

**Decisions of the Chipping Barnet Residents Forum
Chipping Barnet Library
06 March 2019**

CHAIRMAN'S INTRODUCTION

The Chairman, Councillor Lisa Rutter introduced herself, the Vice-Chairman, Councillor Alison Cornelius and the Officers present and welcomed the room to the meeting.

1. Petition - Traffic calming measures on the Cromer Road one-way system

The petition was introduced by the Lead petitioner and was discussed at length with the Panel, Councillors and other residents

The Chairman requested that Officers engage with Ward Members and residents in order to give consideration to the options raised by residents for a 20MPH zone.

The Chairman agreed that the issue be referred to the Chipping Barnet Area Committee for consideration to be given to the preferred option

2. Street Cleaning - Mr Alan Robert

The issue was introduced by Mr Robert and discussed at length. It was noted that written response had been published.

Having considered the issue the Chairman requested that Highways officers meet with the resident to review the specific trip hazards, broken paving stones, broken hydrant and the condition of the road tarmac.

The Chairman agreed to take no further action.

3. Double yellow lines on the corner of Hatley Close and Friern Barnet Lane - Mrs Brigitte Shade

A written response to the issue raised by Mrs Shade was published and noted. The Chairman noted the issues in the absence of Mrs Shade.

The Chairman agreed to refer to the Chipping Barnet Area Committee for consideration to be given to the request.

4. Conversion of Gymnasium without Planning Permission - Mr Chris Nightingale

The issue was introduced by Mr Nightingale and considered. The Chairman then gave an opportunity for other councillors and members of the public to make comments. A written response to the issue raised by Mr Nightingale was published and noted.

Having considered the issue the Chairman requested that Officers engage with Mr Nightingale and provide a written response to all his question regarding Alston works, they should confirm:

- the status of the building, is it business or residential
- Do the residents pay council tax
- Has the property been subject to and is it compliant with building regulations

The Chairman agreed that the Head of Planning/Enforcement should contact Mr Nightingale within 20 working days to provide an additional response.

5. Double yellow lines on the bend at the top of Summit Way, N14 - Mr Luke Stewart

A written response to the issue raised by Mr Stewart was published and noted. The Chairman noted the issues in the absence of Mr Stewart. Councillor Roberto Weeden-Sanz spoke on the item and outlined the issues at the location.

The Chairman agreed to refer to the Chipping Barnet Area Committee for consideration to be given to the request.

6. Double yellow lines on the corners of the northern side of the intersection of Brunswick Grove with Brunswick Avenue, N11 - Mr Luke Stewart

A written response to the issue raised by Mr Stewart was published and noted. The Chairman noted the issues in the absence of Mr Stewart. Councillor Roberto Weeden-Sanz spoke on the item and outlined the issues at the location.

The Chairman noted that the issue would revisited again at the 6 June meeting should it still be an ongoing problem, as Council staff would be moving from NLBP to Colindale in May 2019 and this should alleviate the problem.

The Chairman agreed to defer the issue to the 6 June 2019 meeting.

7. Speeding at the end of Oakleigh Road South by Betstyle Circus – Mr Luke Stewart

A written response to the issue raised by Mr Stewart was published and noted. The Chairman noted the issues in the absence of Mr Stewart. Councillor Roberto Weeden-Sanz spoke on the item and outlined the issues at the location.

Having considered the issue the Chairman requested that the Safer Neighbourhood team attend the site to undertake a speed gun survey and establish the most appropriate place to install a VAS.

The Chairman agreed to take no further action until the results of the speed survey were known.

8. Lamp Posts in Osidge Lane Car Park - Mr Luke Stewart

A written response to the issue raised by Mr Stewart was published and noted. The Chairman noted the issues in the absence of Mr Stewart. Councillor Roberto Weeden-Sanz spoke on the item and outlined the issues at the location.

The Chairman had also visited the site and confirmed that there were no light issues. It was also noted that the Borough would be moving to replace all lights with LED bulbs in the future.

The Chairman agreed to note the issues and take no further action.

9. Caravans and Illegal Camps - Mr Rob White

A written response to the issue raised by Mr White was published and noted. The Chairman noted the issues in the absence of Mr White.

Councillor Roberto Weeden-Sanz spoke on the item and outlined the issues at the location. He informed the Chairman that an email from Council Officer Matthew Gunyon states that he does not believe that this falls under 'Maintenance funding' as this is a complete replacement. Mr Gunyon further states that fencing is a capital asset and would fall with CIL.

The Chairman requested that Highways officers meet with the resident to assess which wooden bollards were damaged and needed replacing and also to investigate whether this falls under Maintenance or CIL funding. It was also suggested that if wooden Posts are used, to consider replacing the bollard with charred English Oak.

The Chairman agreed to take no further action until which funding to be used was confirmed.

10. Crossovers – Mr Luke Stewart

A written response to the issue raised by Mr Stewart was published and noted. The Chairman noted the issues in the absence of Mr Stewart. Councillor Roberto Weeden-Sanz spoke on the item and outlined the issues at the location.

The Chairman requested that Highways officer meet with the residents to discuss their individual crossovers.

The Chairman agreed to take no further action.

11. Speeding on Gallants Farm Road – Mr Luke Stewart

A written response to the issue raised by Mr Stewart was published and noted. The Chairman noted the issues in the absence of Mr Stewart. Councillor Roberto Weeden-Sanz spoke on the item and outlined the issues at the location.
