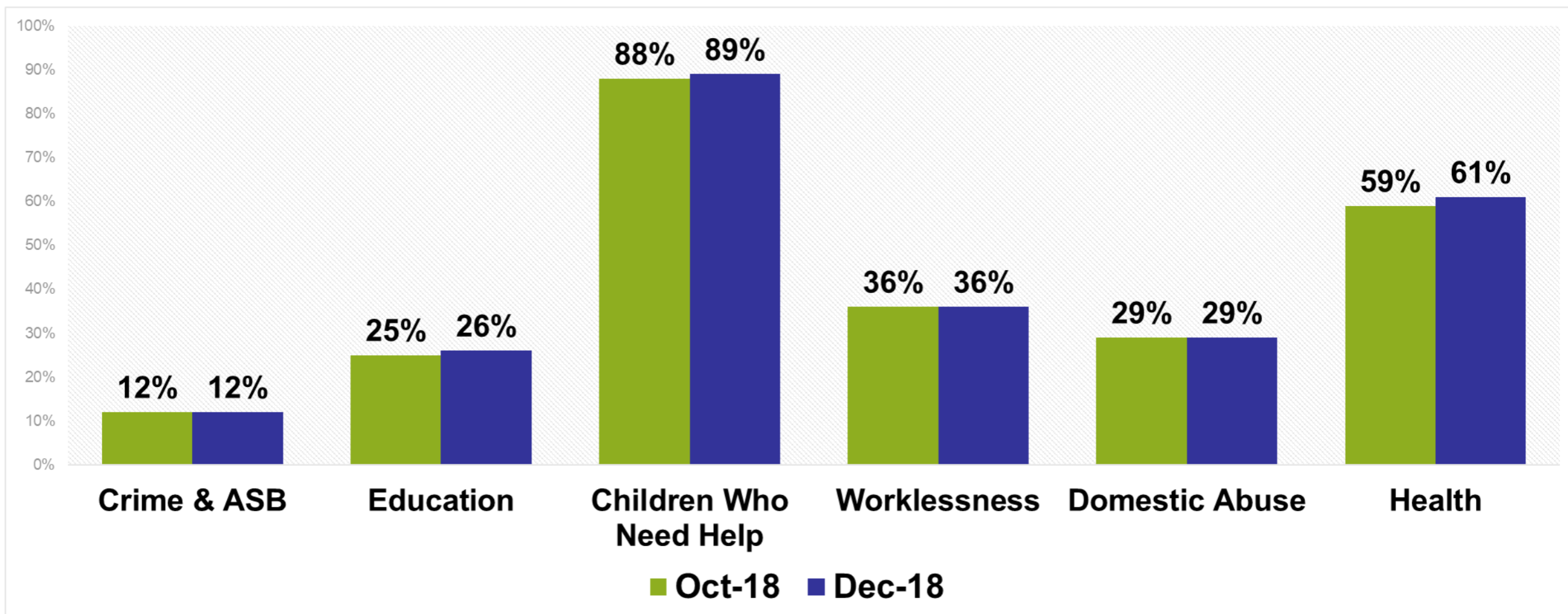

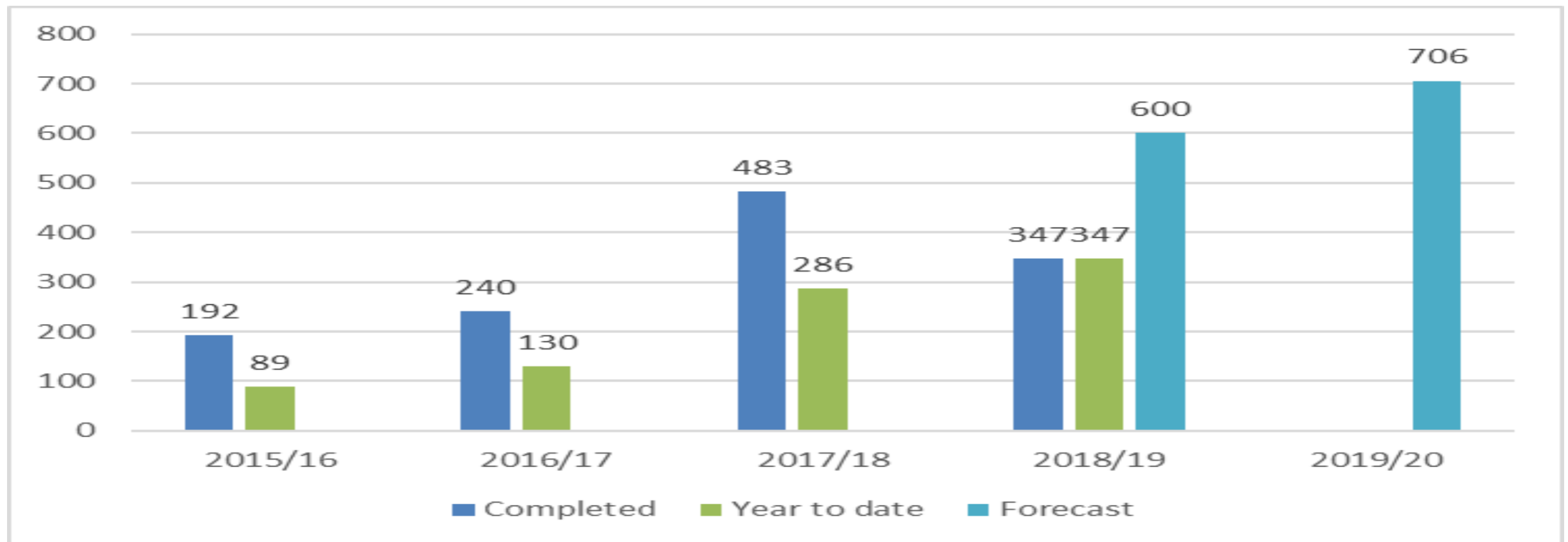
Troubled Families 2015 - 2018



Barnet has agreed to attach, work with and ‘turnaround’ 2,220 Families by 2020.

3,251 families have been attached to the programme as meeting 2 or more of the six headline problem domains (average is 2.3 problems per family)

‘Turnaround’ Claims

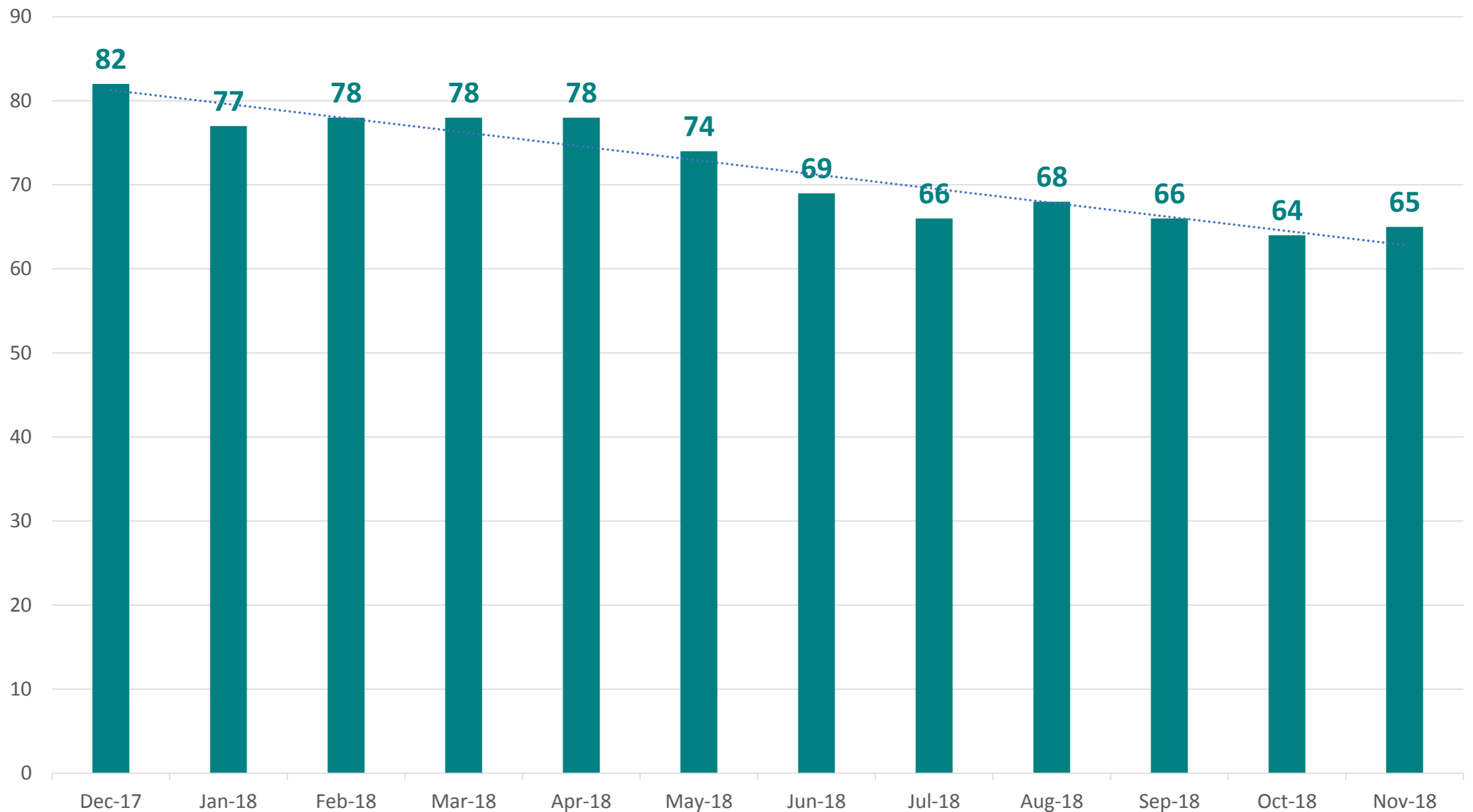


- 1262 Families have achieved ‘turnaround’ representing 57% of the total cohort (6% increase since October 2018).
- 347 Turnaround claims have been made in 2018/19 (to date) which is an 18% increase compared to the same period in 2017/18
- Focus on achieving 100% turnaround (958 claims remaining for 2019/2020)

Whole Family Approach – Partnership Posts

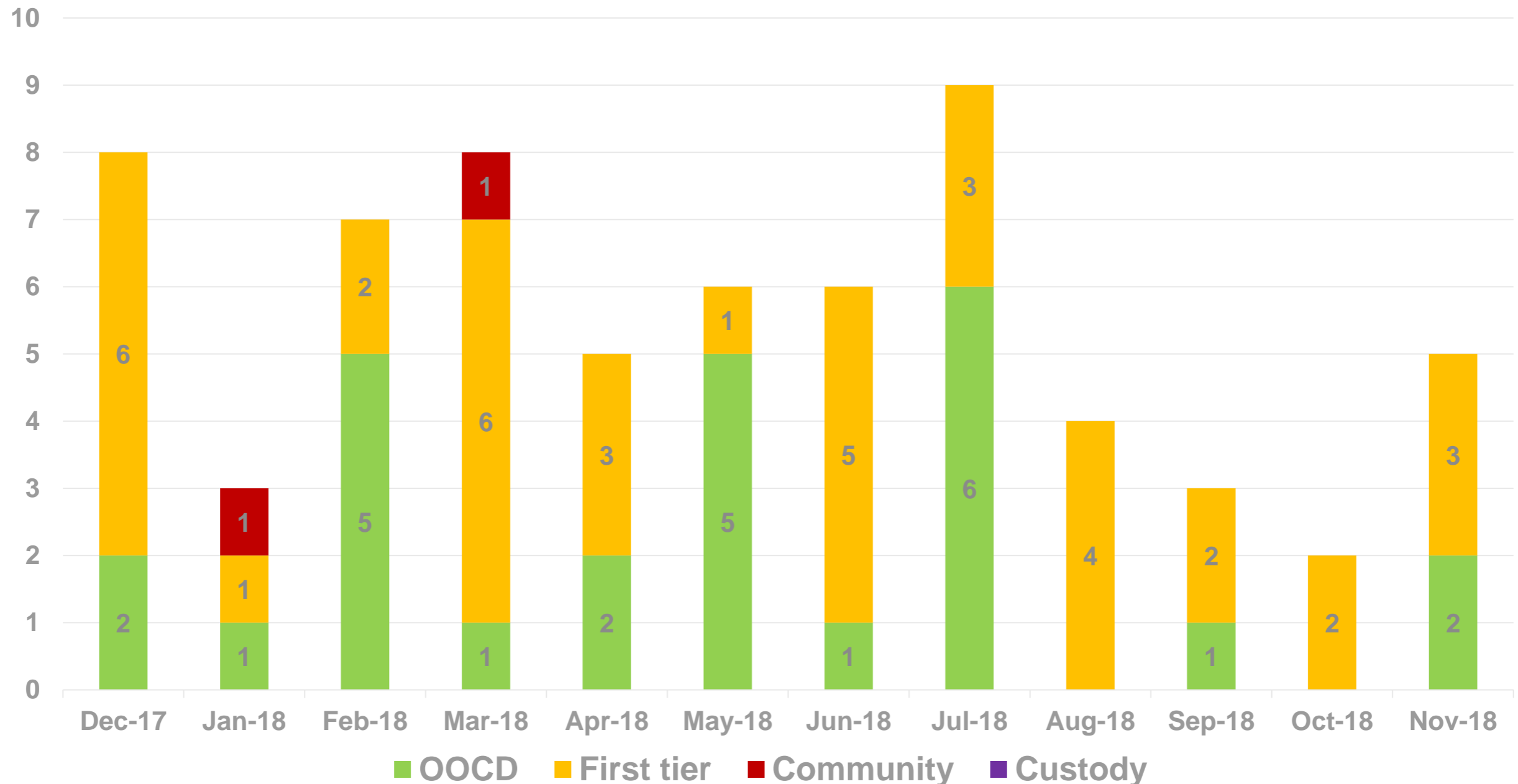
- **Domestic Abuse – increased attachments for Domestic Abuse and increasing awareness in workforce of intervention options**
- **Probation (NPS/CRC)– working with Early Help Panels and attending Multi-Agency Panels – supporting join up**
- **Cambridge Education – post holder starts in February**
- **Westminster Drug Project – interviewing last week**
- **Health & Adult Mental Health posts in recruitment**
- **Supporting planning, joint working and tracking of TF outcomes**

Young People open to the YOT (December 2017 - November 2018)



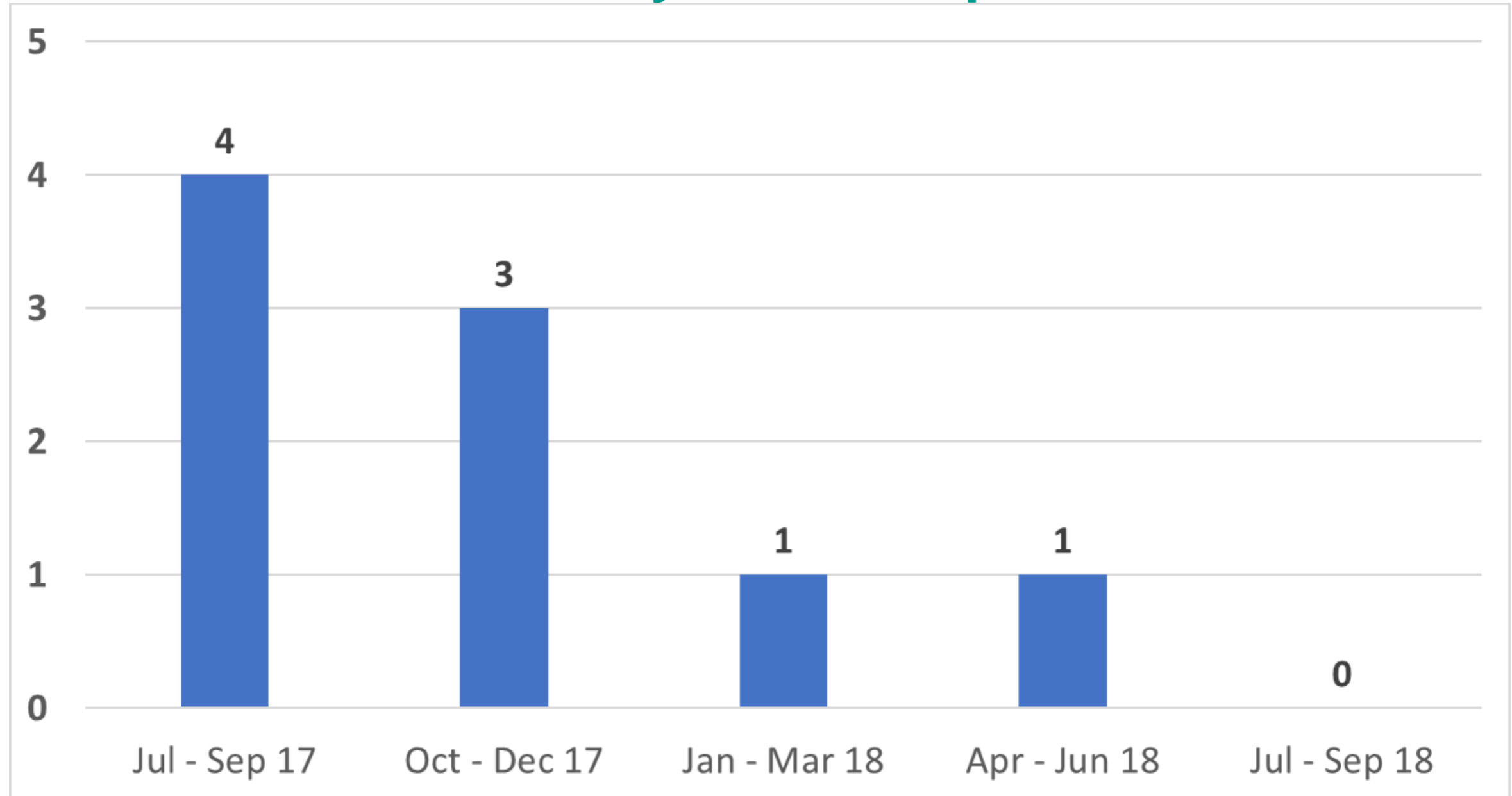
Caseloads have been maintained in the mid-60's for the past six months.

First Time Entrants by Tier (aged 10-17) between December 2017 – November 2018



- The number of FTE's saw a reduction during September/October following a high of 9 in July.
- Of the 66 FTE's in the reporting period 12 had prior Out of Court Triage or Diversionary interventions

Number of young people handed down custodial sentences between July 2017 – September 2018



- **Barnet has 12th lowest rate of custodial sentences being handed down in London in the reporting period**

Vulnerable Adolescents Jan – Sept 2018

- 145 young people in the VA dataset (missing/vulnerable to sexual or criminal exploitation or gang involved)
- Of these,
- 135 young people were reported missing
- 40% aged 12 – 15 years & 60% aged 16+
- 70 young people in care accounting for 48% of missing episodes in this cohort
- 61 males and 74 females
- 30 at risk of CSE (75% female)
- 9 at risk of SYV (50% are female)

- **378 children went missing on 1,124 occasions in the reporting period.**
- **Children in Care accounted for 887 missing episodes (78%)**
- **Improved reporting for CSE and gang involved young people in development**
- **Vulnerable Adolescents at Risk Panel (VARP) multi-agency risk management forum supporting joined up risk management**
- **Gangs and Serious Youth Violence cohort aged 18+ subject to on-going discussions**
- **Multi-Agency Learning Event being held in March (provisional date 27th March 2019, Ariana, NLBP)**
