

**Decisions of the Hendon Residents Forum:
9th January 2019**

**1) Issue – CPZ on Goldsmith Avenue, NW9
Submitted by John Healey**

The Chairman noted the response provided by officers and no further action was requested.

**2) Petition – Objection to Zebra Crossing on Bell Lane, Hendon
Lead Petitioner Joel Garson
Signatures 192**

Mr Solomon Garson spoke on behalf of his son Joel Garson for 3 minutes in relation to the petition.

Officers explained that the options surrounding the location for the Zebra Crossing on Bell Lane had recently undergone a consultation and the results of this consultation were now been reviewed.

Officers explained that once the review had been completed, residents and the lead petitioner would be contacted and notified of the next stage in the process. A report would be submitted to a future meeting of the Hendon Area Committee for Members to make the final decisions on the plans.

Following the discussion, the Chairman instructed that an appropriate officer from the Council contact Mr Garson within 20 working days to provide an additional response.

**3) Petition – Save Sweet Tree Farm
Signatures 387**

Ms Jude Allen spoke for 3 minutes in relation to the petition.

Officers explained that due to the ongoing planning enforcement investigation, the Forum was unable to make any further comment on the matter.

The Chairman requested that an appropriate officer contact the lead petitioner within 20 working days to provide an additional response to the issues raised in petition.

**4) Issue: Unauthorised Building, Colindeep Lane, Colindale Ward
Submitted by David Beere**

Mr Beere spoke for 3 minutes in relation to the issue. He had read the response provided by officers and asked that the following additional questions be answered:

- In the third paragraph of the response “do not use the field” should that read “not use the field”?
- Has an injunction been obtained and, if so, what are its terms?
- Were any other reports of the development on the site reported to the Council? (One had heard metallic sounds, often in the morning, earlier in the year. As building work had been taking place at a house in that area of Colin Crescent on had assumed that those works were responsible for the noise. It was only in late Autumn, after leaves had fallen, that the new building was evident.
- The building is described as “unauthorised” so what needs to be investigated?
- No enforcement order has been made. Why not?
- Noise is evidently an issue for residents. As recycling is involved as the objective of the business, what other environmental issues could be involved in this case?

The Chairman requested that an appropriate officer contact Mr Beere to answer these additional questions, within 20 working days.

**5) Issue: Parking on and near Penhurst Gardens, Edgware HA8
Submitted by Jacqueline Curzon**

The Chairman noted the response provided by Officers and no further action was requested.

**6) Issue: Burnt Oak street cleansing
Submitted by Jennie Arthur**

Councillor O’Macauley spoke on the issue on behalf of residents. He said that many residents had contacted him about the issue and that the Council needed to ensure this area was frequently and adequately cleansed.

The Chairman noted the issue and the response provided by officers, specifically that a multi-agency plan was in place to tackle the anti-social behaviour and fly-tipping and no further action was requested.
