

# Urgent and emergency care at the Royal Free London

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#### **Overview**

- Three main sites: Barnet Hospital, Chase Farm Hospital and the Royal Free Hospital.
- Our emergency departments and urgent treatment centres saw record attendances in December 2022. They continue to remain high but no longer the levels seen in December.
- This can be attributed to an increased number of patients visiting us with respiratory illnesses.

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## Trust performance against 95% target

- Emergency department waiting times are often used as a barometer for overall performance of the NHS and social care system.
- They are affected by changing activity and pressure in other services – ambulance service, primary care, community based care and social care services.

## Our vaccination programme 2022/2023

- Ended in December 2022.
- Staff administered over 15,000 vaccines to staff, patients and the public.
- Staff flu vaccine uptake was 41.2% this is similar to previous years.
- Fifth within North Central London secondary care providers.
- Staff COVID-19 booster uptake was 42.4%.
- Sixth within North Central London secondary care providers.
