
Age-friendly Barnet: Who is involved?



Projects (2024-2025)

The Call for Action lists eight projects which will be undertaken over the next two years. Our priorities for the rest of this year include:

- 1. Establishing our Mobile Information Service (Age-friendly Pop-Up).
- 2. Gathering a Digital Taskforce to create more opportunities for older adults to improve their digital skills.
- 3. Growing our group of 'Age-friendly Champions'.
- 4. Continue to develop our baseline assessment to ensure that we are engaging with Barnet's diverse communities, community and faith organisations to promote equality and inclusion for all.
