The Chairman opened the meeting.

1. Issue: Crossing, Kingsley Way between the parks
Submitted by: Brian Ingram

The resident attended but did not speak on the item. He noted the written response provided.

The Chairman resolved to take no further action.

2. Issue: Delay in decision, pedestrian crossing at the dangerous Summers Lane, Granville Road and High Road junction due to cycle lane review
Submitted by: Liz Maimaris

Ms Maimaris presented her issue.

Mr Hoare, Assistant Director, Parking recommended that the resident awaits the results of the feasibility study which was underway. He explained that it would be prudent to also await a decision on the pop-up cycle lane, as this is a complex junction with many factors to take into account. The decision on the cycle lane is due to be made by Environment Committee in March 2022.

Ms Staples, Member Liaison Lead noted that she would share information with Ms Maimaris on the progress of the proposal for a pedestrian crossing. She would also share this information with Ward Members, the Chairman, Vice Chairman and Cllr Cohen, Chairman of Environment Committee.

The Chairman resolved to refer the matter to officers for a response within 20 working days, and to copy in Members as above.

3. Petition: Restart the collection of kitchen waste after three years of inaction

Mr Guy Cook presented the petition. The written response was noted. Mr Hoare noted that this is a borough-wide matter. Cllrs Moore, Farrier and Schneiderman requested that the petition be referred up for the matter to be reconsidered.

The Chairman noted that the issue of kitchen waste is already being discussed at the council.

The Chairman resolved to refer the matter to an officer to request a response within 20 working days.

4. **Petition: Traffic calming measures on Deansway**

Dr Sadeh presented his petition.

Mr Hoare reported that the measures suggested could be considered and recommended a feasibility study be carried out, for which a referral to Finchley and Golders Green Area Committee would be required.

The Chairman resolved to refer the matter to Finchley & Golders Green Area Committee.

5. **Petition:** Junction between Finchley Road and Hoop Lane pedestrian crossing request
Lead Petitioner: Ruth Pavey

Ms Pavey presented her petition. Ms Staples commented that a feasibility study had been carried out at this junction. Ms Staples would provide an update on the status of the findings within 20 working days.

The Chairman resolved to refer the petition to the Finchley & Golders Green Area Committee.
