1.	<p><b>Subject: Barnet High Street Widening Consultation. A petition of 1326 validated signaures at the time of publication.</b></p> <p><b>Lead Petitioner:</b> Keith West Chairman of Union Street Residents Association</p> <p><b>Ward:</b> High Barnt</p> <p>Union Street Residents Association (USRA) Members and Residents oppose the siting of loading bays in Union Street which is already under intolerable pressure on parking and usage.</p> <p>Barnet High Street traders and residents across the CPZ area oppose the proposal to remove parking bays and the loading bay on the western side of the High Street from the Post Office to the Spires and to site loading bays in Salisbury Road and Union Street.</p> <p>I write as Chairman of Union Street Residents Association (USRA) and delegated spokesman and for Barnet High Street Traders and the local community likely to be most affected by the proposal.</p>	
2.	<p><b>Subject:</b> Growth in traffic in the New Barnet area</p> <p><b>Submitted by:</b> David Howard on behalf of New Barnet Residents Association</p> <p><b>Ward:</b> East Barnet</p> <p>Nationally there has been a growth in traffic in most areas. Locally New Barnet is well into an increase of 1000 new homes by 2020. There is chronic congestion with regular gridlock to the roads of New Barnet. various mitigation measures are possible at a number of key junctions and sections of the roads. The council has, or is getting, nearly £10 million of CIL money which should be used for such improvements.</p>

Please will you publish details of when the work will start and the estimated completion date.</p> <p>Will the previously promised outdoor adult physical exercise trail be incorporated in the associated works to upgrade the Rec?</p>

It is very poor quality and stone chips keeps coming of the surface. There are several puddles formed in the middle of the road and tar comes up to the surface in hot days, damaging the car tires and paint.</p> <p>We surely deserve better and long lasting road seal for the Council tax we pay. A regular seal will look better but more importantly last much longer, costing less to the council, therefore to us.</p> <p><b>Action proposed:</b> Please re-seal the roads with proper asphalt, before summer.</p>
