### Additional Officer Responses:

Issue/Petition Raised	Additional Officer Response
<b>Issue:</b> Abbots Road HA8 <b>Resident:</b> Ikraj Thancanamootoo <b>Ward:</b> Hendon	Officers have recently received approval to prioritize the delivery of the Burnt Oak CPZ and your request for the waiting restrictions on Abbots Road to be amended/removed will be resolved as part of the CPZ delivery. However, in the meantime, the parking enforcement team will continue to carry out enforcement activity at peak school times in Abbots Road.
<b>Issue:</b> A5, Kingsbury Road, Rookery Way junction. <b>Resident:</b> Naomi Stanford <b>Ward:</b> Hendon	The request to introduce a pedestrianized crossing at this junction has been included in the Borough's LIP (Local Implementation Plan of the Mayor's Transport Strategy). The model auditing costs have recently been reviewed and engineers are investigating the extent of the required design. It is important to emphasise that the scheme will take some time to achieve.

<p><b>Petition:</b> CPZ on Clovelly Avenue restricting staff from entering work place  <b>Lead Petitioner:</b> Karen Patten  <b>Ward:</b> Hendon  <b>Number of signatures: 25</b></p>	<p>As per the discussion at the committee meeting, the current school streets have been designated under experimental traffic orders which ran until 31st October and on this basis, all detailed concerns about the operation of school streets are currently under review and will be taken into account as part of the decision-making process on the future model of the schemes. Once a decision is made, an update on the decision will be provided.</p>
<p><b>Issue:</b> Issues around Sainsbury's (NW9 5ZS)  <b>Resident:</b> Marek Rogowski  <b>Ward:</b> Hendon</p>	<p>The issues raised are currently being dealt with by Environmental Health who will respond to the resident directly with an update.</p>
