Dear Barnet Licensing Team,

In response to the representations made against the above application. please see comments made on the majority of the points mentioned in the several representations.

Noise Pollution – mopeds and cars for delivery can remain on east end road after 11pm instead of pulling into the service road and reduce the immediate noise and would be the same as any other passing car. We rarely get collection customers after 10.30pm so it is unlikely that the local residents that do come to the store would increase significantly and they are local residents as why else would they be on east end road. Our staff are not out the front of the store late night so for collection customers we can display notices to help reduce the noise and ask them to consider the local residents.

Shutter noise – this can be replaced with a motorised version or removed completely and therefore strengthen the back door to reduce any likelihood of crime if need be.

Food Delivery – the time of delivery would not change because we open for an hour longer during the week, we could request from the QCC depot whom which deliver the stock to swap our route and try for a day time delivery or early evening (before 9PM).

Rubbish left by customers – there are a number of litter bin along the street in front of the shops and across the road, if we post the notice to dispose of litter with the noise notice it should help. We can conduct litter patrols along the parade to ensure our branded packaging is removed from the street if need be.

Undesirables – our current late evening customers are all local to the area either walking home or come especially to collect their pre-ordered food, I would say I have not experienced too many that are drunk in this area. Mostly its people returning late from work. But they are local residents also and surely they should be catered for. The local pub does not open until the times we are proposing so this should not increase.
