Item 8	Joan Roselie	This is a hot topic the West Area of Barnet is familiar with – Can we ask if it is possible to implement more CCTV around Grahame and Heybourne Park Estate to deter theft, drug dealing and aid the policing of increased rough sleepers who are defecating outside resident homes?	<p>As part of the ongoing commitment to reduce anti-social behaviour and crime within Barnet a strategic review of CCTV has been carried out, with 2.3 million pounds being invested in CCTV upgrades, and 24-hour monitoring of the CCTV for the borough is being reintroduced. Locations within Heybourne Park have been identified for re-deployable cameras, which are currently being processed.</p> <p>Further to this we are working closely with Barnet Homes on the feasibility of CCTV on the Grahame Park Estate.</p> <p>Heybourne Park was also subject to significant undergrowth clearance in Qtr 3 last year, as was certain areas of the Grahame Park Estate, to reduce the cover of the undergrowth providing an area for ASB & crime to take place undetected. Tree pruning was also carried out to improve line of sight within the park.</p> <p>The Barnet Homes Rough Sleeper Team works to reduce rough sleeping in the borough by delivering and coordinating a range of services for rough sleepers. If you are aware of someone rough sleeping, you can alert our Rough Sleeper Team and outreach services by making a Streetlink referral. You can contact StreetLink via the website: https://www.streetlink.london/ or if you cannot access the internet, you can also get in touch via their phone line on 0300 500 0914. StreetLink is a non-profit organisation managed and delivered by Homeless Link in partnership with St Mungo's. It is principally</p>

As many rough sleepers also have substance misuse issues, CGL have been commissioned to provide specific services and support for rough sleepers with substance misuse issues, to enable them to access support and treatment including detox and rehabilitation services. CGL attend the Colindale area on a weekly basis.
