Why are these changes being made: a recap

- safer care, higher quality care
- sustainable hospital and medical workforce
- more clinicians, in particular, more senior doctor presence making better decisions about patient care
- compliance with modern standards of health care
- modern A&E becoming specialist emergency centres
- modern maternity units with more midwives and consultant care
- a dedicated planned care hospital at Chase Farm, creating a specialist centre for surgery and continuing to offer many existing services to over 200,000 people a year.

Myth busters

1. Chase Farm Hospital is **NOT** closing. Most patients seen at Chase Farm Hospital will continue to be seen at Chase Farm Hospital:
These services include:
 - planned operations
 - outpatient services
 - paediatric/children's assessment unit (PAU)
 - older persons' assessment unit (OPAU)
 - xray, bloods etc still done at Chase Farm
 - pre-natal and post-natal checks for women/babies
 - the Urgent Care Centre which becomes a stand alone
 - centre with the planned A&E move
2. The hospital will remain a community based hospital delivering planned care, and will see reduced cancellations of operations and appointments as a result of A&E being moved off site.

Progress update

- BEH programme implementation currently on track
- Building works underway at Barnet Hospital and North Middlesex University Hospital
- Staff consultation complete at BCF; recruitment campaign underway at NMUH
- Deep dives into clinical workstreams continuing; reviewing activity, plans and mitigating risks
- External assurance process underway with NHS England
- Decision making point in September by CCGs regarding timescales

Urgent Care and A&E

- Urgent care centre piloted at Barnet Hospital A&E shows that 40% of A&E patients do not need A&E treatment
- Urgent care centres now at all three Hospital sites; improvements being made to model
- Older people's assessment unit and paediatric assessment unit – model agreed and mobilisation plans being finalised
- New Choose Well campaign across BEH will tell people when to use A&E and remind them that A&E is for emergency care, not minor injuries
- Facts and figures – review of activity and demand

Urgent Care and A&E – Barnet and Chase Farm Hospitals NHS Trust



- Current A&E performance
- Building works in A&E from May to August
- New Resuscitation bays open
- Surgical ward opened
- Building works on track
- Urgent care at BH
- Urgent care at CFH
- The future model will provide rapid referral from the triage nurse to the specialist doctor in both A&E and in CDU and Emergency Gynae Unit
- Patients will get better and safer care
