Procurement of IT Technical Assurance Partner - Appointment of Leidos (formerly known as Lockheed Martin) (2016-17 – 2019- 20; to an upper limit of £164,716) – variation of contract terms.	24/10/16	Director of Resources	The Council has sought a partner to provide technical assurance of proposals that CSG will submit to seek approval to deliver the main components of the ICT strategy. The council will require technical assurance support throughout the delivery of these components. Procurement has been undertaken in accordance with Contract Procedure Rules Appendix 1 Table A. LBB invited four organisations to bid for this procurement through its e-procurement portal. Three organisations responded and their bids were evaluated according to the following criteria: - Cost 40% - Quality 60% Following the evaluation and a clarification interview, the preferred supplier was chosen as Lockheed Martin (now known as Leidos). Following contract negotiations, it has been agreed to vary the contract clause relating to liability as it was felt to be disproportionate to the size of the contract value to offer unlimited liability. This has now been set at £240k. This is seen as a variation to the contract and contract procedure rule 14 and Appendix 1 – Table A are applicable. This change does not have an impact on how the procurement was awarded as it was a part of the evaluation criteria. The legal requirements are set out in the report therefore no further comment required. The Director of Resources has agreed with the following proposals: - That the liability clause in the contract with Leidos be varied from an unlimited value to £240,000.

On 17th October 2016 the Urgency Committee delegated the purchases of individual properties to the Commissioning Director, Growth and Development in consultation with the Chairman of Assets, Regeneration and Growth Committee. The proposed purchase will be funded from the current budget established within the HRA Capital Budget.
			The cost will not exceed £295,895 (£274,000 purchase cost, £9,975 other costs and £11,920 stamp duty, this excludes disbursements and legal costs. A valuation report from a qualified surveyor is annexed, which shows the purchase price as less than the market value range.
