	socialise, to learn and to play. The Council recognises how important parks are to local people and is developing a new	
	strategy to improve the Borough's green spaces.

	The Council's aspiration is to make parks safe places for people	
	to enjoy and to encourage people to use parks to adopt healthy	
	lifestyles. Newly refurbished parks will form the centrepiece of	
	the Borough's seven regeneration areas so that new homes and workplaces have access to the outdoors. Good quality parks can	
	also support better educational outcomes and offer the chance	
	for local people to volunteer, gain new skills and make new	
	friends. Our open spaces are havens for wildlife and will limit the	
	impact of climate change on the Borough.

3	The following has been received from the Lisa Meyer, Deputy Head Teacher at Sunnyfields Primary School:	
	We are a primary school situated on one of the most dangerous roads in Hendon; Greyhound Hill. We have children crossing the road unsupervised by parents as many come to school alone and those parents that do accompany their children complain that it is terrifying to have to cross such a busy road were people speed so regularly (It is a straight run downhill).	
	When we first introduced a Travel Plan, we asked the borough to install a Zebra Crossing. They were concerned about costs and installed traffic signs instead. These have proved ineffective as people continue to speed down the hill all the time. One child has already been hit.	
	We felt so strongly about this danger to our children that we decided to pay for a School Crossing Patrol Officer out of our school budget and for a while this worked well until the borough told us not to do so.	
	We have been conducting a campaign for a zebra crossing. We had a petition of over 300 signatures which we sent to the

	borough but to no avail. We have held a demonstration involving Matthew Offord who is supporting our plea. The photos were in the local press. However, we still haven't been awarded a zebra crossing and you are our last hope for the safety of our children.	•
