1. MINUTES OF LAST MEETING

The Chair of the East Area Committee, Councillor Danny Rich welcomed all attendees to the meeting.

It was RESOLVED that the minutes of the previous meeting of the East Area Committee held on 29 June 2022 be agreed as a correct record.

2. ABSENCE OF MEMBERS (IF ANY)

Apologies were received from Councillor Giulia Monasterio, who was substituted by Councillor Paul Lemon.

6. PETITIONS (IF ANY)

The Chair noted that three petitions were received which were considered in turn.

a) Petition: Improvements to the Underpass between Trinity and Manor Park Road

The lead petitioner, James Masters presented the petition and outlines the issues. The Committee welcomed the petition and noted that the agenda for this Committee contained an item on this matter.

It was RESOLVED that the matter be referred to a chief officer to provide a written response to the lead petitioner within 20 working days.

b) Petition: Request for Applications for Parking Permits if within a 0.25mile radius

The lead petitioner, Radhika Shah presented the petition to the Committee. The Committee noted the petition and suggested that the lead petitioner contacts their Ward Councillors as this involves a policy matter.

It was RESOLVED that the Committee noted the petition and that no further action be taken but suggested that the lead petitioner consults with Ward Councillors as this matter involves a policy decision.

c) Petition: CPZ Long Lane extension request (Between Etchingham Park Road / Oakfield Road and Squires Lane)

The lead petitioner, Radhika Shah presented the petition to the Committee.

It was RESOLVED that the matter be referred to a chief officer to provide a written response to the lead petitioner within 20 working days.

7. RESIDENTS' ISSUES (IF ANY)

The Committee noted the submitted residents' issues and the written responses which were published and circulated.

a) Issue: Junction of Oakwood Road and Addison Way

Councillor Mittra presented the item on behalf of the resident and noted the traffic safety issues.

It was RESOLVED that the Committee, having noted the issue and the written response, decided:

- that the Road Safety and Parking issue be referred to the Director of Highways & Transport, and
- that Ward Councillors (Garden Suburb) be updated on the matter via the Director of Highways & Transport.

b) Issue: Knotweed

c) Issue: Junction of Granville Road/Summers Lane/High Road

c) Councillor Claire Farrier & Arjun Mittra - East Finchley Underpass (Grange Big Local - GBL)

Councillor Mittra presented the item. The Committee noted the item and raised a number of queries with Officers. Assistant Director Parking, Philip Hoare noted that the Committee may propose that a specified budget be utilised to tackle drainage, lighting and surface issues within the LBB statutory responsibilities and to commission a project manager to progress the project.

It was RESOLVED that the Committee having considered the application decided to award funding partially for up to £10,000 and any conditions attached, as set out above, noting the implications to the Committee's NCIL funding budget.

d) Councillor Claire Farrier - Market Place Playground

Councillor Farrier presented the item to the Committee. The Chair welcomed Kathy Batten, Chair of Friends of Market Place who provided an update to the Committee following the previous East Area Committee meeting.

It was RESOLVED that the Committee having considered the application decided to award funding fully for £100,000 and any conditions attached noting the implications to the Committee's NCIL funding budget.

1.1 The following petitions from Barnet residents have been received prior to the deadline for submission of petitions.

Petition: Parking in Neville Drive

Lead Petitioner: Sandra Teacher

Ward: Garden Suburb

Number of signatures: 25

Details:

We the undersigned petition the council to We the undersigned petition the council to Put in parking restrictions and for the residents to have parking permits. at peak times of the day from 7.30am to 9.30am and from 3pm to 5.00pm in Neville Drive , Hampstead Garden Suburb.

Parking on Neville Drive has always been an issue with parents from Annemount school parking outside our house and along Neville Drive, but since the restrictions in Holne Chase and Winnington Road, all cars now park on Neville Drive. They often block the driveways and park so close to the edge of the driveways that the residents of the road have extreme difficulty in manoeuvring their cars out into the road.

It is extremely difficult and dangerous as it is impossible to see any oncoming traffic, plus because cars are parked on both sides of the road, it is very difficult to drive in or out of the driveways, plus lorries and the dustbin vehicles have difficultly driving down the road.

This is a real health and safety issue, particularly for the children going and coming to school. It is an accident waiting to happen and I would please ask that you give this your full consideration.

Petition: Stop proposed perimeter path on Lyttleton Playing Fields

We the undersigned petition the council to Stop the plans to build a pathway around the perimeter of Lyttleton Playing Fields that will link into the Linden Lea entrance.

A perimeter path will create both privacy and security issues for the residents who back onto the park - most of the residents have only hedge borders separating their gardens from the park, and burglaries in the area have been on the increase in recent years.

Petition: Include Ravensdale Avenue and Friern Watch Avenue in Friary Park traffic plans

Details:

We the undersigned petition the council to We the undersigned petition the council to add Ravensdale Avenue and Friern Watch Avenue to the investigation currently underway into measures to reduce the speed and volume of traffic on Torrington Park, Friary Road, Friary Way and Ashurst Road.

We refer to the epetition already raised with the council concerning those roads (epetition "Road Safety around Friary Park, N12, to protect Pedestrians and Cyclists" completed 31/12/2021, presented to the Finchley and Golders Green residents forum on January 10 2022, and subsequently put before Barnet Council's East Area Committee.)

We strongly endorse most of the points of that petition.

We note that as a result of the epetition traffic and pedestrian surveys were carried out on the affected roads, plus Mayfield Avenue and, later, Ashurst Road. We are perplexed by the apparent failure of this survey to include Ravensdale Avenue and Friern Watch Avenue in the surveys, despite us requesting this from the council. These two roads would undoubtedly be significantly affected by any changes to the already surveyed roads.

As on example, if a 20mph speed limit was to be enforced on the roads mentioned in the epetition, the 'Google Maps' effect would undoubtedly cause increased traffic, most of it non-local, down our roads, as the various traffic navigation apps encourage drivers along the faster roads (ie our 30 mph roads). We would also like to see traffic calming measures in our roads, specifically a 20mph speed limit. We are constantly observing drivers speeding along the roads and there is a recent example of a vehicle traveling too fast along Ravensdale Avenue and, on exiting, colliding with a garden wall in Friary Road.

Details:

We the undersigned petition the council to seriously consider the introduction of a Residential Controlled Parking Zone in the area between Betstyle Circus and Falkland Avenue N11. Inconsiderate parking by businesses on the Brunswick Industrial Estate, users of a local gym and commuters using Arnos Grove and New Southgate station make parking very difficult for residents at all times of day. The imminent proposed closure of both car parks at Arnos Grove Station will only make matters worse as Enfield Council operate a CPZ on the roads between the station and Betstyle Circus.

Discussion among local residents, and a meeting with local Councillors and members of Barnet Council staff to look at the issues on our roads have led to this petition. Residents often have to drive round and round in circles to find a space to park their vehicle, when the streets are full of cars parked by users of a local gym and businesses who park multiple large vans for days on end, often in dangerous spots on the corners of roads.
