, such as an MP or local Councillor to represent them, it is advisable to make such a request in writing so that the individual can demonstrate he or she was asked.

12.15 Representees should address how they would like the situation to be rectified. The Licensing Authority often has to balance conflicting needs when determine licensing applications, it is beneficial for representees to outline what they feel would resolve or reduce their concerns.

14. Integrating strategies & avoiding duplication

14.1 The Licensing Authority recognises the need to avoid, so far as possible, duplication of the existing legislation and other mechanisms to deal with any environmental or other impacts on the leisure economy such as:

- Planning controls
- Positive measures to create a safe and clean town centre environment
- Powers of the Licensing Authority to designate public places where the consumption of alcohol is not permitted
- Police enforcement of disorder and anti-social behaviour
- Prosecuting of personal licence holders and staff selling alcohol to those underage.

- Police and the Licensing Authority's powers to close down instantly any licence premises on the ground of disorder or likely to cause disorder or excessive noise emanating from the premises
- Environmental Protection Act 1990
- Children Act 1989
- Health and Safety at Work Act 1974 etc.
- Powers of the police/local residents/businesses ability to seek a review of a licence.

14.2 The Licensing Authority recognises that there should be a clear separation of the planning and licensing regimes in respect of applications to avoid duplication or a re-run of the planning application process but also recognises that some factors affecting the planning decision may also affect the decision of the Licensing Committee.

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Licensing Act 2003

18 Determination of application for premises licence

(1) This section applies where the relevant licensing authority—

(a) receives an application for a premises licence made in accordance with section 17, and
(b) is satisfied that the applicant has complied with any requirement imposed on him under subsection (5) of that section.

(2) Subject to subsection (3), the authority must grant the licence in accordance with the application subject only to—

(a) such conditions as are consistent with the operating schedule accompanying the application, and
(b) any conditions which must under section 19, 20 or 21 be included in the licence.

(3) Where relevant representations are made, the authority must—

(a) hold a hearing to consider them, unless the authority, the applicant and each person who has made such representations agree that a hearing is unnecessary, and
(b) having regard to the representations, take such of the steps mentioned in subsection (4) (if any) as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

(4) The steps are—

(a) to grant the licence subject to—

(i) the conditions mentioned in subsection (2)(a) modified to such extent as the authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives, and
(ii) any condition which must under section 19, 20 or 21 be included in the licence;
(b) to exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;

(c) to refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premises supervisor;

(d) to reject the application.

(5) For the purposes of subsection (4)(a)(i) the conditions mentioned in subsection

(2)(a) are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added.

(6) For the purposes of this section, “relevant representations” means representations which—

(a) are about the likely effect of the grant of the premises licence on the promotion of the licensing objectives,

(b) meet the requirements of subsection (7),

(c) if they relate to the identity of the person named in the application as the proposed premises supervisor, meet the requirements of subsection (9), and

(d) are not excluded representations by virtue of section 32 (restriction on making representations following issue of provisional statement).

(7) The requirements of this subsection are—

(a) that the representations were made by an interested party or responsible authority within the period prescribed under section 17(5)(c),

(b) that they have not been withdrawn, and

(c) in the case of representations made by an interested party (who is not also a responsible authority), that they are not, in the opinion of the relevant licensing authority, frivolous or vexatious.

(8) Where the authority determines for the purposes of subsection (7)(c) that any representations are frivolous or vexatious, it must notify the person who made them of the reasons for its determination.

(9) The requirements of this subsection are that the representations—

(a) were made by a chief officer of police for a police area in which the premises are situated, and

(b) include a statement that, due to the exceptional circumstances of the case, he is satisfied that the designation of the person concerned as the premises supervisor under the premises licence would undermine the crime prevention objective.

(10) In discharging its duty under subsection (2) or (3)(b), a licensing authority may grant a licence under this section subject to different conditions in respect of—

(a) different parts of the premises concerned;

(b) different licensable activities.

LICENCES AND LICENSING

The Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005

19. The authority shall disregard any information given by a party or any person to whom permission to appear at the hearing is given by the authority which is not relevant to—
(a) their application, representations or notice (as applicable) or in the case of another person, the application representations or notice of the party requesting their appearance, and
(b) the promotion of the licensing objectives or, in relation to a hearing to consider a notice given by a chief officer of police, the crime prevention objective.


There are also ten additional retail outlets within a one-mile radius which clearly indicates there is no need for another.

- (1) I am writing to register my objection to the application for a premises licence by **Nez. 418C Watford Way, Mill Hill, London, NW7 2QJ**. The basis for this opposition is that granting a licence for these premises will not promote the licencing objectives, particularly the prevention of crime, disorder and antisocial behaviour.
- (2) The applicant proposes to allow:
 - (3) **A) The provision of late night refreshment (indoor only) from 23.00 hours until 05.00 hours Monday -- Sunday.**
 - B) Sale or supply of alcohol (both on and off the premises) from 08.00 hours until 00.00 hours Monday -- Sunday.**
- (4) Granting a licence would provide a further source of alcohol within an area already so heavily populated with licenced premises, there are already 10 premises which have obtained a license within a 1-mile radius. Resulting in crime, disorder and public nuisance which have already reached problematic levels for the local police.
- (5) Residents in this area already suffer noise nuisance and antisocial behaviour at all hours of the day and night. They have endured this inconvenience since 2003 when the licensing legislation was first amended, and it is totally unacceptable to expect them to continue to do so.
- (6) There are also two schools which are a short distance away from this premises, both girl's schools have to pass this premises to on their daily commute, to catch a bus which is also followed by walking beneath the underpass on five-ways corner in order to catch the bus on the other side of the road going towards Edgware. I am really concerned that there could be a high possibility that alcoholics will gather under the underpass on a daily basis which ultimately affects the safety of these pupil and other individuals. In addition to this, the increase of alcohol sales will unquestionably lead to an increase into broken glass along the pedestrian paths which poses a significant hazard to the members of the public and not to mention possible nuisances during the night affecting the local neighbourhood.
In view of the above, I would urge the Licensing Authority to refuse this application.

Dear Resident,

We are a family run business and also live in the London Borough of Barnet. It is not our intention to allow the local area to become a crime hot spot, or attract people to our premises who act other than in a considerate and polite way to local residents.

Our application for a new premises licence has attracted a number of representation's (objections) Unfortunately some of the objections are based on points about the hours and activities that are not correct.

We hope that the following information will be of assistance to you, and set the record straight. The information sets out the facts of the application, how we intend to operate the premises, and the conditions we have asked to be attached to the licence to ensure that the 4 licensing objectives are fully promoted.

We hope that after reading this you will consider withdrawing your representation and communicate this to the Licensing Team.

If you have any questions, or require additional information, please email or ring our licensing consultant Mark Altman, his contact details are contained in the footer.

It is very important to note that even if this application was refused, no licence, or other permission, is required for these premises to operate 24 hours a day e.g. for sale of general supermarket goods.

Whilst we are currently not open later than midnight, our business model does incorporate an option to do this at a later stage. Before doing so we have taken the decision to close no later than midnight, until we have had the opportunity to assess the dynamics and viability of operating the extended hours.

More importantly the licensable activity we have requested does not allow alcohol to be sold for consumption, on, or off, the premises after midnight.

Licensable Activity on every day:

- 1) Off sales of alcohol between 8am & midnight.
- 2) Specific limited on sales of alcohol, only in the café area, between 10am and midnight (see conditions 7 & 8)
- 3) Late-Night Refreshment between 11pm and 5am the following day. No one may be seated in the premises to consume hot food or drink, and we do not have a kitchen, so the products will mainly be hot drinks and possibly some re-heated (microwave) food

Information provided to the Police - Operating schedule – Description

Family owned and run specialist supermarket with separate areas comprising of a butchers' shop and café.

The premises will offer both on and off sales. The on sales are very specific, with alcohol only being sold and supplied as a spirit, syrup, or liqueur-based product and served as part of a tea, coffee, milk or juice drink. These drinks will only be served for consumption on the premises, to customers who are seated in the café area as shown by a blue boundary on the plans.

The premises are currently open between 7:30 am and midnight. These times will initially continue if the licence is granted. However, the business plans also incorporate a 24-hour operation for activity that doesn't require an authorisation.

Off sales of alcohol will be restricted between the hours of 8am and midnight, with the limited offering of on sales taking place between 10am and midnight.

It is not anticipated that any significant quantities of alcohol will be sold for consumption on the premises, and due to the conditions restricting such sales, and that alcohol is only an accompaniment added to a specific drink. It is highly unlikely that any of the licensing objectives will be compromised.

High value alcohol including all spirits will be kept behind the checkout counter/till to the front left as you enter the premises, including most of the wine selection. Certain alcoholic beverages will be placed in one of the chiller units a sufficient distance away from the entrance, and in a position that is fully covered by at least one of the cameras in the multi camera CCTV system. This chiller can be closed with a screen shutter at times when off sales are not permitted, and suitable notices will be displayed to explain this to customers.

The late-night refreshment will initially only be between 11pm and midnight, although future plans allow for the operation to be a 24 hour one, and they would like the flexibility to primarily sell hot drinks, and a few reheated food offerings. These are restricted to the cafe area, and after midnight will only be available for take away. This is not going to be a fully blown take away section as there is no commercial kitchen or suitable preparation area for this, and it is not the intention of the applicant to run such an operation.

The following 7 conditions have been offered to promote the licensing objectives:

- 1)** - A CCTV system must be installed and operational at all times when the premises is open to the public. The system will comply with the following:
 - a) The system will incorporate camera(s) covering the entrance door, internal licensed area, serving/till area and any other area used for sale or consumption of alcohol. It must be capable of recording an image which on playback is of a sufficiently high quality to allow accurate identification of the subject matter recorded.
 - b) The system will incorporate a recording facility and any recording will be retained and stored in a suitable and secure format for a minimum of 31 days, and made available for inspection on the lawful and reasonable request of a Police officer, or an authorised officer from the licensing authority. This is subject to compliance with Data Protection Legislation.
 - c) The system must have a suitable facility to export the recorded images to a common format that is easily read by standard devices, e.g. CD/DVD/USB Stick. The system must also have a facility whereby the recordings can be reviewed on a monitor or similar device at the premises.
 - d) The correct date and time must be recorded as part of the image
 - e) If for whatever reason the CCTV system is not operating in accordance with these conditions, both the Police and Council Licensing officers must be immediately informed via email. Details of the problem affecting the CCTV and when this is likely to be fixed must be contained within this email. In these circumstances the temporary suspension of the CCTV condition will be considered, and following this a response will be sent by either the Police or Licensing Authority to the premises licence holder.

- 2)** - All staff directly involved with sale of alcohol on the premises shall receive appropriate training in the legislation and age restricted sales:
 - a) Induction training which must be completed and documented prior to the sale of alcohol by any person at the premises.
 - b) Refresher training at intervals of no more than 6 months.

A record of this training must be kept at the premises and made available for inspection on the lawful and reasonable request of a police officer or an authorised officer from the licensing authority.

- 3)** - All refusals of alcohol sales will be recorded in an easily retrievable format, and made available for inspection on reasonable demand by Police Officers or Authorised Officers from the London Borough of Barnet.

- 4)** - All significant incidents including calls made to the emergency services will be recorded in an in an easily retrievable format and made available for inspection on reasonable demand by Police Officers or Authorised Officers from the London Borough of Barnet.

- 5)** - Appropriate and adequate signage will be placed at the entrance and exit of the premises informing customers not to loiter in the area, consume alcohol outside or discard litter.

- 6)** - External monitoring shall be carried out by the premises licence holder to dissuade customers from causing any issues and the immediate area outside the premises will regularly be cleared of any litter originating from the premises.

- 7)** - Appropriate measures of Alcoholic syrup, liqueur or spirit will only be sold for consumption on the premises in the café area, as shown on the plans. The alcohol will only be sold as part of a tea, coffee, milk (shake) or fruit/vegetable juice-based drink. No other forms of alcohol will be permitted to be sold for consumption on the premises.

8) - Drinks containing alcohol, as outlined at condition 7, will only be sold between 10am and midnight on every day, and will only be served to people seated at a table.

9) - A challenge 25 "proof of age" scheme will be implemented, unless a different "best practice" scheme is requested by the Police or Licensing Authority.

Dear Councillors Bokaei, Duschinsky and Hart,

I am writing to you as the ward councillors for these premises and hopefully set your minds at rest with regard to the business model they are seeking to operate.

I have attached a document which was sent to all of the people who have signed the petition organised by Mr Patel who owns the business at 424a Watford Way.

I am acting as the licensing consultant for the family run business "Nez" at 418c. They have been operating for 7 months as a general supermarket with separate areas for a butchers and cafe.

I can confirm that no alcohol will be sold for consumption on the premises or for take away (off sales) after midnight. There is no restriction on the hours the premises may remain open for activity that does not require a licence e.g. sale of a loaf of bread or tin of beans. Whilst they will not operate after midnight until they have fully assessed the demand in the area, they would like to be able to sell hot drinks and possibly a few reheated products after 11pm. Just the sale of a coffee after 11pm requires a licence for late night refreshment. The food offerings will only be microwave heated sandwiches or panini style items, They may also install a small toasted sandwich reheating unit. There is no kitchen, deep fat fryer or intention to install a fully operational kitchen. Furthermore they are more than happy to accept a condition to restrict certain foodstuffs from being cooked late at night.

I would also like to reassure you that shisha has not been requested or mentioned in the application. I do not know where shisha use has come from, but it is certainly is not part of the business model.

I hope that when you are able to visit the premises you will see that it is well run establishment and will prove an asset to the area. It is certainly far more advantageous than the boarded up vacant properties that have occupied this site for some considerable time.

As an aside, Mr Mousavi, his wife, and daughter will be running the premises. They escaped persecution in their country of birth, Iran, and due to their Christian faith they were granted leave to remain as it would be unsafe for them to return. They are hard working and honest people, who are genuinely surprised and upset at the campaign Mr Patel has waged against them, in an attempt to stop them operating and obtaining any type of licence.

I would be grateful for your thoughts in this matter, and any suggestions you may have with regard to hours and conditions that would be appropriate, and may persuade you to withdraw your objection.


