| 1. | Petition: Residents of Erskine Hill objection to proposed extension of Controlled Parking Zone (CPZ) in Hampstead Garden Suburb (43 signatories) | The petition has been noted and Officers must apologise as it has not been referred to in the report detailing the outcome of the statutory consultation for the proposed Garden Suburb CPZ due to be considered tonight at the Finchley and Golders Green Area Environment Sub-Committee. |
| | Mr Siddiek Meer / Mr Julian Glaser | There are no plans to introduce CPZ restrictions in Erskine Hill, and all relevant objections to the proposal have been considered; tonight's Sub-Committee, having considered the content of the report will be asked to make a decision on which roads if any, should be included in the Hampstead Garden Suburb CPZ. |
| | | Although the petition is acknowledged, it does not give grounds for the objection to the introduction of a CPZ but officers look forward to hearing of the specifics that prompted this particular petition that will no doubt be factored into any subsequent decision that might be made on the future of the scheme. |
| 2. | Petition: St. Elizabeth Court car park, Mayfield Avenue, London N12 - requesting if a mirror could be positioned on the tree | This location was investigated in December 2012 but recommendations could not be put forward due to a lack of justification within the context of the current criteria that includes consideration of aspects including accident history, traffic volume and speeds. |
| | opposite the exit from the car park, which would allow a view both ways (25 signatories) | Specific consideration of a mirror on the Public Highway can only be given once it is established that there is a need for traffic management intervention and that all other options have been excluded as not appropriate. Even then, if a mirror is supported it requires |

| | | There is evidence that rather than improving safety, a mirror could (in certain circumstances) increase the risk e.g. reflecting light and interfere with a driver's vision; reducing the ability to judge an oncoming vehicle's speed; creating an unreasonable dependence on the mirror; distort or restrict the view and; be an easy target for vandals. |
| | | However, whilst it is not intended to pursue the specific request for a mirror, Officers will visit the area again to see if anything can be done to improve sight lines by assessing the existing parking layout and will advise the lead petitioner of any intended action. |
| 3. | Spencer Close and Regents Park Road N3 – request for a crossing refuge, along with a yellow 'keep clear' box. Ms Rosie Page | This location has previously been investigated although no recommendations were put forward due to concerns regarding the probable impact on through traffic and subsequent increase in queue. However, we are happy to review our position on the matter and liaise with Ms Page on this accordingly. |
| 4. | The water company have finished digging up the road near the northbound 'Llanvanor Rd' bus stop in Finchley Road. | A Street Works inspector has visited this location and identified that the issue of concern has not materialised as a result of the recent works carried out by the Water Company. It will be dealt with as a highway maintenance issue and subject to meeting the Councils intervention criteria and available budgets will be dealt with within the next 28 days. |
| | There are several dips in the road surface just by the bus stop. This means that, in wet weather, people are liable to be splashed by buses driving through the puddles. | |
